

THE TWENTY-NINTH SESSION

OF THE

TORONTO SCHOOL OF MEDICINE

Will commence on the 2nd October, 1871, and end on last of March, 1872.

The Toronto School of Medicine, in issuing its Annual Announcement, desires again to call the attention of the Medical Profession and Medical Students to the fact that, mainly owing to the exertions of this institution, and after a struggle of over twelve years, the present Act of Incorporation, establishing a central examining and sole licensing body for Ontario, was obtained. The Toronto School of Medicine has always held that a measure of this kind would secure to the profession and public the best guarantee that every Licentiate had, at least, sufficient professional information to render him a safe and useful practitioner; that the several teaching bodies would occupy a more honorable position; that Teachers and Students would be alike stimulated to greater efforts; that the rivalry between Schools would be generous and healthy; and that the Status of the Profession would be greatly elevated.

Henceforth every School of Medicine must depend for its reputation not upon any special graduating power possessed by it, but very much upon whatever success its students may attain at the examination before this Central Board appointed by the Council of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario.

No Degree or Status, imperial or colonial, obtained after July 1st, 1869, entitles the holder to a license to practice in this Province—such license can be conferred only by the Central Board, and after its examination of the candidate. During each of the two years since the present Act has been in force, the number of Licentiates admitted into the Profession in Ontario is only about one-fourth of what it was during each of the four years immediately preceding the Act; and, while of such reduced number of Licentiates the Toronto School of Medicine has furnished as many annually as before the present Act came into force, the relative number proceeding from this Institution has been nearly trebled; and this School is of the opinion, that when the teaching bodies are limited for their supply of pupils to those who have been regularly matriculated

by the examiner of the Council of the C. P. S. O., the result will appear still more in its favour.

The Toronto School of Medicine, in this new era in medical teaching, advances with quiet confidence, determined that every reasonable effort shall continue to be made for the best instruction of its pupils, believing that the result will be such as to gratify every well-wisher of the Institution. Students of Medicine are hereafter, therefore, imperatively required to exercise their best judgment for the furtherance of their individual interests by a faithful devotion to the study of the various departments of medical knowledge, and, moreover, by carefully selecting that school wherein those studies may be most successfully prosecuted.

Attention is solicited to the *accompanying catalogue* of former pupils of the Toronto School of Medicine, and the positions of eminence in the profession attained by large numbers of them. As a matter of curiosity it may be mentioned, that of the present teachers in the other Medical Schools of Ontario, nine were pupils of this Institution.

With much pride the Toronto School of Medicine ventures to point to the great success attained by many of its Students at the recent competitive examinations in the Faculty of Medicine of the University of Toronto ; three Scholarships, four Medals, and three Starr Medals having been carried off by the Students of this School, these constituting all the Honors in the Faculty of Medicine offered for competition by the University.

During the last twelve years the University of Toronto has awarded to pupils of this School, after searching Examinations, forty-six Scholarships, and, including "Starr" Medals, eighteen gold, and thirty-two Silver Medals.

By referring to the accompanying Statute of the University, it will be seen that no medal can be awarded to any candidate unless he shall have been classed in Honors in all the Departments comprised in the examination.

The location of the School is one of the most beautiful and healthy in Toronto.

During the Session special attention will be given, as usual, to Pathology and Diagnosis.

A complete course on Surgical Anatomy will be given by Dr. RICHARDSON. The Lectures on Descriptive Anatomy will be given conjointly by Drs. RICHARDSON and M. H. AIKINS.

Chemistry, theoretical and practical, under the able direction of Prof. CROFT, will be taught as usual in the Chemical Lecture Room and Laboratory of University College, where every facility of illustration is provided. of an Ph M

In the Museum of the School will be found a very superior collection of casts, plates, moist and dry preparations of normal and morbid tissues, and samples of medicines, for the purpose of illustrating Anatomy, Physiology, Pathology, Medicine, Surgery, Midwifery and Materia Medica.

The course of Lectures on Opthalmic and Aural Surgery will be delivered by R. A. REEVE, A.M., M.D.

That on Sanitary Science by GEO. WRIGHT, A.M., M.D.

The Toronto Lying-in Hospital furnishes the usual opportunities for the study of Practical Midwifery. The Toronto Dispensary, Protestant Orphans' Home, House of Industry and Boys' Home, contribute also towards the clinical advantages of the School.

Senior Students will often have the opportunity of witnessing the treatment of accidents and diseases in the private practice of the Lecturers

In order to obtain the Provincial License, all Students are required not only to pass their Medical Examination before the Council of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario, but also to matriculate before that Body; except those who have matriculated in any British or Canadian University or School of Medicine prior to the 1st of July, 1869, or who subsequently have or may become Graduates or Matriculates in Arts in such institutions.

The course of Medical Study prescribed by the Senate of the University of Toronto, for the degree of M.B., comprises all the subjects required by the Medical Council for the Provincial License. Students, therefore, who are eligible to present themselves for Examination for the degree of M.B. in that institution, are also eligible to present themselves for Examination before the Medical Council.

DEGREE OF M.B.

The following are the requisites for admission to the Degree of Bachelor of Medicine, viz:---

(1.) Having produced satisfactory certificates of good conduct.

(2.) Having Matriculated in any Faculty in this University, or having been admitted *ad eundem gradum* or *statum* in Law or Arts, or having matriculated before the Examiner of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario.

(3.) Being of the full age of twenty-one years.

(4.) Having pursued Medical studies for the period of at least four years, and having regularly attended Lectures extending over a period of at least three Sessions of six months each, in the following branches of Medical education, for the respective periods hereinafter set forth :---

Anatomy—Practical Anatomy, Theory and Practice of Medi cine, Principles and Practice of Surgery, Chemistry, Midwifery and diseases of women and children, Therapeutics and Pharmacology, and Physiology, two courses of six months each.

Practical Chemistry, Medical Jurisprudence, and Botany, one course of three months each.

Attendance on six cases of labour; attendance in the office of of a Registered Practitioner for one period of twelve months, or two periods of six months each.

(5.) Having attended for at least twelve months the practice of some general Hospital, and having attended during six months Clinical Lectures on Medicine and Surgery.

(6.) Having passed, in this University, an examination in all the subjects specified in Article 4.

EXAMINATIONS.

The Examination for Matriculation will be held in the latter part of September.

Additional Examinations for Matriculation may be held at other periods, but no Honors or Scholarships will be awarded at such additional Examinations.

Every Student, who proposes to present himself at any examination, is required to send to the Registrar, at least three weeks before the day appointed, a paper (according to a printed form which will be provided), stating his standing, and whether he is a Candidate for Honors or otherwise.

SCHOLARSHIPS.

Four Scholarships will be annually offered for competition, viz :---

One among Matriculants.

One among Students of one year's standing.

One among Students of two years' standing.

One among Students of three years' standing.

No Scholarship will be awarded to any Candidate unless he shall have been classed in Honors in at least two-thirds of the departments comprised in the Examination.

Each Scholarship is of the value of one hundred and twenty dollars a year.

Each Scholarship is tenable for one year only, but the Scholar of one year is eligible for the Scholarship of a succeeding year.

Students who have not previously matriculated may compete for the Scholarship of the first, second or third year, by taking along with the subjects prescribed for that year the subjects appointed for Matriculation.

or the th the lation. Every Student taking a Scholarship is required to sign a declaration that it is his intention to pursue his Medical studies one, two or three years, according to the year in which he has taken such Scholarship, and to proceed to a Degree in the University of Toronto.

MEDALS, PRIZES AND CERTIFICATES OF HONOR.

A Gold Medal may be given, upon the special recommendation of the Examiners, to the Student who, at the Examination for the Degree of M.B., shall have been placed first in the First Class.

A Silver Medal will be given to each of the Students who, at the Examination for the Degree of M.B., shall have been placed in the First Class of Honors, except the successful Candidates for the Gold Medal.

No Medal will be awarded to any Candidate unless he shall have been classed in Honors in all the Departments comprised in the Examination.

Prizes, each of the value of Ten Dollars in books, may be awarded annually among Undergraduates in Law, Medicine, and Arts, for the best Compositions in Greek Verse, Greek Prose, Latin Verse, Latin Prose, English Verse, English Prose, French Prose or German Prose.

Certificates of Honor will be given to those Students, who, at any of the Examinations, have been placed in the First Class in Honors in any Department.

STARR MEDALS.

The late RICHARD NOBLE STARR, M.D., devised certain property for the encouragement of the study of the subjects of Anatomy, Physiology, and Pathology. In fulfilment of this object the Senate have established one Gold and two Silver Medals, called the "Starr Medals." These Medals are competed for annually at the same time as the Examination for the Degree of M.B., and are conferred upon the three competitors who have attained the highest marks in the above subjects; the relative rank of each Candidate being determined by the aggregate number of his marks in all such subjects. They are open for competition to all Students who have received their medical education in any Medical School or Institution affiliated with the University, and have matriculated or been admitted ad eundem statem in the Faculty of Medicine in the University; but such competitors must be of sufficient standing to be entitled to present themselves for the Degree of M.B. Candidates are required to take all the subjects appointed for Examination for the Degree of M.B. Every recipient of the Medal must have attained the standing of First Class in each of the subjects of Anatomy, Physiology, and Pathology, and must be classed in Honors in all the other subjects of Examination. The 'Starr Medal" may be taken and held by any Candidate to whom the University Gold or Silver Medal has also been awarded at the same Examination, in which case it is optional for him to receive, instead of such University Medal, the value thereof in money.
