Annual Meeting.

ST. ANDREW'S HALL, Kingston, 17th January, 1900.

The Annual Meeting of the congregation was held this evening.

The Rev. Mr. Mackie presided and opened the meeting with prayer. Mr. N. R. Carmichael acted as Secretary and read the minutes of the last annual meeting which were confirmed.

The report of the Kirk Session was read by Rev. Mr. Mackie and adopted upon motion of Mr. McIntyre.

It was moved by Mr. McIntyre, seconded by Mr. Craig and resolved, that St. Andrew's congregation take up the Century Fund movement as prescribed by the General Assembly, and pledge itself to an earnest participation in the work, and further appoint the Kirk Session and Board of Management as an executive committee to carry out the scheme, with power to add to its numbers.

The report of the Board of Managers was read by Mr. Craig, upon whose motion it was received and adopted.

Upon motion of Mr. McIntyre, seconded by Mr. Lesslie, the retiring Managers, Messrs. James McLeod, W. T. Minnes, and W. F. Nickle, were re-elected.

The reports of the Secretary and Treasurer of the Sabbath School were read by Mr. Pollie, upon whose motion they were received.

Dr. Herald moved, seconded by Mr. W. T. Minnes, that the congregation give two special collections for the Sabbath School Library upon the first Sabbath of May and the second Sabbath of September. This was carried.

The report of the Women's Home Association was read by Mr. Nickle and adopted.

The report of the Young Women's Guild was read by Miss A. Davidson and adopted.

Dr. Herald reported the result of his communication with the authorities of the Hotel Dieu, and assured the Young Women's Guild that the doors of that institution were no longer closed against the visits of its members.

The report of the Juvenile Guild was read by Mr. McIntyre and adopted.

The report of the Women's Foreign Missionary Society was read by Mr. Lesslie and adopted.

The report of the Young People's Missionary Society was read by Mr. W. Stewart Dobbs and adopted.

The report of the Mission Band was read by Mr. McIntyre and adopted.

On motion of Dr. Herald, Messrs. Wm. Gill and F. Raney were appointed auditors for the coming year.

The meeting was closed with the benediction.

Kirk=Session Report.

The Kirk-Session respectfully submit the following as their annual report:

Throughout the year Divine worship has been regularly conducted twice on the Lord's Day, and the mid-week Prayer Meeting has been kept up with a recess in summer. The attendance at the different services has been satisfactory and at the Prayer Meeting, especially during the closing months of the year, it has been greatly increased. Men, however, at this service have been but few.

The Sacrament of the Lord's Supper has been celebrated quarterly and the usual Preparatory Services have been observed.

During the year twelve persons were received into full communion on profession of faith, and sixteen on presentation of disjunction certificate, making a total of twenty-eight. We regret to say that death and removal have done their work also, and more than usual.

The following eight were taken away by death:—Mrs. Margaret Arnold, Miss Adelina Bertha Connor, Mr. A. W. Stevenson, Mr. Robert Gordon, Mr. Archibald McBilde, Mrs. Hannah Macdonald, Mr. William Mason, and Miss Etta Gillie. Twenty, on leaving the city, have been certified to other congregations.

Our numerical loss has therefore equalled our gain and left the communion roll as it was 563.

The Sacrament of Baptism was administered to fourteen children. Nine marriages were celebrated.

The Poor Fund accounts have been submitted to us and we have found the same correctly kept and we believe that the Fund is being wisely managed.

The Kirk-Session gratefully recognizes the services of all engaged in the active work of the congregation in the various Associations and Guilds, in the Sabbath School and the Choir, and devoutly hopes that the blessing of God may increasingly accompany all the efforts that are being put forth both for the spiritual and material prosperity of St. Andrew's.

The Kirk-Session desires to draw the attention of the congregation to what is called the Century Fund movement, and to recommend an earnest participation in this work prescribed by the General Assembly.

May the good Lord pardon and build us up in all righteousness and holiness, and make us to abound in every good word and work to the glory of His own holy name.

Report of the Board of Managers.

10

The Managers beg to submit their report for the year ending 31st December, 1899.

The amount estimated and asked for at the beginning of the year has not been received, yet your committee has succeeded in keeping the floating debt within seventy-five dollars of last year. The floating debt last year was estimated at \$1874.98, but to be more correct this should have been \$1469.98, as \$405 for interest was then in the hands of the Treasurer of the Interest Fund. This year the liability under floating debt is \$1538.11, an increase of \$68.13.

Against this increase it may be noted that there have been exceptional expenses, not unexpected, but put off for want of funds until longer delay would injure the property, viz.:

We again record our appreciation of the efforts of the ladies of the congregation to reduce the mortgage debt. They have paid \$344 on this account for this year and the mortgage indebtedness now stands at \$10,000.

The committee are of the opinion that a more universal use of the (white) Revenue envelopes would largely increase the contributions under this head. It is surprising how few people make use of them with regularity. Yet this method is the easiest and simplest way of paying into the treasury, and in addition to this the influence of systematic giving must be beneficial.

Thanks are due to Mr. C. A. Low for his careful management of the Interest Fund and also to Mr. N. R. Carmichael for his efficient services as Church Treasurer.

The retiring Managers are Messrs. James McLeod, W. T. Minnes and W. F. Nickle.

In this way full knowledge of what is going on in the church at large and in their own congregation is imparted to every one.

Contributions have also been gathered from the people in a way the most convenient for them, for the different missions of the church. It is to be regretted that owing to so many preferring to give towards the close of the year or even into the new year, that it is impossible to have the Treasurer's report completed in time for the congregational meeting. in a way be church. e towards mpossible e congrethe curesirable to know, at the annual meeting, what the liberality of the congregation has been towards this the most important work to which it is called, after making provision for its own spiritual needs.

The Association remembering that nothing in the way of painting and papering had been done to the Manse for fourteen years, and considering such necessary from a sanitary point of view, resolved to have the interior renovated throughout. Having received an estimate for the proposed work, they set themselves to provide the means. This they did by readings, garden parties, and river excursions, and before the winter set in, the proposed work was accomplished and paid for and a surplus remained.

The Association then turned its attention to the Interest Fund. Observing from the monthly notes that the progress made would most certainly leave a large deficit to be provided for at the close of the year, immediately endeavoured to prevent this. An earnest visitation was therefore undertaken throughout the districts, with the result that over \$90 was speedily handed to the Treasurer, and in addition to this the Association voted \$50 of what remained in its own purse to this object.

The Association has pleasure in reporting that the Talent has again rendered singular service. From about 134 contributors the sum of \$434 has been obtained. The mortgage debt and the floating debt were presented as the two objects soliciting support. To the floating debt \$90 was donated by 51 subscribers, and to the mortgage was given \$344 by 83 workers. It is gratifying to the Talent to be able to report that the mortgage is now reduced to \$10,000.

The Poor Fund, which consists entirely of the collections taken at the Lord's Table and which is intended for the relief of old and indigent communicants and adherents of the congregation, and for any belonging to us in sudden and special necessity, has been managed by a small committee of the Association. The accounts with vouchers and all particulars have been laid before the Kirk-Session, and have given satisfaction.

Early in the year through the zeal of Miss Annie Davidson, ever devising means and ways and sparing herself no trouble, an illustrated lecture on the Merchant of Venice was given on behalf of Guild work by Mr. Marshall of the Collegiate Institute. The attendance was large, the lecture was able and full of interest, and the result enabled the Guild to place a cheque for \$60 on the collection plate on Anniversary Sunday. For Mr. Marshall's gratuitous services, so cheerfully rendered and so much appreciated, we return our grateful thanks.

The Dorcas Section, we are glad to report, is still presided over by Miss Smith, who has occupied this position from the beginning of the Guild. Having had no predecessor we hope for our own sakes that it may be long before she has a successor in office. Unweariedly the work belonging to this department has been carried on by the devoted band of workers. Weekly meetings have been held, almost without a break throughout the year, for the purpose of making and mending garments for poor families belonging to the Church, for needy children attending the Sabbath School, and for over-driven mothers. Orders have also been received from a few members of the congregation, the payment for the execution of which along with a few money donations from thoughtful friends who recognize that help in this form must necessarily be required for this work, have enabled the Dorcas to do a great deal of helpful kindness. Gifts of clothing, both new and partly worn, have been sent them from several households and have been made the most of. In the spring of the year a small sale of useful articles was held and was well patronized, and brought into their purse the neat sum of \$60.

The Hospital Section has been faithfully discharging the sacred duties devolved upon them. Visits have been regularly paid to the wards, and to private rooms when desired, in the General Hospital, and we are glad to report that through the attention of the committee appointed at last annual meeting, free access to the Hotel Dieu has again been obtained. The Protestants in the House of Providence and the Presbyterians in the House of Industry have been visited and cared for. At Rockwood Hospital for the insane a most interesting work has been carried on among the female patients. A weekly bible meeting has been held without intermission during the year, which has been largely attended, that is from 25 to 30 patients have been present on the average. These meetings are thoroughly enjoyed by the afflicted inmates, are looked forward to as the bright hour of the whole week, and profuse is the gratitude extended to those who are in charge of the work. Very touching are the prayers of the patients at these meetings and the whole impression of the service hath upon the patients and the ladies who conduct them is that verily God is with them, that it is an hour of worship, and that the work is holy. After the meeting the cottages and the cottage hospital are visited, literature and little gifts are distributed, and the visitors leave more deeply thankful for their own great mercies and precious bless ings, and more anxious to return to such work, and happy that such opportunities of usefulness to God's own afflicted have been afforded them. Workers for this department are not easily found and must be peculiarly qualified, but we have never wanted the very kind of women needed. Mrs. Marshall and Mrs. Mason and latterly Mrs. Mackie have given themselves to this field of labour and find much delight in it.

The Social Section has as usual attended to the manifestations of kindness to strangers and others associating with us. A very enjoyable At Home was given to a large gathering of young people towards the close of the year, and in view of the coming Anniversary Collection an effort of some kind has been decided upon, and will shortly be made known.

The Visiting Section is never idle, Miss Gray, who still continues at its head, is always on the move, acquainting herself personally with all the aged poor and sick, and rendering services little dreamt of by the congregation at large. She is simply invaluable and becomes more so every year.

From this report, as from those that have preceded, it will be seen that the Young Women's Guild is an association in the sphere of practical religion, that its work is many-sided, and that however little it may be able to achieve, its intentions are good and its aims high. May the Lord pardon and accept and keep us unwearied in well-doing.

St. Andrew's Juvenile Guild has continued to do their share of work for the Hospital. During the past year they have made numbers of pillow cases and hemmed towels for the children's ward.

Too much credit cannot be given to all the members who took part in the entertainment in the spring. The untiring way in which they attended all the rehearsals, and the energetic manner in which they disposed of the tickets was very much to be admired. At this entertainment the sum of \$35 was realized. Out of this we paid for the replacing of the name-plates on the cots, which amounted to \$27. Besides we paid \$2 for having sheets and pillow cases laundried and \$6 for toys for the children's ward at Xmas, leaving \$1 on hand besides \$12 which was our share of the first moonlight excursion given by the Women's Home Association.

At our annual meeting Miss Hamilton, Miss Ethel Minnes, and Miss Taylor were elected Vice-Presidents, Miss Edith Low, Treasurer and Miss Marion Lesslie, Secretary.

The work of the members of the Guild at present is the dressing of dolls and furnishing of beds for a beautiful doll's house which was kindly donated by Miss Marion Redden.

Much regret has been expressed by members of the Guild at the lamentably sad death of one of its oldest members, Miss Etta Gillie. Until her labours called her elsewhere she was most constant and untiring in her work among us. We feel that our Father in Heaven had other and better work for her to do and so, in his great wisdom, He took her from the cares of earth to minister unto His angels in that bright and happy home where there is no more parting.
