A HORRIBLE CHRISTMAS TRAGEDY-At a horrible Christmas tragedy happened in south-western Manitoba. A farmer named A. J. Halford left at noon for his home near Norway, carrying liquor. His wife and three small children ran away on his appearance. He drove on to Norway, returning home this morning with a neighbor to find the children at a neighbor's house and his wife lying forty feet from the door frozen, with her face fully mutilated. He then only remembered to have struck her, he says, with his hand. The Christmas tree stood on the table as prepared untouched. He has been placed in custody at Norway, and the coroner will be held in default of bail.

FURTHER PARTICULARS OF THE TRAGEDY-Dr. J. H. Halford, the wife murderer, has been sent to Winnipeg to await his trial. Mrs. Halford was within a fortnight of confinement, and was in previous experience fled as he approached on the fatal night. The nearest neighbor, a man named Elder, on returning home Christmas night, found Halford's three children there in bed, but as the family had taken refuge with them before, and he knew the fact that when the husband and father was absent, the wife was at Mr. Halford's house. Halford came to Elder's at daylight in the morning and asked the children to be left where they were. Halford was down spirited and started for home. Elder followed him, and on reaching Halford's, Elder passed on to make a search for her, when Halford, exclaiming "I've found my wife and she's dead." There was the poor woman a few yards from her own door, with her arms outstretched and her face smashed into an almost unrecognizable pulp. A pitiful shriek and a groan were the last sounds heard. Elder rushed to her side, and with his own hands, he tried to revive her. "Yes, I struck her with my hand," Halford remained in the house while Elder went for authority to take her to the morgue. There being no coroner in the locality the culprit was brought to Winnipeg this evening and confined to goal.
