He celebrated his 70th birthday on January 28th last, and was said to be in better health at that time than he has been for many years. He was the victim of paralysis, which gradually and almost insensibly affected him, without affecting his mental powers. A day or two after the last anniversary of his birthday he was unable to walk and slipped and fell on an icy sidewalk. He injured his head so that his brain was affected and he lay almost ever after hovering between life and death, and generally in a condition of unconsciousness, and at last death has put an end to the struggle. He was born on the 29th January 1822, in Perthshire, Scotland. He received as good an education as it was possible to receive up to his thirteenth year, when on the death of his father he was apprenticed and learned the trade of stone-mason. At 22 years of age he came to Canada and settled in Kingston, where his ability soon brought him into prominence, in 1862 succeeding his brother Hope Mackenzie in the representation of Lambton in the old parliament of Canada.

His Canadian Portrait Gallery, in speaking of the deceased in political days: 'He went into the debates of the day at a very early period of his parliamentary career. He soon made his mark in the house as a ready and fluent speaker, who had the political history of the country at his fingers ends, and who was thoroughly acquainted with the requirements of the times. His speeches, though they made no pretence to impassioned flights of oratory, or even to any consummate breadth of statesmanship, were marked by earnestness and practical common sense. He displayed a wonderful aptitude for dealing with matters involving a knowledge of minute and complicated details, and he was even then regarded by his fellow members as a remarkable encyclopaedia of Canadian statistics.'

When Confederation was first mooted he became one of its most earnest advocates but did not agree with the reform party when it favored a coalition of Mr. George Brown with Sir John A. Macdonald's government of the day. Mr. Brown's retirement from the government by resigning Mr. Mackenzie was invited to enter the cabinet himself as president of the Council, which he declined to do as he was in a perfect accord with Mr. Brown's retirement, and saw no good reason for the continuance of the coalition. From that time until the subsequent defeat of Mr. Brown at the first general election he acted as leader of the opposition from his retirement from the government. Mr. Mackenzie acted as leader and continued to hold that position until the resignation of Sir John A. Macdonald's government on the 5th of November, 1873, when Mr. Mackenzie was sent for by Lord Dufferin, and upon him devolved the duty of forming a new government.

Mr. Mackenzie while in office in the legislature of Upper Canada had gained the character of being an indefatigable worker, and his same capacity for work carried into the government of which he was Prime Minister. Under his leadership the government did not grow in favor, while it was admitted that at least was scrupulously honest in his conduct of public affairs, the same could not be said of his colleagues, with possibly one exception, but his brusqueness and unamiability of temper were not suited to a leader of men, and hence persons who would meet on business or otherwise took offense at his curt treatment and those with other perhaps more important matters led to the defeat of his party in September 1888.

For two years after Mr. Mackenzie continued to lead his party in the house of commons, and at the beginning of the session of 1890 he went through the formality of tendering his resignation, which to his surprise was accepted and Mr. Blake was appointed. The ingratitude with which he was treated by his party was a worse shock to him than the defeat of his party at the polls and he is said by those who knew him to have never been the same man afterwards, and he took little or no part in the councils of the leaders of his party.

Of late years he has only attended the afternoon sessions of the house and he had to be assisted out of the house on account of the partial paralysis of his lower limbs. In the session of 1886 he deviated from his usual custom when he remained to the close of a long debate to give his vote. On this occasion he rose in his place, which was not his habit, and stood until his name was called as one of the majority voting with the government to carry Mr. Blake on the rebel question, and due credit has always been paid him for his sturdy manliness in voting for the right in spite of party.

The funeral arrangements are announced as follows: On Wednesday his body will be conveyed from his late residence to the Jarvis Street Baptist Church, where services will be held, after which the cortege will proceed to the Union Station, from whence the remains will be conveyed to Sarnia, arriving on 9 p. m. On Thursday, the services in Sarnia will commence at 2.30 p. m. when the interment will take place in the family plot in Lake View Cemetery.

The St. John Sun concludes an admirable article on the deceased statesman with the following remarks:— Mr. Mackenzie tried to give Canada honest government on business principles. He gave to the country the best service of his mind and body. He sacrificed ease and comfort for the public good. In office he did the work of two or three. He sought nothing for himself. He was a party man in the best

sense. He believed that party government was the only possible government and that the integrity of associates or the blunders of his successors in the leadership, could cause him to turn his back on his party or his principles.

The British Wood Market. LIVERPOOL, April 1. The arrivals from British North America during the past month have been 3,265,402 (4,012) against arrivals during the corresponding month last year, and the aggregate tonnage to this date from all places during the years 1890, 1891 and 1892 has been 24,980, 26,377 and 36,864 tons respectively.

Business throughout the month has been exceptionally quiet and the deliveries generally unsatisfactory, owing to several forced auction sales, prices of some articles have declined, stocks generally, though not excessive, are quite ample.

New Brunswick and Nova Scotia Spruce Deals.—The import has consisted of 933 standard, against no import during the same two previous years; the demand is unsatisfactory, and the price of the 1892 standard (which is less than last year) is quite sufficient. Two auction sales have taken place during the month, a parcel of 48 ft. 34, per standard; a cargo of 1,000 standard was chiefly withdrawn. These sales have had a disquieting effect on our market, and sales for the coming season can now only be made at lower rates.

Imports.—Both logs and planks have been imported moderately; the demand continues good, and stocks are moderate and prices firm.
