



Pastor's Address.

My dear Brethren and Fellow Labourers in Christ:-

Another year of service has passed away. Like Paul, we may gladly "thank God and take courage."

You will see from the report herewith presented that the "hand of the Lord has been with us for good."

Financially, we have been able to meet every obligation promptly and maintain fully the various interests and meet the needs of the church and congregation.

The Sabbath School has been well sustained and is increasing in numbers and influence. The Epworth League has done a noble work. This has been especially marked in its evangelistic labours and its missionary zeal.

The Society Classes have been well attended, especially by the younger members, and we would urge that the older members should guard earnestly against any neglect of this time-honoured and valuable means of grace.

The Connexional Funds have been well sustained, the Superannuation and the Missionary Funds being far in advance of all previous years.

The sum of two thousand dollars has been paid on the parsonage, the interest on the remaining debt now is but little more than one half of our previous yearly rental.

During the year over two hundred have professed conversion.

The evangelistic sevices conducted by Rev. Dr. Munhall were greatly blessed and hundreds professed to find the Lord, many of these united with other churches, but through these services our own numbers have been greatly augmented.

All these things furnish cause for profound thankfulness to the great Head of the Church, and should inspire us with increased courage and renewed enthusiasm in our church work.

The year now before us is the last that we shall spend together in our present relationship. May we not hope that its successes will be greater and our devotion more worthy of a cause so sacred?

A fuller consecration to God, a stronger faith in his ever present helpfulness, a more unflinching loyalty to our King, a deeper spirit of prayerfulness and a regular attendance upon the means of grace, especially the weeknight services, will bring to us such a measure of triumph as we have not yet known. If our comparatively feeble and partial efforts during the past years have been so abundantly blessed, then how much more may we not expect and claim during the present year by true-hearted devotion to the cause so dear to our hearts?

Let us live in constant fellowship with Christ. Let us make as the "man of our counsel" that book which "testifies of Him," whose promises are unyielding as the granite, and whose wisdom has been our fathers' guide and will solve for us the problems and perplexities which crowd upon us in this restless age. And "the very God of peace sanctify you wholly," and "grace and peace be multiplied unto you in the knowledge of God and of Jesus Christ our Lord."

We were greatly helped by the special services under the direction of Dr. Munhall, many of our members being actively engaged in this work, under the Personal Work Committee.

Early in the winter we decided to do away with collections and entertainments as a means of raising money-relying solely upon small subscriptions from each member to defray running expenses. Our action in this matter has been amply justified by our increased receipts.

We ask the prayers and co-operation of all our Church members in making our League what it ought to be-a training school in Christian work for the young people of our congregation.

In the early part of the year collections were small, but since January they have improved, reaching nearly the amount received the previous year. Special collections at Christmas and Thanksgiving remain about the same, both marking the liberality of the congregation. Only a few of the members contribute at the Communion Services, still we have had money ample for our needs. The family that has received the largest sum for the past two years is now broken up; the father dead, the two little children in the Orphans' Home and the mother supports herself. It was a matter of consolation that the last hours of the parents together were comforted from this fund. A young man, the victim of drink, was relieved in his distress and sent home to his parents, a respectable Methodist family. The relief afforded to some others tided them over a period of real want. There are about a dozen applicants who have no claim upon the fund from which they receive but a small grant, though they seem content in being thus slightly recognized. The generosity of the church is thus not wasted, as at Christmas especially the distributors were able to send luxuries to some who appreciate such kindness. Psalm 24, I.
