THE COURT HOUSE.

As the By-Law for raising money under the Consolidated Loan Fund Act, for the erection of a Court House and Offices in and for the United Counties is now being brought forward to be sanctioned or rejected by the rate-payers of the various Municipalities, on the 12th inst. it may not be amiss to say a few words on this subject, although we certainly think they can scarcely be required, as the people of these Counties must be well aware of the necessity that exists for such buildings.

In point of economy, which is probably the most general view that will be taken of the matter, we think the Counties will effect a direct saving as the annual proportion of the interest and principal of the two thousand pounds about to be borrowed, extended through a period of thirty years, will only be a comparative trifle above the amount now annually required for rent of offices and rooms for the holding of Courts, putting out of the view altogether that the neglect to erect a suitable edifice for these purposes will first of all oblige the rate-payers to contain the public records, MAY YET COST THE PEOPLE OF THESE UNITED COUNTIES A SUM EVEN GREATER THAN FIFTY THOUSAND POUNDS, which is probably a very low estimate of the incalculable loss which would inevitably ensue should a conflagration take place in the building at present occupied. This building is probably the best adapted for the purpose of any at present in the Town, but with five or six fires burning every day, and the Office keeper residing within the same, it is not provided, in any one of the departments of public record, with fire-proof chambers, where public documents of the most valuable kind could be kept. With the utmost care a fire is at all times liable to take place, and should such at any time burst forth, nothing could prevent the loss of a large portion and perhaps the entire collection of records in the office of the Registrar Deeds for the Counties including the many thousands of Deeds, Mortgages, Judgments, and other documents, which have cost the Counties a vast amount to record. What security have the public that these documents and the valuable Wills, Chattel Mortgages, Judgments and other records in the Office of the Surrogate, Registrar and Clerk of the County Court, and the numerous records which could not be replaced, in the Office of the Clerk of the Peace and Treasurer—what security, we say, have the public in these United Counties that the whole of these may not be destroyed in a single night? We reply none. The vigilant care of the Office-keeper may do something to prevent such a disaster from the inside, and although the external exposure of the present building is by no means a bad one, yet it is obvious that in the neighborhood of Blocksmith's Shops, Taverns and a host of other inflammable buildings it is not quite impregnable against external fire. In fact we have seen a similar building, with like exposure, take fire from burning buildings on the opposite side of the Street. But, are the people of the Counties so indifferent to their own interests as to leave the titles of the whole landed property of the United Counties to be hazarded upon a mere chance which is ever liable to occur.

If we reflect, but for a moment, upon the impossibility of restoring the titles to any lot of land, we shall see this more fully. Even supposing that a farmer may have his deeds in his own possession, and that the memorials of the same have all been duly registered, let the public record be destroyed, what guarantee would a future purchaser have that other deeds or mortgages were not in existence? The public Registry, under the present Canadian enactment is the only place where holders and purchasers of land can ascertain the correctness of their title with certainty. And should the records here placed, be destroyed, much obscurity and uncertainty would inevitably follow.

The law-suits and difficulties which would then ensue, we think would be cheaply prevented at the price of ten Court-Houses. We do not require to say much more upon this subject, although it is certainly to be regretted that the people of these United Counties have already once rejected this By-Law. This may have resulted from things of the kind are treated by many people, who are apt to arrive at the conclusion too hastily, that "it does not concern them." But it must be obvious to all a public and important matter of this kind, is one in which every one is interested, and every one should record his vote for this measure, if only on the score of economy with propriety on the 12th inst. and that the County of Huron may no longer be designated as the County without a Court House.

We are sorry to see that attempts are being made to stir public opinion upon this important matter, ostensibly with a view to get a site for the same out of Goderich. We alluded to this last week, since which we have received another letter from a Township Councilor (apparently to Clinton as the site for the Court House. We would willingly publish the letter as desired, but are aware that it would lead to a most capricious discussion, which would have had the rationality of the Gravel Road dispute, would raise a far greater number of conflicting interests and would be almost interminable. Nor do we think the interest of our Clinton friends would be advanced. They perhaps are not aware that the people of Bayfield and Port Albert are already in the field before them for metropolitan honors, and when they reflect that the only possible advantage which they possess is that of being centrally situated (which may be equally affirmed on behalf of Bayfield), and the Railway, which merely passes through their village where it will have a station for taking up and depositing goods and passengers, could not terminate there; and that this same railroad and coasting steamers on the lake will speedily annihilate distances and throw a mere geometrical centralization into the shade, they will not, we think, be so keen for a public discussion of the mere site. That must be in the County Town and what place is there in Canada better fitted for a County Town than Goderich? Looking as it does the best Harbor on Lake Huron, it will and must become the great entrepot of the West. Situated centrally between the northern and southern portions of the county of Huron, on the great waterway highway, it is evidently convenient on that account, and when we consider that the immense western trade which must be done by Goderich, and the vast increase of population which will be consequent at that port, it will be seen, above all, that in point of population, Goderich will not be so far removed from the centre. As it is, our Clinton friends will admit that it is only 12 miles from what they call the centre of the County, and that by our Railway these few miles may be traversed in a few minutes. Besides where the Court House is, of course the public offices must be kept, and it will be admitted on all hands that at the centre of Public Business is the place where there are most required. Our correspondent refers us to the map as to the situation of Clinton, in return, we think he will have no difficulty by referring to the map of the Province, in discovering that there are many County Towns far less centrally situated than Goderich. We have been led into these rather lengthy remarks on account of the desire of our Huron Correspondent, that we should treat the subject in a liberal and unprejudiced manner. We hope the rate-payers will not allow petty local jealousies to prevent them from voting favorably upon the By-Law which will be submitted to them on Monday the 12th inst. at 11 o'clock A. M.
