The Right to Make our Treaties.

Mr. Charlton, in a speech to his constituents, has reiterated Mr. Blake's contention that Canada ought to make her own treaties.

The Montreal Herald, Hon. Peter Mitchell's paper, endorses Mr. Charlton's reference to the matter, and then goes further and says that as England allowed us to make our own tariffs she will just as freely grant us other trading-making power.

We are asking a great deal more than was involved in the right to regulate our own tariff. We were allowed to make our own tariff because it was understood that Canada of all nations, including the mother country, had the right to make treaties.

There are four bonds that still bind us to the mother country, (1) the government-general, (2) the commander-in-chief of our militia, (3) the right of appeal to the privy council (4) the right of the imperial government to make our treaties.

Mr. Blake and those who contend with him for the right to make treaties must get on a more solid foundation. They must first be prepared to advocate separation before asking for the treaty-making power.
