Children must be clothed in flannel all the year round, and must be made to know that the staples of diet are milk, bread, meat, vegetables, and fruit, and that tea, coffee, and pastry of all kinds are to be used only as the greatest of luxuries, and therefore in small quantities and at long intervals.
