## Three Hundred Hours

An official non-stop run, 300 hours long, was completed last Friday morning by a standard Packard " 38 " motor. It was announced by the Automobile Club of America, New York, as a 200 hour test. At the end of that period, the motor was running so smoothly that it was continued in operation for 100 hours more. This more than doubles the best previous record of 132 hours, made four years ago in England.

The motor maintained a speed of 1200 revolutions per minute. Measured in road performance, it pulled the " 38 " car with a full load at a speed of 37.46 miles per hour, over roads heavy enough to demand a wide open throttle. In 300 hours it rolled up $\mathbf{1 1 , 2 3 8}$ miles.
