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
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

BROCKVILLE, 16th June, 1873.

The Council met at two o'clock p.m.

The Warden in the Chair.

Town line between Bastard and South Crosby.

Mr. Birmingham, the petition of James Anderson and others, praying for a grant of money for Road between the Townships of Leeds and Pittsburgh.

Mr. Jones moved, seconded by Mr. Tenant, that the Clerk of the Conneil be and he is hereby instructed to prepare a Memorial to His Excellency the Governor General in Conneil of the Dominion requesting that the Islands in the St. Lawrence River, fronting these United Connties, and known as the Thousand Islands, be not sold, but be retained for public use of the Dominion, save and excepting such Islands as may be reported 'y the officers now making a survey, as suitable for farming purposes, and that said memorial, after being referred to this Council during this session, if adopted, be signed by the Warden and Clerk under Seal and forwarded to the proper quarter. Carried.

Mr. Tenant moved, seconded by Mr. Whelan, that a Committee composed of Messrs. Jones, Taplin, and the prover, on behalf of the County of Leeds, and Messrs. Wilson, Kernahan, and Read, on behalf of Grenville, be a committee to confer with the Brockville and Prescott Councils respectively as to what propertion or sum Brockville and Prescott should pay towards the erecting of the new Registry office, and report to the Council at its next session. Carried.

Mr. Whelan moved, seconded by Mr. Birmingham, that the Conneil do now adjourn till 2 o'clock p. m. Carried.

The Council adjourned.

The Council met at two o'elock p.m.

The Warden laid on the table, the letter of the Treasurer relat-ing to the loan from the Bank of Montreal.

At the request of the Special Committee for building the new Registry office of the County of Greuville and Mr. Fraser their Solicitor, the contract for building the said office between John Gordon and Nesfield Ward of the first part, and the Corporation of the United Counties of Leeds and Grenville of the second part, was signed and countersigned by the Warden and the Clerk, and the Seal of the Corporation affixed thereto in open Council.

With the leave of the Council, Mr. Wilson brought up the petition of the President and Directors of the General Protestant Hospital of the County of Carlton, asking aid for that Institution.

Mr. Porter moved, seconded by Mr. Adams, that the Council do make a special grant to each of the High Schools of Gananoque, Farmersville, and Kemptville of \$200, for the year 1873, said grant to aid in paying Assistant Teachers, and to be in addition to the County grant.

Mr. Tenant in amendment moved, seconded by Mr. McBratney, that the sum of \$300 be granted to Gananoque High School; \$200 to Kemptville High School, and \$300 to the Farmersville High School, each grant to be in full payment for any claims they may have against the High School district as constituted by By-law No. 380 passed 26th January, 1872, until said By-law was repealed by By-law No. 385 passed June 21st, 1872, this grant to be in addition to the County grant, and that the High Schools refund any money paid them by any of the Municipalities on account of said By-law No. 380 being passed, to the Municipalities respectively, that have so paid, said sums to be paid back to the Municipalities that have paid the demands made by the said High School District before this grant shall become payable by the County Treasurer.

The Conncil divided on the amendment, and the names being called for, they were taken down as follows:

Amendment carried by a majority of 13.

The original motion as amended was then adopted.

Mr. Wilson moved, seconded by Mr. Tenant, that the Clerk be and he is hereby instructed to draft a Memorial to the Lieut.-Governor in Council of the Province of Ontario, setting forth the urgent necessity of increasing the accommodation in the Asylum for that class of afflicted people known as idiots, said Memorial to be submitted to the Conneil, and if approved to be signed by the Warden and Clerk, and forwarded to the Provincial Secretary. Carried.

Mr. Fields moved, seconded by Mr. Scovil, that there be three hundred and fifty dollars granted by the Conneil in aid of the Agricultural Societies of these United Counties as follows, namely— To the South Riding of Leeds County Society, one hundred dollars.

Secondly, to the North Riding of Leeds County Society, one hundred dollars.

Thirdly, to the North Riding of Grenville County Society, one hundred dollars.

Fourthly, to the Brockville and Elizabethtown County Society, fifty dollars, and the same to be paid out of the County funds.

Mr. Bell in amendment moved, seconded by Mr. Carley, that no money be granted to any of the Agricultural Societies at this time, as their is such a large amount to pay for the Registry office at Prezent and other grants.

The Council divided, and the names being called for, they were taken down as follows:

Whitmarsh, McBratney, Wilson, Whelan, and the mover, to meet a committee of the Conneil of Brockville, and report to the Conneil to-morrow recommending any improvements they may think proper in beautifying and fitting up the Court House Square. Lost.

Mr. Whitmarsh moved, seconded by Mr. Read, that the Clerk be instructed to insert in the By-law authorizing the Treasurer to borrow money from the Bank of Montreal the sum of \$12,600, instead of \$10,000. Carried.

The Chairman of the Special Committee on the appointment of an Inspector of Taverns and Shops brought up their report.

Mr. Miilar moved, seconded by Mr. Adams, that the Council do now adjourn until to-morrow morning at ten o'clock a.m. Carr'.d.

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The Committee appointed to build the Registry office at Prescott, for the County of Grenville, keg leave to report as follows:

Your Committee immediately after the January Session of the Council, completed the purchase of the site for the Registry office, by paying to Maria S. Boyd the sum of seven hundred dollars, and got a good and satisfactory deed in fee simple for the same.

Your Committee proceeded at once to advertise for tenders in five of the newspapers published in these United Counties, and also circulated large posters inviting tenders for the building of the said Registry Office, giving three weeks time for the tenders to be sent in. A number of tenders were received by your committee, and when all were opened, it was found that the tender of Thomas Russell of Morrisburgh was the lowest, being \$6135, and was accordingly accepted.

But subsequently when the committee met, and had the contract prepared and ready for signature, the said Thomas Russell and his surveices refused to sign the same.

A satisfactory arrangement was afterwards made by your committee with Messrs. Gordon & Ward, by their reducing their tonders from \$7900 to \$7300. The contract was therefore made with John Gordon of the Town of Brockville, and Nesfield Ward of the Town of Prescott, and their sureties are J. P. Wiser of Prescott, and William Cowan of the Township of Elizabethtown.

Your committee have further to report that the building has been located on the corner of the lot, being on a line with James and Centre Streets. On the excavations being made for the foundations, a smooth, level rock was found at about three feet from the surface in about three-fifths of the space, the remaining two-fifths being six feet to the rock. Your committee were of the opinion that the Council would bear them out in incurring a small extra expense to make the foundation good and sure, by having the whole building founded on the rock, and it was so ordered to be done. It was found in digging down the six feet to the rock that water lodged in the foundation, and your committee had to take the responsibility of having a drain dug to draw it off, which will insure a small extra charge.

The foundation walls are now all completed, with the exception of the flagging for the floor, and ready for the brick wall, and your committee have every reason to believe that the building will be finished within the time specified in the contract.

Your committee have further to report that they have engaged the services of James Irwin, Esquire, of Prescott, to superintend the building of the said Registry Office, and have agreed to pay him for his services two and one-half per cent. on its cost.

GENTLEMEN-We beg to report that we have made a very careful examination of cash book of the late Treasurer of the Counties, including all items entered between the first day of January and the twentyfifth day of June, 1873, inclusive. One item of \$150 charged for advertising non-resident lands we have struck out of the accounts; there is no voncher for payment of \$253, public school money paid to the Treasurer of South Crosby; we found proper vonchers for the other items; we have also examined the non-resident land sale account for 1873, and found it correct.

The cash book shows a balance of cash on hand of \$2,992.25 on the last above named date; a few payments of land tax are not yet entered in cash book; the balance at redit in bank is \$3,184.05, as shown by accompanying certificate. After completing the andit of the books in detail, we will make a more detailed report, and suggest some changes in the method of keeping the municipal assessment accounts and the non-resident land sales accounts.
