BROCKVILLE, 16th June, 1873.

The Council met at two o'clock p.m.

The Warden in the Chair.

Members present—Messrs. Adams, Barlow, Beach, Bell, Bissell, Birmingham, Carley, Cornett, Fields, Hourigan, Keeler, Lambert, McBratney, Millar, Murp'ry, Porter, Preston, Rathwell, Read, Stafford, Tenant, Whelan, Whitmarsh and Wilson.

The Warden laid on the table,

1. Apportionment of Legislative School Grant for 1873.
2. Report of Auditors with detailed statement of Receipts and Expenditure and abstract of assets and liabilities.
3. Letter of Provincial Secretary acknowledging receipt of petition respecting Gaol fund.
4. Letter of W. M. Smith, Provincial Officer, respecting appointment of an officer under Tavern Act.
5. Letter of Secretary of Board of Trustees of the Gananoque High School.
6. Six petitions of the Council of Public Instruction to the Legislature.
7. Letter of Provincial Secretary, respecting Grenville Registry Office.

8. Letter of Inspector of Registry Offices, relating to the office of the County of Leeds.

The minutes of yesterday were read and approved.

Mr. Stevens brought up the petition of Samuel H. Shipman and others, relating to the Town line between Yonge and Elizabethtown.

Mr. Scovil the petition of James Dowsett and others, relating to Town line between Bastard and South Crosby.

Mr. Birmingham, the petition of James Anderson and others, praying for a grant of money for Road between the Townships of Leeds and Pittsburgh.

Mr. Kernahan, the petition of John Redmond and others, relating to the Road between South Gower and Oxford.

Mr. Jones moved, seconded by Mr. Read, that the Assessment Rolls for 1872 be referred to the Assessment Committee for equalization. Carried.

The Warden laid on the table statement of the Board of Trustees of the Farmersville High School.

Mr. Fields moved, seconded by Mr. Read, that the Council do now adjourn until 2 of the clock p.m., in order to allow the Committees to go on with their work. Carried.

The Council adjourned.

The Council met at 2 o'clock p.m.

The Warden laid on the table, letter of the Clerk of the County Court relating to books for his office.

The Chairman of the Standing Committee on Education, brought up their first report.

Mr. Adams moved, seconded by Mr. Birmingham, that the first



report of the Committee on Education, be referred to a Committee of the whole Council. Carried.

The Council in Committee.

Mr. Porter in the Chair.

The Chairman resumed.

The Chairman reported that the Committee had risen and adopted certain resolutions on the question of the reception of the report.

Mr. Jones moved, seconded by Mr. Taplin, that the report be not received, but be referred back to the Committee with instructions to recommend payment of the accounts of the High School District No. 1 of Gananoque, amounting to \$465.50, and of the Farmersville High School, \$203.75.

Mr. Jones moved, seconded by Mr. Tenant, that the Clerk of the Council be and he is hereby instructed to prepare a Memorial to His Excellency the Governor General in Council of the Dominion requesting that the Islands in the St. Lawrence River, fronting these United Counties, and known as the Thousand Islands, be not sold, but be retained for public use of the Dominion, save and excepting such Islands as may be reported by the officers now making a survey, as suitable for farming purposes, and that said memorial, after being referred to this Council during this session, if adopted, be signed by the Warden and Clerk under Seal and forwarded to the proper quarter. Carried.

Mr. Tenant moved, seconded by Mr. Whelan, that a Committee composed of Messrs. Jones, Taplin, and the mover, on behalf of the County of Leeds, and Messrs. Wilson, Kernahan, and Read, on behalf of Grenville, be a committee to confer with the Brockville and Prescott Councils respectively as to what proportion or sum Brockville and Prescott should pay towards the erecting of the new Registry office, and report to the Council at its next session. addition to the County grant, and that the High Schools refund any money paid them by any of the Municipalities on account of said By-law No. 380 being passed, to the Municipalities respectively, that have so paid, said sums to be paid back to the Municipalities that have paid the demands made by the said High School District before this grant shall become payable by the County Treasurer.

The Committee appointed to build the Registry office at Prescott, for the County of Grenville, beg leave to report as follows :

Your Committee immediately after the January Session of the Council, completed the purchase of the site for the Registry office, by paying to Maria S. Boyd the sum of seven hundred dollars, and got a good and satisfactory deed in fee simple for the same.

Your Committee proceeded at once to advertise for tenders in five of the newspapers published in these United Counties, and also circulated large posters inviting tenders for the building of the said Registry Office, giving three weeks time for the tenders to be sent in. A number of tenders were received by your committee, and when all were opened, it was found that the tender of Thomas Russell of Morrisburgh was the lowest, being \$6135, and was accordingly accepted.

But subsequently when the committee met, and had the contract prepared and ready for signature, the said Thomas Russell and his sureties refused to sign the same.

A satisfactory arrangement was afterwards made by your committee with Messrs. Gordon & Ward, by their reducing their tenders from \$7900 to \$7300. The contract was therefore made with John Gordon of the Town of Brockville, and Nesfield Ward of the Town of Prescott, and their sureties are J. P. Wiser of Prescott, and William Cowan of the Township of Elizabethtown.

Your committee have further to report that the building has been located on the corner of the lot, being on a line with James and Centre Streets. On the excavations being made for the foundations, a smooth, level rock was found at about three feet from the surface in about three-fifths of the space, the remaining two-fifths being six feet to the rock. Your committee were of the opinion that the Council would bear them out in incurring a small extra expense to make the foundation good and sure, by having the whole building founded on the





Office and for express charges, in all amounting to the sum of \$28.38, which your committee recommend to be paid.

8th. Also the account of James Keeler for six days services at Prescott Registry Office, amounting to the sum of \$24.00, which they recommend to be paid.

9th. Also the account of Andrew Wilson for eight days services at Prescott Registry Office at \$4 per day, and express charges, \$1.36, in all amounting to the sum of \$33.36, which your committee recommend to be paid.

10th. Your committee would here recommend that in future all charges made by the Grenville Registry Office Building Committee for services, be paid at the rate of \$3 per day instead of \$4, as now charged.

11th. Your committee have carefully examined the account of Fraser & Mooney for writing deed, drawing contract, and for advice to the Building Committee of the Registry Office at Prescott, amounting to the sum of \$35, which they recommend to be paid, although your committee are of the opinion the account is very much too high.

12th. Your committee having estimated the amount required to be levied for the present year, they beg to submit the same for consideration of this Council, namely, the sum of \$14,500 for the ordinary current expenses of the Counties; and also the further sum of \$8,000 for the building of the new Registry Office for the County of Grenville; and also the sum of \$6,230 for Public Schools, to make up an amount equal to the Legislative Grant as apportioned by the Chief Superintendent of Education to the several Townships comprising these Counties; and also a sum sufficient to pay the interest under the provisions of By-law No. 310, and further to provide for the said debentures, to be rated on the whole rateable property as equalized by this Council.

13th. Your committee have examined the petition of Walter Denant, Esq., praying for a grant of \$100 towards the erection of buildings, &c., in behalf of the South Leeds Agricultural fair. Your committee cannot recommend the payment thereof, but would refer the said letter or petition to this Council.

Your committee have before them a letter from the Honorable the Inspector of Registry Offices for Ontario, setting forth that the Registry Office for the County of Leeds is substantially built, except some small deficiencies, which the committee recommend the contractor be instructed to have remedied, in accordance with the recommendations of the Inspector.

2nd. Your committee recommend that some person or persons be appointed to purchase the necessary furniture for the Registry office.

3rd. Your committee recommend that the Registrar be instructed to remove to the new Registry Office so soon as the necessary alterations are made, in order that the County Treasurer may occupy the old Registry Office.

4th. Your committee recommend that John White, Gaoler, be granted the sum of \$50 as compensation for additional wages paid by him to turnkey, for remainder of current year.

That your petitioners have with regret understood that attempts are being made to secure for private use and occupation the islands situate in the St. Lawrence River in the Province of Ontario, front-

ing these United Counties to the extent of fifty-five miles, commonly known as the Thousand Islands.

Your petitioners would respectfully submit that these islands should be retained by the Government, as a place of resort for the people of these United Counties, adjacent thereto, as well as of the whole Dominion generally, saving and excepting such of them as may be, from the report of the officers of the survey now being made, suitable for farming purposes.

Your petitioners feel that if the inhabitants of these United Counties, and the people of the Dominion generally, be prevented from landing on these islands by reason of their sale, it would be a great grievance.

Your petitioners therefore respectfully pray that an order be made by your Excellency's Government to prevent any such disposition.

All of which is respectfully submitted as the unanimous wish of the members of the Counties' Council of these United Counties, in Council assembled.

That the interest shall be paid on the said loan according to the usual custom of the said Bank, and the said loan on the first day of January next, and that the Treasurer shall deposit in the said Bank from time to time, the said rates and assessments as received by him, for the purpose of paying the said loan and interest as aforesaid.

3. That the bond of the said Corporation, signed by the Warden of the said United Counties, and countersigned by the Clerk thereof, and sealed with the seal of the said Corporation, in the penal sum of twenty-five thousand two hundred dollars, shall be given to the said Bank, with a condition thereon written, for the payment of any sum or sums of money so to be advanced, with interest in manner aforesaid.

10. The sum of four dollars to Dr. V. Moore for medical examination of Catharine McNickle, a lunatic confined in the gaol.

11. The sum of twenty-eight dollars and thirty-eight cents to James Millar for services on the special committee for building new Registry Office of the County of Grenville, and for express charges.

12. The sum of twenty-four dollars to James Keeler for service on the special committee for building new Registry Office of the County of Grenville.

13. The sum of thirty-three dollars and thirty-six cents to Andrew Wilson for services on the special committee for building new Registry Office of the County of Grenville, and for express charges, postages and stationery.

14. The sum of thirty-five dollars to Fraser & Mooney for drawing deed, contract, and advice to the special committee for building the new Registry Office of the County of Grenville.

15. The sum of six dollars to the Warden for attendance at Brockville to execute the contract for building the new Registry Office of the County of Grenville.

16. The sum of seven dollars and forty cents to John White for expenses of burial of Edward Rathwell, who died in the gaol.

17. That the sum of three hundred dollars be granted to the Gananoque High School; two hundred dollars to the Kemptville High School; and three hundred dollars to Farmersville High School; such grants to be in full payment for any claim they may have against the High School Districts as constituted by By-Law No. 380, passed 26th January, 1872, until said By-Law was repealed by By-Law No. 385, passed June 21st, 1872, this grant to be in addition to the County Grant, and that the High Schools refund any money paid them by any of the municipalities on account of said By-Law No. 380 being passed, to the municipalities respectively that have so paid, said sums to be paid back to the municipalities that have paid the demands made by the said High School districts, before this grant shall become payable by the County Treasurer.

18. That the sum of three hundred and fifty dollars be granted in aid of the Agricultural Societies of these Counties as follows, namely:--to the South Riding of Leeds County Society, one hundred dollars; to the North Riding of Leeds County Society, one hundred dollars; to the South Riding of Grenville County Society, one hundred dollars; and to the Brockville and Elizabethtown County Society, fifty dollars.

19. The sum of fifty dollars to John White, the gaoler, as additional wages paid by him to turnkey for the remainder of current year.

20. The sum of eleven dollars and seventy cents to James Kincaid for services as Messenger, and stationery furnished.

21. The sum of forty-four dollars to John Gordon for keeping fires in the Registry of Leeds.

GENTLEMEN—We beg to report that we have made a very careful examination of cash book of the late Treasurer of the Counties, including all items entered between the first day of January and the twenty-fifth day of June, 1873, inclusive. One item of \$150 charged for advertising non-resident lands we have struck out of the accounts; there is no voucher for payment of \$253, public school money paid to the Treasurer of South Crosby; we found proper vouchers for the other items; we have also examined the non-resident land sale account for 1873, and found it correct.

The cash book shows a balance of cash on hand of \$2,992.25 on the last above named date; a few payments of land tax are not yet entered in cash book; the balance at credit in bank is \$3,184.05, as shown by accompanying certificate. After completing the audit of the books in detail, we will make a more detailed report, and suggest some changes in the method of keeping the municipal assessment accounts and the non-resident land sales accounts.
