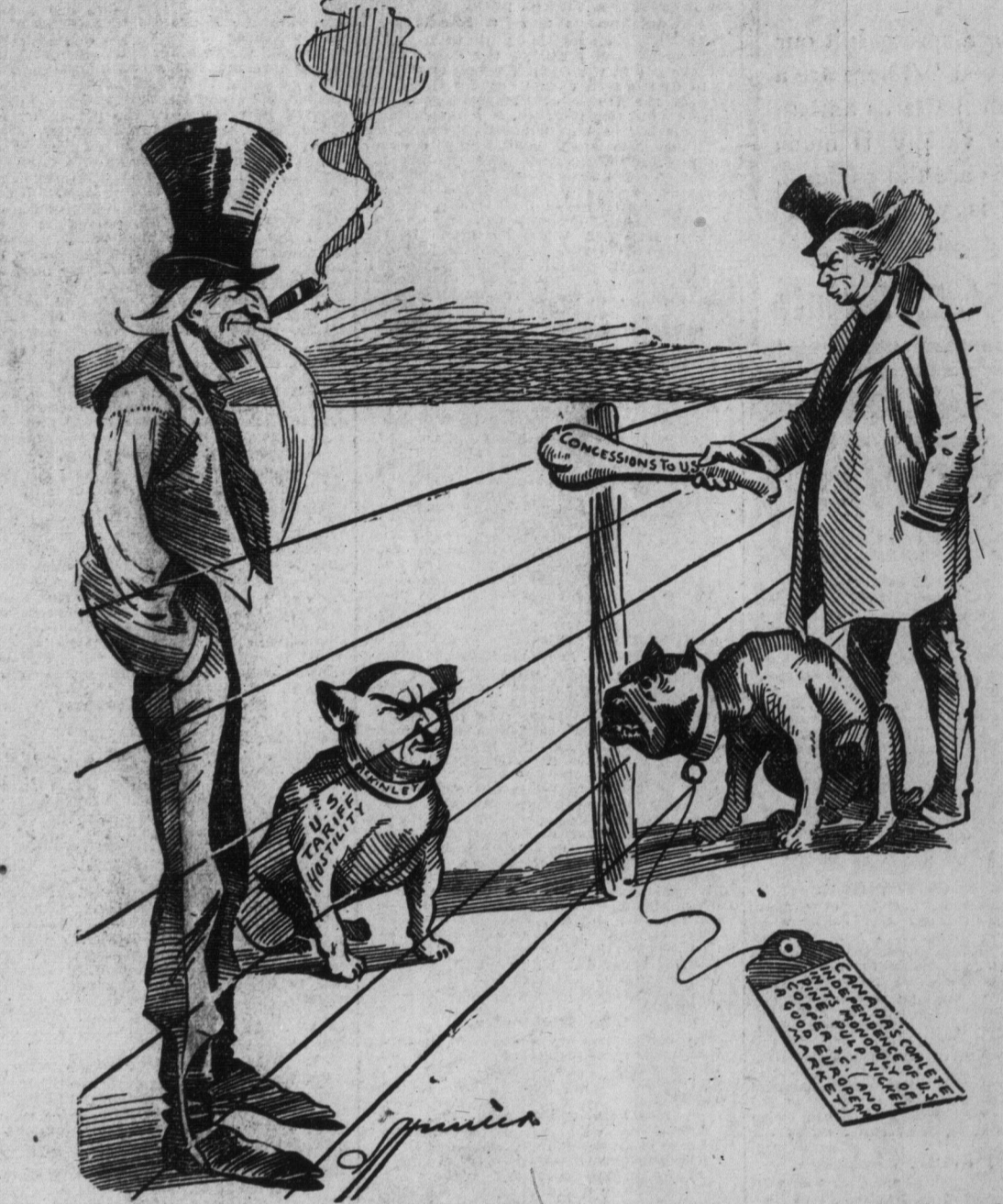

THE COMMONERS OBEY

Little Black Rod Knocked at the Chamber Door Just as Usual. HIS VERY POLITE INVITATION

Sent the Legislators Over to the Senate, Where Lord Minto Read the Queen's Speech.

But the Speech From the Throne Was One of the Driest on Record—The Treaty Negotiations, Penny Stamp, the Plebiscite, the Yukon Country and a Redistribution Bill the Only Topics Referred to—New Members Introduced—House Adjourns Till Sunday Out of Respect for the Late Hon. Mr. Wood.

Ottawa, March 16.—(Special.)—The fourth session of the eighth Parliament of the Dominion of Canada was opened to-day under more than usually favorable circumstances, the weather being almost perfect, though the wind was just a trifle raw, and consequently the crowd assembled outside the Parliament buildings was one of the largest in many years.

The usual guard of honor was furnished by the Governor-General's Foot Guards, and the mounted escort was furnished by the Princess Louise Dragoon Guards. The guns on Nepean Point boomed forth their accustomed nineteen shots, and the immense crowd on Parliament Hill cheered vociferously as the light cutter, drawn by four magnificent horses, controlled by two gaily dressed postillions, in which sat His Excellency and his A.D.C., dashed through the eastern gate to the grounds and was whirled up to the entrance to the Parliament building.

His Excellency's sleigh was accompanied by four others, containing Lady Minto and the Government House party, and the gay array of five sleighs, well horsed, with the mounted escort, speeding through the grounds and up to the entrance under the main tower presented the bravest appearance ever witnessed on Parliament Hill.

The Same Old Knock. Mentioning the Commons had assembled in their chamber, prayers had been said, and after a brief pause the traditional three knocks were rung, and the sergeant-at-arms announced "A messenger from His Excellency, the Governor." The stereotyped answer "Admit the messenger" was given by Mr. Speaker, and then our old friend, the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod appeared, made his three bows, informed the speaker that His Excellency the Governor-General desired the presence of the Commons in the Senate Chamber and backed out, bowing gracefully as ever.

A Wonderful Official. Black Rod is one of the most wonderful things about the opening of Parliament, and his bows are always greeted with applause by the Commons. To-day he had apparently given an extra oiling to the hinge in his back, for there must be a lunge or he could never double himself a lunge or he could never double himself.

THE SPEECH FROM THE THRONE

The speech from the throne is more conspicuous for what it omits than for what it contains. In view of the fact that the policy which the Liberal party has endeavored to carry out for the past twelve years has utterly failed, we expected to see a reference in the speech to some new line of action. In this we are sadly disappointed. No legislation is foreshadowed looking to the development at home of several Canadian industries that are now practically in the hands of the United States. The speech gives no indication that the Government intends carrying out the so-called new National Policy which the Globe outlines some time ago. It looks, indeed, as if the Government regards the Washington negotiations in the nature of a lawsuit. The case is still sub judice and will be till August next. Until that time it will be contempt of court, or something similar, for the Government to do anything that would change the status of the parties. If this is the position taken by the Government it will be a most unfortunate thing for Canada. While there may be some uncertainty as to the American attitude on the boundary question there is none whatever in their attitude towards us on reciprocity. The Canadian Government should postpone for a single day the adoption of the new policy towards the United States. If it has any such policy, we are inclined to believe, however, that Sir Wilfrid will continue to play the part of the magnanimous simpson and allow the Americans to get another year's advantage over us.

A VERY STRANGE CASE THIS

The Seventh Day Adventists Call It an Act of Providence—Who Denies It?

ELDER WESTPHAL MET A CAPTAIN

Who Was Interested in the Faith and the Wealthy Captain Handled Over \$400,000.

Battle Creek, Mich., March 16.—Captain Norman, reputed to have several times millionnaire, has given \$400,000 to the Seventh Day Adventists' conference, now in session here. A remarkable incident in connection with the donation is related.

Among those in attendance is Elder F. H. Westphal, who has charge of their mission in Buenos Aires, South America. He came from Southampton in a Hamburg Line boat, and met on board ship Captain Norman. The captain became interested in the Adventist faith, and came to the meeting here.

As a climax he has given the magnificent sum of \$400,000. Of this sum \$200,000 will be given to the General Conference, \$100,000 by the Foreign Missionary Board, and \$100,000 will be distributed in the work in Latin America and the West Indies.

The Adventists believed that the coming of Elder Westphal when he could not afford the expense, and meeting Captain Norman, was an act of providence.

PIANO DEAL IN QUESTION

Yesterday at the County Court, But Judgment Was Reserved—Other Cases Heard.

GERMAN ARMY BILL PASSED

The Little Tangle Was Straightened Out by Means of Good-Natured Compromise.

PEACE EFFECTIVE TO BE REDUCED

But the Arrangement is Flexible, So That Every Necessity Can Be Fully Met.

Berlin, March 16.—When the army bill was taken up in the Reichstag to-day, Dr. Lieber, the Centrist leader, moved the acceptance of the committee's proposal to reduce the peace effective by 7000 men, adding that the House declared its willingness, in the event of the figure granted by the committee proving inadequate, to enter into fresh negotiations with the Government.

The Imperial Chancellor, Prince Hohenzollern, said the Federal Government accepted Dr. Lieber's motion with the reservation that, in conformity with the readiness expressed by the Reichstag to enter into fresh negotiations, the Government would introduce fresh proposals before the expiration of the agreed term.

After further debate the general discussion was closed and the articles of the army bill were debated. Article 1, which the committee did not alter, was adopted.

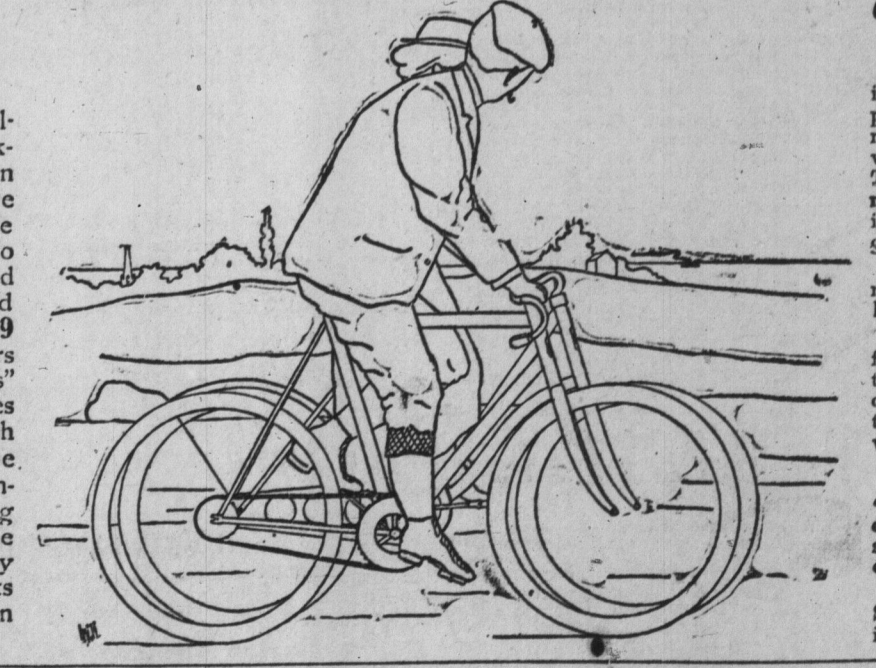
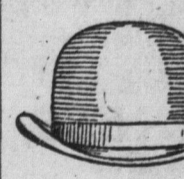

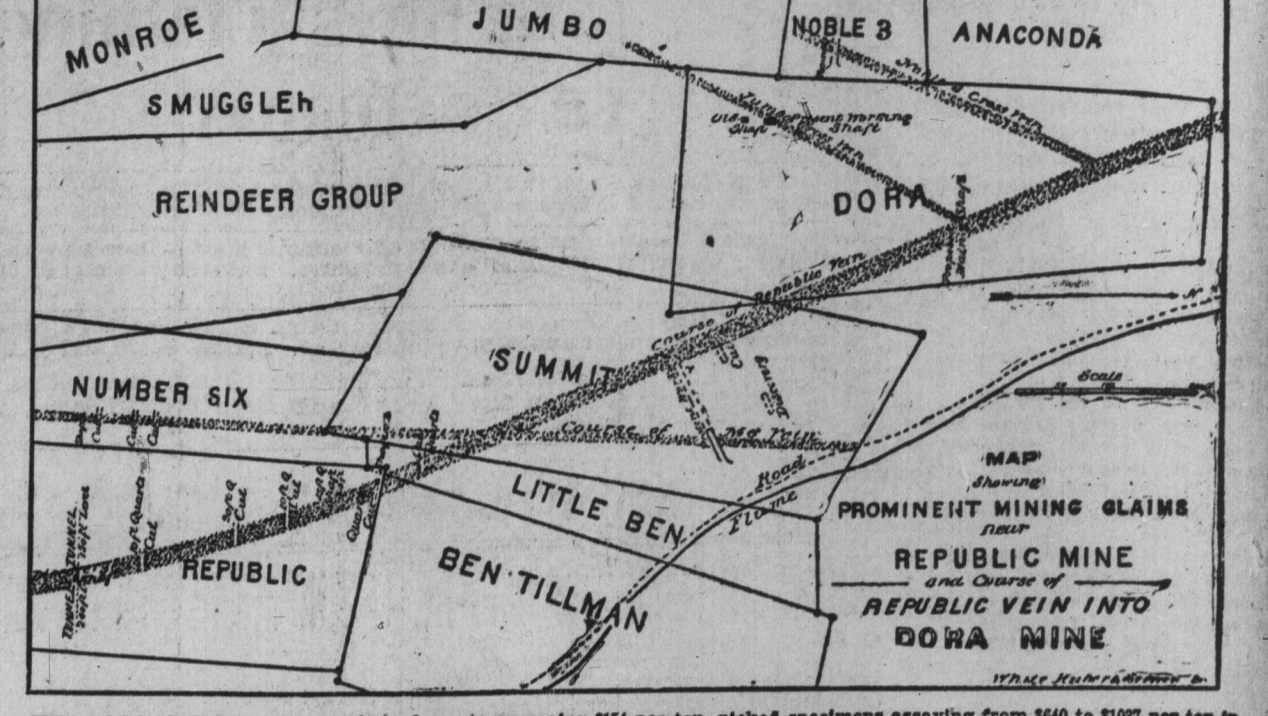
