THE U.S. WANTS TRILL MORE OF OUR TRADE. The importance of Canada's trade has been discussed in the U.S. papers all day long. The topic and they wonder why so little attention has been paid to so important a matter. Our neighbors have suddenly come to realize that Canada's trade is worth more to them than that of all the American republics combined, with China and Japan thrown in. According to The Philadelphia Saturday Evening Post the magnitude of the U.S. does with Canada has been almost without any special effort.

When we are so anxious for markets, why not develop this one? At present the Canadian who wants to buy goods in the U.S. has to pay a duty of three per cent. for not buying in England; yet in spite of that handicap we sell more goods to the U.S. than any other English do. What might we not do if the advantage were on our side? Our neighbors think they have not been doing well with Canada, or at least they seem to imagine that the opening up of negotiations with this country might result in our giving the U.S. something of the same preferential treatment that we accord to the Mother Country. The Post does not seem to think that the U.S. should not be made to make any concession to Canada in order to retain its present trade. On the contrary The Post is counting on getting further concessions from Canada by means of which its trade with the U.S. will be further increased. It makes no reference to the fact that the U.S. tariff is twice as high against Canada as the Canadian tariff is against the products of the U.S. All that the United States can see is to discriminate in favor of Great Britain. "What might we not do if the advantage were on our side?" says The Post. Our neighbors are apparently laboring under the impression that it only requires a little diplomacy on their part to obtain such concessions from Canada as will very largely increase their exports to this country. It would be very much to be regretted that the enormous trade they do with us is only possible because of our absurdly low tariff, and that the first step towards reciprocity would be either the reduction of their tariff to our level or the raising of ours to the level of the United States. The latter is quite certain. The United States very naturally believes that it is in our interests to have a low tariff, just as it is in Great Britain's interest to have no tariff at all. It is quite naturally raising our tariff that Great Britain will adopt a protection tariff. It accepts our tariff as the fixed policy of the country. We ask Sir Wilfrid Laurier if it is the proper thing, if it is good business or good for the people to allow the U.S. to later under this option when it comes again to negotiate a reciprocity treaty with us? If we negotiate with them while our tariff remains as it is we will be obliged to use the threat that we will raise it to their level unless they make concessions. The United States will very naturally regard such a threat in the light of a bluff, or they will tell us to go and carry out our threat, and then return. It is manifestly absurd for Canada to reopen negotiations with the United States until we raise our tariff to their level. We failed when the Joint High Commission met before, and we will most certainly fail to negotiate a favorable treaty when the commission meets again unless in the meantime we strengthen our hands by putting ourselves on an equality with our neighbors. We must be prepared to raise the tariff against other levels of the world, because such is not the case. Not a few leading Liberals have come out in favor of a reciprocity of tariffs between the two countries, and if in politics, statesmen should be guided by the facts, they should unanimously in favor of deciding that the mistake the government made was in giving Great Britain a preference by reducing the tariff in her favor. GAVE LIFE FOR COMPANION. Ezra Pixley Rescues Friend From Blazing Silo, but Perishes Himself. Unable to Reach a Ladder in Time.
