INTRODUCTION.

SHERBROOKE IN 1896.

Its Water Power and Industries.

The City of Sherbrooke, containing a population of 10,000 inhabitants, and called the capital of the Eastern Townships of Canada, is situated at the junction of the river Magog with that of the St. Francis. The Magog has a total fall of 120 feet within the City limits, discharging its water through a narrow gorge or cannon, less than half mile in length. The city is a railway centre served by the Grand Trunk, the Canadian Pacific, the Boston and Maine, and the Quebec Central Railways, by means of which direct communication is established with the cities of Canada, extending from the Atlantic to the Pacific Oceans. At the same time it has direct communication with Portland, Boston and New York, and the great manufacturing cities of New England.

Ses pouvoirs d'eau et ses Industries.

La cité de Sherbrooke, appelée la capitale des Cantons de l'Est, renferme une population de 10,000 habitants et est située au confluent des rivières Magog et St. François. Dans les limites même de la cité, le Magog forme une chute de 120 pieds, en déversant ses eaux à travers une gorge étroite et mesurant moins d'un $\frac{1}{2}$ mille en longueur. La cité est un centre ferroviaire desservi par les lignes du Grand Tronc, du Pacifique Canadien, du Boston & Maine et du Québec Central, grâce auxquelles des communications directes sont établies avec les cités de Montréal et de Québec, ainsi qu'avec toutes les villes du Canada, de l'océan Atlantique à l'océan Pacifique. Elle est de plus en rapport direct avec Portland, Boston et New-York, de même qu'avec tous les grands centres manufacturiers de la Nouvelle-Angleterre.

The principal characteristic of Sherbrooke is its water power, obtained by the development or the natural fall of the river Magog above mentioned and the few following facts will, it is believed, proved both the extent and permanence of this power.

1st. At a distance of seventeen miles west from Sherbrooke, on the main line of the Canadian Pacific Railway, lies the Town of Magog at the outlet or point of egress of the river Magog from Lake Memphremagog. This lake is thirty miles in length and extends into the state of Vermont. It is famous for the beauty of its scenery, but its special feature, the question now under consideration, lies in the fact that it is the head or source of the river Magog. The lake has an area of about thirty-eight square miles and receives the drainage of 600 miles of territory. On its passage from Magog to Sherbrooke, the river passes through another and smaller lake, five miles in length, known by the Indian name of Scaswaninepus, but now generally called little Magog. This small lake has an average breadth of two-thirds of a mile and an area of $3\frac{3}{4}$ square miles. Its outlet is about seven miles from Sherbrooke. In addition to the flow from Lake Memphremagog, the river is fed on its course to Sherbrooke by several small rivers which add materially to its volume, and it is supposed the little lake itself is fed by springs. Thus with a river whose source is only 17 miles distant, with a natural reservoir lying midway between the source and the city, and with a fall of one

Sherbrooke est surtout remarquable par ses pouvoirs d'eau, obtenus au moyen des chutes naturelles de la rivière Magog, dont il vient d'être fait mention. Les faits suivants prouvent d'une manière concluante que ces pouvoirs sont étendus et exempts d'intermittence :

1 A une distance de 17 milles à l'ouest de Sherbrooke, sur la ligne du Pacifique Canadien, se trouve la ville de Magog. Cette dernière est située à l'endroit où le lac Memphremagog se décharge dans la rivière Magog, dont il est la source. Ce lac a 30 milles de longueur et s'étend jusque dans l'Etat du Vermont. Il est célèbre par la beauté de ses sites, mais son côté le plus intéressant en rapport avec la présente question, c'est le fait qu'il constitue la tête et la source de notre rivière Magog. Le lac Memphremagog a une superficie d'environ 38 milles carrés et il reçoit les eaux d'un territoire mesurant 600 milles en superficie. Sur son parcours, depuis la ville de Magog jusqu'à Sherbrooke, la rivière traverse un autre petit lac ayant 5 milles en longueur et appelé autrefois par les Indiens Scaswaninepus, mais généralement appelé aujourd'hui *petit Magog*. Ce petit lac a une largeur moyenne de trois quarts de mille et une surface de $3\frac{3}{4}$ milles carrés. Son embouchure est à 7 milles de Sherbrooke. En outre des flots venant du lac Memphremagog, la rivière reçoit dans sa course jusqu'à Sherbrooke l'eau de plusieurs petites rivières qui ajoutent beaucoup à son volume et on suppose que le petit Magog est lui-même alimenté par des courants souterrains.

hundred and twenty feet within the limits of the city itself, Sherbrooke possesses the basis of a valuable and permanent water power.

2nd. In order to ascertain the extent of this power, several eminent engineers have been consulted, amongst whom may be cited Mr. J. B. Francis, of Lowell, Mass., perhaps the leading hydraulic engineer of New England. After careful enquiry and examination on the spot, Mr. Francis estimated the minimum flow of water in the river, at the driest time, as 408 cubic feet per second. A minimum flow is, of course, the only secure permanent basis on which to estimate the value of a water power, and it is therefore on that basis that the water power of Sherbrooke has been estimated.

3rd. In order to further secure the permanence of the power at Sherbrooke, Little Magog lake has been converted into a distributing reservoir, by the erection of a dam at its outlet supplied with proper gates and appliances. The dam raises the water in the lake four feet above its ordinary level, thus adding greatly to its volume: and the means thus afforded of economizing the water by regulating its use is a main feature in the management of the power. In addition to this, the right has been acquired by the British American Land Co., who have constructed all the works in connection with the proper development of the power, to enter the

Ainsi avec une rivière dont la source n'est qu'à 17 milles de distance, avec un réservoir naturel placé entre cette source et notre cité et avec une chute de 120 pieds dans les limites de la cité même, Sherbrooke possède les éléments de pouvoirs d'eau puissants et permanents.

2 En vue de constater l'importance de ces pouvoirs d'eau, plusieurs ingénieurs renommés ont été consultés. On peut citer entre autres M. J. B. Francis, de Lowell, Mass., qui est probablement le principal ingénieur hydraulique de la Nouvelle-Angleterre. Après examen des lieux et renseignements pris avec soin, M. Francis conclut que la plus faible quantité d'eau coulant dans la rivière, durant les plus grandes sécheresses, était de 408 pieds cubes par seconde. L'écoulement minimum est évidemment la seule base permanente sur laquelle on puisse établir la valeur d'un pouvoir d'eau et c'est sur cette base qu'on a voulu évaluer les pouvoirs d'eau de notre ville.

3 Afin d'assurer une permanence plus complète à ces pouvoirs, à Sherbrooke, le petit lac Magog a été converti en un réservoir distributeur par l'établissement à son embouchure d'un barrage muni de portes et appareils nécessaires. Cette digue fait monter l'eau du lac 4 pieds au-dessus de son niveau naturel et augmente ainsi son volume considérablement. Ce moyen d'économiser l'eau, en régularisant la consommation, forme une partie importante dans le fonctionnement du système.

En outre de ce qui précède, la Compagnie des Terres, qui a fait tous les travaux requis pour déve-

property of the owners of the dam erected at the outlet of Lake Memphremagog, and themselves to open the gate of the said dam at any time, so as to admit the passage of water from the lake to the extent of 24,000 cubic feet of water per minute.

This splendid and unfailing water power is utilized by the following manufactures and industries, viz: the large and extensive Woolen and Worsted Mills of the Paton Manufacturing Co., A. Lomas & Son, manufacturers of Dress Goods, Flannels, etc., the Magog Woolen Mills of Messrs. A. L. Grindrod & Co., the British Am. Land Co.'s Saw Mills, the Sash and Door factories of Lemaire & Low and G. G. Bryant, George Long's Sash and Door and Furniture, the Pumping Station of the Gas and Water Co., the Electric Light Station of the City, Sherbrooke Steam Laundry, The Royal Corset Co., The Macfarlane Milling Co., C. J. & F. W. Odell's Brewery, the Sherbrooke Iron Works, The Saw Works of the Gardner Tool Co., The Sherbrooke Yarn Mills Co., etc., etc.

This completes the actual water powers on the Magog River or derived therefrom, but in addition thereto there is the extra power which runs to waste during the greater part of the year, for the period of low water in the Magog River is short and in some years is non-existent.

lopper la valeur pratique de ces pouvoirs, s'est acquise une servitude sur l'immeuble possédé par les propriétaires de l'écluse érigé à la sortie du lac Memphremagog, cette servitude donnant à la compagnie le droit d'ouvrir elle-même, en aucun temps, les portes de cette écluse, de façon à soutirer l'eau du lac jusqu'à concurrence de 24,000 pieds cubes par minute.

Ce splendide et intarissable pouvoir d'eau est utilisé par les différentes fabriques et industries ci-après énumérées: Les grands moulins de laine et serges de la manufacture Paton & Cie., de A. Lomas & Fils, fabricants d'étoffes à robes, flanelles, etc., de A. L. Grindrod & Cie. appelée "Magog Woolen Mills," les grandes scieries de la Compagnie des Terres, les fabriques de portes et fenêtres de Lemaire & Low et de G. G. Bryant, la fabrique de portes et fenêtres de George Long, les générateurs électriques pour l'éclairage de la ville, la station des pompes de la compagnie de l'Acqueduc, la buanderie à vapeur de Sherbrooke, la compagnie de corsets dite "Royale," les moulins à farine de la compagnie Macfarlane, l'usine dite des Travaux en fer de Sherbrooke, les fabriques de scies de la Gardner Tool Co., à laine filée Sherbrooke Yarn Mills Co., etc., etc.

Ceci complète l'esquisse des pouvoirs d'eau actuels sur la rivière Magog, mais il convient de noter qu'il reste encore une somme considérable de pouvoirs qui se gaspillent en pure perte durant la plus grande partie de l'année, car la période des eaux basses dans cette rivière est toujours courte, et en certaines années, elle

In order to develop this, a canal system has been projected, starting from the mill dam or pond, above the Paton Mill, to be carried down to the river St. Francis, by a series of dams or falls which will enable the water to be used again and again.

The cost of executing the necessary works will be very heavy, and until the prospects of a great increase in the manufacturing industries of Canada become a certainty, it would be unsafe to make the outlay. Sooner or later this great work will be carried out, to the benefit of property holders in the city and, it also may be reasonably hoped, to the benefit of the British American Land Company who are so largely interested in the building up of the city of Sherbrooke.

It should also be noted that the modern application of electricity has rendered the immense water resources of the city available for manufacturing purposes, in localities far distant from the places where formerly the natural fall of the river could only be utilized close to its banks.

One model feature in the industrial development of Sherbrooke by the transmission of motive power from the Central Electric Station on the River Magog, to the extensive flats adjoining the Union Station, on Lansdowne and King Streets, is the erection of a number of factories, among which there are The Jencks Machine Company's large and extensive works, comprising a Machine Shop 300 ft. x 100 ft., a foundry 180 ft. x 80 ft., a

C'est afin de tirer partie de cette situation, qu'on a projeté la création d'un canal depuis le barrage du moulin à scie, ou de l'étang formé au-dessus du bief de la fabrique Paton, jusqu'à la rivière Saint François, au moyen d'une succession de barrages et de chutes qui permettront d'utiliser l'eau à plusieurs reprises. Le coût de ce travail devant être très élevé, aussi longtemps qu'il ne se produira pas d'indices certains de développements considérables dans les intérêts industriels du Canada, il ne serait pas sage de faire cette dépense.

Tôt ou tard ce grand travail s'accomplira, à l'avantage des propriétaires d'immeubles dans Sherbrooke, et, il faut l'espérer, aussi à l'avantage de la compagnie des Terres, qui est si largement intéressée dans le progrès de notre ville, par suite des sommes qu'elle y a investies.

Il doit être aussi remarqué que l'application moderne de l'électricité a rendu utile les immenses pouvoirs d'eau de la cité pour des fins industrielles à de grandes distances des endroits où auparavant la chute naturelle de la rivière ne pouvait être utilisée que près de ses bords.

Un fait remarquable du développement industriel de Sherbrooke par la transmission de la force motrice du dépôt Electrique Central, sur la rivière Magog, aux grands terrains avoisinant la gare Union et les rues Lansdowne et King, est l'érection d'un nombre d'industries parmi lesquelles sont les grandes usines de la Jencks Machine Company, comprenant usine à machines de 300x100 pds., fonderie de 180x80 pds., usine et

Pattern Shop 60 ft. x 40 ft., a Pattern Storage Building 100 ft. x 60 ft. and a Boiler Shop 160 ft. x 55 ft., with fine and large Offices; Richard Smith, manufacturer of paper making and other machinery, uses part of these buildings for his business, also the large Pulp & Saw Mill of Hodge & Walley, W. H. Ross & Co.'s Saw Mills, the Hovey Bros. Packing Co., and Walter Blue & Co., Clothiers, whose large and spacious building is one of the finest in the city.

In fact, almost a new town has sprung up around the Union Railway Station and on King Street, containing these modern factories employing a large number of workmen, and although electric power is not used in all cases, no Sherbrooke Directory would be complete without reference to them.
