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### **MINUTES**

OF THE

### SYNOD OF HAMILTON AND LONDON

OF THE

PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH IN CANADA.

At Stratford, and within Knox Church there, the eighteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety two, at half-past seven o'clock, p.m., which day and place the Synod of Hamilton and London of the Presbyterian Church in Canada met, and after sermon by the Rev. Andrew Tolmie, the retiring Moderator, from 2nd Corinthians, Chap. 5th, verse 21st, was duly constituted by prayer.

The Roll having been called, and the attendance marked, the retiring Moderator briefly addressed the court, thanking the Synod for the honor conferred upon him, and intimating that the first business was the election of a new Moderator.

Nominations having been called for, Mr. George Burson, seconded by Dr. Battisby, moved that the Rev. John Gray, of Windsor, be elected Moderator. In amendment, Mr. John Ross moved, seconded by Mr. F. A. McLennan, that Mr. Hector McQuarrie, of Wingham, be elected Moderator. On the vote being taken, 53 voted for Mr. McQuarrie, and 46 for Mr. Gray. On motion of Dr. Laing, seconded by Mr. Gray, the election of Mr. McQuarrie was made unanimous. The Moderator-elect then took the chair, and thanked the Synod for the honor conferred upon him.

On motion of Mr. Cuthbertson, seaonded by Mr. Musgrave, a cordial vote of thanks was tendered to the retiring Moderator, for his conduct in the chair, and the excellent sermon preached at the opening of Synod.

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the first hour of the Sederunt should be spent in devotional exercises, the Synod to meet for business at 10 a.m.

The Synod then adjourned, to meet to morrow morning for devotional exercises at 9 a.m., and for business at 10 a.m., and was closed, by the Moderator pronouncing the benediction.

#### SECOND SEDERENT.

At Stratford, and within Knox Church there, the nineteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety two years, at 10 a.m.

The Synod met. pursuant to adjournment, when devotional exercises were engaged in from 9 a.m. to 10 a.m., in which the Moderator, and Dr. Laing, Mr. Peter Scott, Mr. John Gray, ministers, and Mr. Geo. Rutherford, elder, took part, after which the Synod was duly constituted.

The minutes of former sederunt were read and sustained.

#### REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON BILLS AND OVERTURES.

Mr. P. Straith presented the first report of the Committee on Bills and Overtures, as to the order of the day. The report was adopted in accordance therewith, and the Synod called for the

The report was read by the Clerk, showing that the sum of \$230.50 had been received from the investments during the year, and paid over to Mr. King. Thanks were tendered the committee for their diligence, and the committee appointed for the ensuing year, as follows: Dr. J. R. Battisby, convener, and Messrs. A McColl and F. H. Larkin, ministers, and Mr. R. Urquhart, elder.

# TRANSFERENCE OF WATERFORD AND WYNDHAM CONGREGATIONS FROM HAMILTON TO PARIS PRESBYTERY.

Extract minutes were read of the Hamilton Presbytery, praying that the congregations of Waterford and Wyndham be transferred from that

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Presbytery to that of Paris. Minutes of the Presbytery of Paris were also read, agreeing to the proposed transference. Mr. W. J. Dey was heard in support of the request of the Hamilton Presbytery, after which the transference was agreed to, and the congregations of Waterford and Wyndham were placed under the care of the Paris Presbytery.

#### TRAFSFERENCE OF THE CONGREGATION OF TEES-WATER FROM BRUCE TO MAITLAND PRESBYTERY.

The Synod considered a petition from Teeswater, transmitted through the Bruce Presbytery. asking that it be transferred from that Presbytery to that of Maitland. Mr. Malcolm was heard by the Synod in support of the petition. It was intimated by the Moderator that the Maitland Presbytery were willing for the transference being made. On motion of Mr. Cuthbertson, the transference was agreed to, and Teeswater placed under the care of the Maitland Presbytery.

### TRANFERENCE OF ALBERTON FROM HAMILTON TO PARIS PRESBYTERY.

There were read extract minutes from the Hamilton Presbytery, asking that the congregation of Alberton be transferred to the Presbytery of Paris, with a view of its being united with the congregation of Onondoga into one pastoral charge. Minutes of Paris Presbytery were also read agreeing to the transfer.

Drs. Laing and McMullen were heard in support of the proposed transference, which, on motion of Mr. Cuthbertson, was agreed to, and Alberton accordingly placed under the care of the Paris Presbyterv.

#### ELDERS' COMMISSIONS.

Dr. McMullen, from the Committee on Elders' Commissons reported, recommended that Mr. John Shipley be placed on the roll of London Presbytery, for Ailsa Craig, in room of Dr. Anderson, ond that Mr. Wm. Telford's name be placed on the roll of Paris Presbytery for Paris congregation, the appointment not having been made before last meeting of Presbytery.

#### COMMITTEE ON SYNOD FINANCES.

Mr. George Rutherford, Treasurer of the Synod, asked the Synod to appoint a small committee to consider the method of collecting the Synod rates. His request was agreed to, and the following committee appointed: Messrs. George Rutherford, convener, and Messrs. E. W. Panton, P. Musgrave, Hector Currie and J. S. Hardie,

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#### AGED AND INFIRM MINISTERS' FUND.

The Rev. Wm. Burns, agent for the Aged and Infirm Ministers' Fundaddressed the Synod, pressing the claims of the regular fund and of the endowment fund, upon the serious attention of the members of the Synod and their congregations. On motion of Mr. W. J. Dey, secanded by Dr. Laing, the following resolution was adopted:—

"That the Synod having heard the statement of the Rev. Wm. Burns, in reference to the Aged and Infirm Ministers Fund, express their gratitude at the progress made in raising an endowment, and commend both the endowment fund, and the regular fund, to the sympathy and liberality of the churches within the bounds."

#### COMMITTEE TO STRIKE STANDING COMMITTEES.

The Moderator nominated the following committee to strike standing committee, and report at an early sederunt: Messrs. John Gray, convener, A. Henderson, (Appin), A. F. Tully, A. McLean, John Eadie, R. Pettigrew, S. W. Fisher, W. Ross and J. C. Tibb, ministers, and Messrs. R. Rutherford, James Shields and George Leys, elders.

#### INDUDTION AT LITTLE CURRENT.

Extract minutes of Bruce Presbytery were read to the effect, that a the induction of W. E. Wallace, at Little Current, on the 26th day o August last, only one minister of the Presbytery was present, the others having been unavoidably absent. Mr. Rennie, the member of the Presbytery, present, conducted the induction service in the circumstances, and the Presbytery now ask the Synod to condone the irregularity. On motion the Presbytery's action in approving of Mr. Rennie's action was sustained.

The hour of adjournment having arrived, the Synod adjourned, to meet again at 2 p.m., and was closed by the Moderator pronouncing the benediction.

#### THIRD SEDERUNT.

At Stratford, and within Knox Church there, the nineteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety two, at 2 p.m.

The Synod met pursuant to adjournment, and was duly constituted by the Moderator, with devotional exercises, Dr. McMullen engaging in prayer.

The minutes of former sederunt were read and sustained.

#### OVERTURE ANENT AUGMENTATION FUND.

There was read an overture, transmitted by the Rev. D. J. Macdonnell, B. D., from the Home Mission Committee, asking the Synod to take into consideration, how the interest of the Augmentation Fund could be more successfully promoted by the oversight of Synodical committees, or otherwise, so that an equitable and economical administration of the fund may still further be secured.

Dr. Cochrane and Dr. Laing were heard in support of the overture. The overture was then received.

After lengthened reasoning, the following resolution, on motion of Dr. Cochrane, seconded by Mr. Straith, was adopted:—The Synod expresses its satisfaction with the results of the Augmentation scheme, in aiding and developing weak congregations, until they have become self-sustaining. It greatly regrets the deficits that have arisen during the last few years, and earnestly commends the scheme anew to the interest and liberality of the church at large. The Synod approves generally, of the suggestion made in the overture for a Synodical Committee, which shall revise the applicacations of Presbyteries for grants for augmentation, before being presented to the General Assembly's Home Mission Committee, and will support any other well deserved measures that the General Assembly in its wisdom may see fit to enact. Further, the Synod is of opinion that the applications for grants from the Home Mission tund, should in like manner be revised by the Synodical Committee, before being transmitted to the General Assembly's Home Mission Committee.

### REFERENCE FROM THE PRESBYTERY OF HAMILTON.

The Synod then proceeded to consider a reference from the Hamilton Presbytery in re Mr. James Watson's complaint. The finding of the Synod last year in this case was as follows:—

"Sustain the dissent and appeal of Mr. Watson, and find that the

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Presbytery of Hamilton acted irregularly (i) in taking action on the memorial of Mr. Henderson complaining of the action of St. Paul's session affecting himself, without recognizing the right to said-session to be heard at the bar of Presbytery in reference to the action complained of; and (2) in setting aside the action of the session, by giving Mr. Henderson a certificate of full standing from date, while professing not to interfere with the session's action. The Synod accordingly remits the case to the Presbytery, with instructions to cancel the certificate given by the Presbytery, and refer the memorialist to the session of St. Paul's, directing said session to hear and consider the professions of penitence made by him before the Presbytery and also before the Synod, that the session may decide whether the evidence of penitence is satisfactory, and if so, give him a certificate accordingly."

At a meeting, held the 15th May, 1891, the Presbytery, after considering the judgment of the Synod, passed the following motion by a vote of 14 to 6: "That inasmuch as the Presbytery finds difficulty in carrying out the decision of the Synod into effect, the matter be referred to next Synod for advice."

Dr. Laing stated the reference. The reference was sustained.

Pending the further discussion of the reference, the hour of adjourment arrived, and the Synod adjourned to meet again at 7.30 p.m., the Moderator pronouncing the benediction.

#### FOURTH SEDERUNT.

At Stratford, and within Knox Church there, the nineteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety two, 7.30 p.m.

The Synod met pursuant to adjounment, and was duly constituted by the Moderator, Mr. John Kay leading the Synod in prayer.

The minutes of last sederunt were read and sustained.

#### REPORT OF STANDING COMMITTEES.

Reports of Standing Committee were called for, and presented as

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follows: That on the state of religion, by Mr. Hector McQuarrie (the Moderator), during the presentation of which, the ex-Moderator, Mr. Tolmie took the chair; that on Sabbath schools, by Mr. J. C. Tibb, in the absence of Mr. T. W. Nisbet, the convener; that on temperance, by Mr. Edward Cockburn, and that on Sabbath observance, by Mr. Peter Mus-

The reports were received. The recommendations of the committee on Sabbath schools were then considered seriatim, and the following adopted:

That the duty and privilege of supporting the Mission schemes

of the Church, be urged upon all our schools.

and. That we deplore the multitude of forms in which vicious literature is circulated, and would urge the strictest oversight in the selection of S. S. Libraries.

3. That we commend the principles of the Assembly's scheme of Higher Religious, Instructions to the favorable attention of our superintendents and teachers.

The recommendation of the committee on Temperance was adopted, and is as follows :-

The committee recommend the Synod to urge upon the members and adherents of the church, that in the exercise of the franchise, they use all due means to secure the election of good men to School Boards, Municipal Councils, the Provincial Legislature, the Dominion Parliament, and other positions of trust, who are known to be in favor of the entire pro-

hibition of the liquor traffic, and will work and vote for that end. The recommendations of the committee on Sabbath Observance, as

follows, were also adopted:

1. That Presbyteries be charged to appoint, along with their other committees, one on Sabbath Observance.

2. That the subject of Sabbath observance be brought definitely be-

fore each Presbytery, at least one a year. 3. That reports from each Presbytery be forwarded to the Synod's

convener on that subject, three weeks before the meeting of Synod.

On motion of Mr. Gray, seconded by Dr. Battisby, the report on the state of religion was adopted; on the motion of Mr. J. C. Tibb, seconded by Mr. Musgrave, the report on Sabbath schools was adopted; on motion of Mr. W. A. McKay, seconded by Mr. Cuthbertson, the report on Temperance was adopted, and on motion of Dr. Cochrane, the report on Sabbath Observance was adopted.

#### STANDING COMMITTEES.

Mr. A. F. Tully, on behalf of the committee appointed to nominate standing committees, reported, and the recommendations of the committee were adopted, as follows:

Sabbath Schools.—Messrs. Jas. Ballantyne, convener, J. A. Anderson and W. J. Dey, ministers, and Messrs. T. W. Nesbit, A. Bartlett, G. Rutherford, and W. N. Hossie, elders, and the conveners of the Presbyterial committees.

Sabbath Observance.—Messrs. John Young, convener, W. J. Clarke, R. W. Leitch and T. Nattrass, ministers, and Messrs. John Charlton, M.P., D. D. Wilson, Robt. Laurie and George Leys, elders, with the conveners of the Presbyterial committees.

#### LICENSING OF STUDENTS.

Mr. Cuthbertson, from the Committee on the Licensing of Students, gave in an interim report recommending that leave be given to the Presbytery of Sarnia, to take on trial for license, Mr. D. Strachan; to the Presbytery of London, to take on trial Messrs. John McNair, Wm. Gauld, J. S. Davidson and W. H. Grant, and to the Presbytery of Chatham, to take on trial for license, Mr. Peter McNab. The recommendations were agreed to.

The hour of adjournment having arrived, the Synod adjourned to meet again at 9 a.m. to-morrow morning, and was closed by the Moderator pronouncing the benediction.

#### FIFTH SEDERUNT.

Knox Church, Stratford, the twentieth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety two, 9 a.m.

The Synod met pursuant to adjournment, and was duly constituted, Mr. Fletcher, at the request of the Moderator, engaging in prayer.

The minutes of former sederunt were read and sustained,

#### LICENSING OF STUDENTS.

Mr. Cuthbertson, from the Committee on Licensing of Students, gave in a concluding report, recommending that leave be given to the Presbytery of Hamilton to take on trials for license Mr. Thomas McLaughlin, and to the Presbytery of Paris, to take on trials for license, Messrs. W. H. Johnston, Daniel Spear, Cunningham Moore and H. McLennan. The recommendations were adopted.

#### REFERENCE FROM HAMILTON PRESBYTERY.

The Synod resumed consideration of the reference from the Hamilton

Presbytery, after lengthened discussion.

Dr. Cochrane moved, seconded by Dr. A. D. McDonald, that a committee be appointed to prepare a deliverance on the reference, with power to call all parties before them, in the hope that a decision may be arrived at, that shall be satisfactory to all parties, and that may end the case. The committee to report at a future sederunt.

The Moderator appointed the following committee: Dr. Proudfoot, Dr. McMullen, Dr. McDonald, Messrs. McKay, McLean and Gray,

ministers, and Messrs. Ross, Bell and Symington, elders.

#### BRANTFORD YOUNG LADIES' COLLEGE.

Dr. Cochrane presented the report of the directors of the Young Ladies' College for the year. The report gave interesting details regarding the increased attendance, the efficiency of the teaching staff, and the results of the examinations. On motion of Mr. E. Cockburn, M.A., seconded by Dr. Mungo Fraser, the following resolution was unanimously adopted, after several members had testified to the excellencies of the College:

Receive the report and express gratification at the largely increased attendance, the growing popularity, and the high state of efficiency of the College, and the excellent character of the work done, during the past

vear.

The Synod also expresses satisfaction, that the college still enjoys the valuable services of Dr. Cochrane as Governor, and that the staff of instructors in every department is so complete. The Synod cordially commends the college to the ministers and congregations of the church, as one in which young ladies find a religious home, and receive a thorough christian training, and appoints the Moderator of Synod, the Rev. Hector McQuarrie, of Wingham, as Visiting Director for the year.

#### NEXT MEETING OF SYNOD.

It was agreed to hold the next meeting of Synod in Knox Church, St. Thomas, on the third Monday of April, 1893, at 7.30 p.m. The Moderator and Clerk were empowered to call the Synod in March, should the

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General Assembly, by appointing a Synodical committee, to revise Home Mission and Augmentation grants, make this necessary.

#### PRESBYTERY RECORDS.

The committees appointed to examine the Presbytery Records of Hamilton, Paris, London, Sarnia, Chatham, Stratford, Huron, Maitland and Bruce, reported the same as carefully and correctly kept, and the Moderator was instructed to attest them, in accordance with said reports.

#### PROPOSED NEW PRESBYTERY OF ALGOMA.

There were read extract minutes of the Presbytery of Maitland, approving of the remit sent down by last General Assembly, regarding the erection of a new Presbytery, to be composed of churches and stations in the districts of Algoma and Nipissing; also minutes of the Presbytery of Bruce, likewise approving of the erection of the Presbytery; also a communication from ministers, missionaries and elders, labouring in the Algoma and Nipissing districts, asking the Synod to forward their petition for the erection of said Presbytery, and to appoint parties to support the same before the General Assembly.

On motion of Dr. Laing the Synod approved of the erection of this new Presbytery, leaving it to the General Assembly to take action as to its

Synodical relations, and other details.

Dr. Laing and Dr. Cochrane were appointed to support the petition.

SYNOD FUND.

Mr. George Rutherford, convener of the Committee on Synod Finances, reported the following recommendations, which after consideration were adopted:

That the Synod Treasurer be instructed to collect annually in future from each Presbytery (through its treasurer) a sum equal to one half cent for each member on the roll, leaving to the Presbytery treasurer the duty of levying this rate on each congregation.

That the sum of \$200 be paid to the Aged and Infirm Ministers' Fund

out of the balance now in the Treasurers hands.

at the General Assembly.

#### AUDITORS' REPORT.

Mr. W. J. Dey, from the Committee to audit the treasurers' books and accounts, reported that they were correctly kept and balanced.

#### OVERTURE FROM LONDON PRESBYTERY.

The Synod took up an overture from the Presbytery of London, asking the General Assembly to rescind its action of last year, permitting students to be licensed and ordained after two years' study in theology,

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deral the and also to rescind or amend the law requiring ministers from other churches to give a year in the mission field, before being eligible for a call.

Mr. A. Henderson, of Appin, supported the overture.

After discussion and the proposing of several motions, it was agreed to consider the two parts of the overture seriatim. On motion by Mr. Henderson, seconded by Mr. D. M. Beattie, the first part of the overture was unanimously adopted.

At this stage the hour of adjournment arrived, and the Synod according adjourned to meet again at 2 p.m.

#### SIXTH SEDERUNT.

Knox Church, Stratford, the twentieth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety two, 2 p.m.

The Synod again met pursuant to adjournment, and after prayer, was duly constituted by the Moderator.

The minutes of last sederunt were read and sustained.

#### OVERTURE FROM LONDON PRESBYTERY.

The Synod proceeded to consider the second part of the overture from London Presbytery, which asks the General Assembly to rescind or amend the law requiring ministers from other churches to give a year in the Mission field, before being eligible for a call. On motion by Dr. Cochrane, this part of the overture was also adopted. Drs. Proudfoot and Laing

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#### THE HAMILTON PRESBYTERY REFERENCE.

Dr. Proudfoot presented the report of the committee on the reference from the Presbytery of Hamilton, which was in the followig terms:

"The Synod regrets that the Presbytery should have difficulty in interpreting the decision of last year. The court now give the following interpretation of the decision in question, viz., that the cancelling of the certificate would have been fulfilled by declaring it cancelled, and making intimation thereof to the parties concerned; and referring the memorialists to the session of St. Paul with a certified extract to that effect, and a copy of the Synod's decision was all that the Presbytery was required to do in order to fulfil the duty laid upon it by the Synod in that particular. The Synod regrets that this course was not taken by the Presbytery. In view, however, of all the circumstances the Synod is of opinion that no good would result from further prosecution of the matter, and, therefore, enjoins all parties "to follows after the things that make for peace," it being understood that Mr. Henderson be regarded as under the care of the session of the church in which he now worships, the session of St. Paul's Church having cordially consented to this in terms of section I4 of the book of forms.

Dr. Proudfoot intimated to the Synod that all parties had acquiesed in this judgment, and moved, seconded by Mr. Musgrave, that this be accepted as the finding of the Synod.

The Synod unanimously adopted the finding, and Dr. Proudfoot, at the request of the Moderator, engaged in prayer.

#### THE CHICAGO EXPOSITION.

Mr. McKibbin brought under the notice of the Synod, the proposal of the American authorities, to open the Chicago Exposition of 1893, on

Sabbath, and proposed the following resolution:

"That this Synod, recognizing its duty and privilege to maintain and defend to the uttermost of its powers the sacredness of the Sabbath, and noting the attitude with respect to the holy days, of parties in power, connected with the preparations for the World's Fair in Chicago, resolves to petition and hereby does petition the Government of our Dominion to firmly oppose and, as far as possible, repress any action done in the name of our country, or any exhibitor therefrom, that would look towards a participation in the threatened desecration of the Lord's Day. This resolution was adopted.


Dr. Cochrane moved that the Moderator and Clerk be instructed to prepare and transmit a petition praying that the Dominion authorities should not permit the opening on Sunday of the Canadian portion of the

Chicago Exposition in 1893. This resolution was also adopted."

#### VOTE OF THANKS.

On motion of Dr. Cochrane, the cordial thanks of the Synod were given to the ministers of Knox Church and St. Andrew's Church, and the office-bearers of Knox Church for the use of their building; to the committee, who had made arrangement for the entertaining of members, for the business of the Synod, and to the railways for reduced rates.

The business being concluded, the Moderator, after devotional exercises, and prayer by the Rev. Andrew Tolmie, ex-Moderator, declared the Synod adjourned, to meet again in Knox Church, St. Thomas, on the third Monday of April, 1893, at 7.30, p.m., and the sederunt was closed with the benediction.
