The amendment and motion being put to the meeting, and a
majority being in favor of the motion.

Mr. Anderson moved, seconded by Mr. Guthrie, that the nomination
of Mr. Caldwell be made unanimous which was accordingly done
with the best of feeling.

The result of the meeting being made known to Mr. Caldwell
the Chairman, he consented to accept of the nomination.

WHEREAS the Municipal Council of the Township of Lanark, in the County Lanark, is desirous of assisting the Ontario and Quebec Railway Company, by way of loaning the same the sum of Twenty thousand Dollars, subject to the conditions and covenants hereinafter mentioned.

And whereas to carry the last recited resolution into effect, it is the wish of the said Municipality to raise the sum of Twenty thousand Dollars in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

And whereas the amount of the whole sale property of the said Municipality, respectively of any future increase of the same, and also irrespective of any income derived from the Township of Lanark, is the Sinking Fund hereinafter mentioned, may part thereof, according to the last recited assessment roll of the said Municipality for the year One thousand Eight hundred and Seventy-two, is Two hundred and Thirty thousand Three hundred and sixty-Two Dollars.

And whereas the said Municipality will require the sum of two thousand Two hundred dollars to be paid annually by Special rate for paying said sum of Twenty thousand dollars, and the said Special rates, to be issued as hereinafter provided.

And whereas the existing debt of the said Municipality is nothing and the interest is nothing.

And whereas for paying the interest and paying a sinking fund for paying the said sum of Twenty Thousand dollars, as hereinbefore mentioned, it is the wish of the said Municipality to assess the lands and the rate of nine and a half mills on the dollar in addition to all other rates to be paid in each year.

And whereas the resolution adopted by the Municipal Council of the Township of Lanark, is as follows:

That a bonus of Twenty Thousand Dollars be granted to the Ontario and Quebec Railway Company, to be used by the said Company to purchase the lands and to pay for such right at the time of application. Fifty cents per acre as above

proposed. Which will be considered by the Council of the said Township of Lanark after one month from the first publication thereof, the date of which publication is the Second day of August, A. D. 1872, and shall be the duty of the Electors of the said Municipality to be taken thereon on

SATURDAY, the 31st day of AUGUST, A. D. 1872, at the hour of Two o'clock in the forenoon, and closing at the hour of Five o'clock in the afternoon of the same day, at the Town Hall, in Middleville, in the Township of Lanark.

And, in order to procure the said sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars as aforesaid, the said Board of the Council of the said Municipality shall issue Debentures of the said sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars, to be paid out of the amount of, or extent of, the said sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars, and the Council of the said Municipality, and be signed by the Mayor and Treasurer thereof, and no one of them shall receive for the same less than one hundred dollars.

That the said Debentures be made payable in Twenty years from the date hereof, at the rate of Six per cent per annum, at the office of the Treasurer of the said Municipality, and shall have coupon attached for the payment of the interest thereon.

That the said Debentures shall bear interest at the rate of Six per cent per annum, which interest shall be payable half-yearly at the office of the Merchant's Bank.
