PERSUADED WITH A GUN!

A London Printer Becomes a Benedict Under Somewhat Peculiar Circumstances—The Bride is Also a London Girl—Interesting Story from the City of the Straits.

Last evening's Detroit News contains the following in regard to two well known London people: "John Pendergast, jun., who was married to Fannie Naven by Justice Phelan last year in London—the girl's brother, Patrick Naven, is a printer, 23 years old, and is the wife of a London girl."

"It was a clear case of force, not going to see a lawyer about having the marriage set aside. It isn't a legal marriage in the first place. Both Bishop Foley and Judge Phelan told me no marriage is valid when a man is frightened into it and a woman is not."

"I never met her brother Pat until he came to my boarding house Saturday afternoon. He was trembling with excitement and introduced himself by pointing to his gun straight at him and telling me to get my hat and coat and come along and marry his sister."

"Bishop Foley wouldn't marry us, as the Sunday News stated, because I said I wasn't willing and that I was being forced. He asked me why I hadn't run away if I didn't want to marry the girl, and I told him I didn't have any reason to do so, as I wasn't to blame if the girl was in trouble. Her brother talked again of shooting when I said this. Bishop Foley told us to go and get our things. Father Savage refused to marry us, and so we went to Judge Phelan's court. The judge joined us on sight. Did I pay him? Well, I should say not! He got my money. Naven gave it to him. I got away from them just after the marriage, and I haven't seen either the girl or her brother since. I don't want to see them. But he is not going to get the drop on me again. I'm carrying my own gun now and I'm prepared for him."

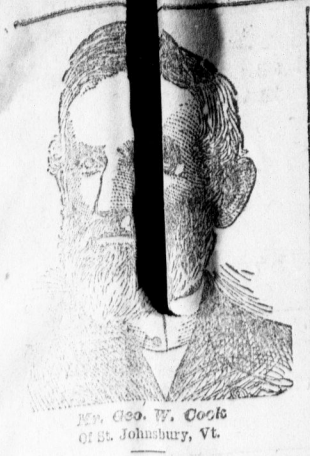
