

does. It is thought that when the trapped men found their ammunition nearly spent and escape impossible, they set fire to the building and committed suicide.

No papers were found throwing light on the operations of the gang.

It is believed that they found refuge in the tenement on Dec. 29, and that they were befriended by neighbors.

It's established that women were associated with the gang's operations. Three women, believed to have been connected with the crimes, are now in custody.
