As to the National Policy.

It is being urged that this tariff policy has placed the manufacturer in the way of becoming rich at the expense of others. That their investments become profitable is a matter for congratulation. Those who risk so largely of their means should have their reward. The protection that ensures their success is a simple matter of justice.

Criminal Records.

The criminal record of the United States for 1911 has just been compiled. In the year there were 8,967 murders. Of this number one murderer out of every 87 suffered either the extreme penalty, death, or life imprisonment.

The United States in 1911 had eight times as many murders in proportion to its population, as had Great Britain. The United States has over 70 murderers per million of population, Great Britain has 9 per million of population, while Canada's figures are double those of Great Britain per million, they are but one-quarter those of the adjoining republic.

The Quebec provincial government will grant the sum of \$10,000, towards the erection of a monument to the memory of Sir George Alleyne Coombs. It will cost \$20,000 and will be unveiled at the Mount Royal in Montreal on Sept. 1, 1912.
