On the 22nd inst. the Rev. Mr. ...
 John Hill's account for repairs to a road scraper. The petition of John Thomson was granted. A By-law to levy the rate for County and Township purposes for the present year, was read a 1st and 2nd time. On motion George McCaig's bill of \$2.50 was ordered to be paid, for burying a dead horse, the property of Jas. Reid, of Esquesing, which died in this Township; and that the Clerk notify Mr. Reid to pay the said sum back to this Council at once. The Clerk was ordered to give notice to the Collector to attend the next meeting of Council and be prepared to enter into bonds for the proper discharge of his duty. Thomas Balintine was on motion appointed Road master in place of John Balintine. A By-law for the purpose of opening up a new road round the hill on the 8th Line on Lot 15 according to the plan of survey laid out by T. W. Cooper, P. L. S., was read a 1st and 2nd time. The Road and Bridge Committee brought in their report, which was, on motion, received. The Reeve, on motion ordered the payment of Jno. S. Walker's bill of \$7 for a road scraper. The Council went into Committee of the whole on By-law No. 10 on rates, Mr. Babour in the chair, and levied the following rates:—six, and seven tenths mills on the \$ for County purposes; one and three-tenths mills on the \$ for Township purposes; four mills on the \$ as a special rate for the Credit Valley Railway. In Council, By-law No. 10 was read a third time and passed. On motion, the Clerk was instructed to get a sufficient number of copies of the Voters' Lists printed in accordance with the Statutes, at the Mercury Office, Guelph. The Council then adjourned, to meet again on Monday, 21st September.
