

Temperance men do not want a third party, if a third party can be avoided, but they want, and they will have, an outspoken prohibition party in the House of Commons.

It has often been said, and with a great deal of force, that the Reform party in the Hominion as a whole, is more in sympathy with prohibition than the Conservative party.
