

Mr. Justice Rose yesterday made an order at the instance of J. Fiskin & Co. to commit to jail Francis S. Smith for contempt in refusing to at-tend for examination as a judgment debtor. A motion was made for an order for the posses-A motion was made for an order for the possession of Barbara Barnard, an infant of 11 years of age. The mother lives at Stratford and was deserted by her husband some years ago. She left one of her children, a little girl, with its grandfather on the husband's side, who now refuses to give it up. The motion was emlarged and notice directed to be served on the official guardian. In the case of Haines v. Hastie, so often reported, a motion was made to strike out part of the statement of defence which alleges that a settlement was arrived at and compensation made by defendant to the plaintiff's father for the seduction and an agreement entered into that no action should be brought against the defendant. The action is for breach of promise of marriage, and the defendant now sets up the agreement and pleads estoppel. The learned judge struck out the part complained of in the defence, holding that the agreement with the father did not preclude the daughter from suing.


