



ANNUAL REPORT,

5th January, 1849.

Pursuant to the Standing Rules of the Society, the Board of Management, elected to superintend and conduct its affairs for the year now on the point of closing, being the thirteenth since it was established, have now to perform the duty of laying before the Members a brief statement of events connected with the Society which have occurred during the past year, as well as of its present situation and prospects.

It affords the Board unfeigned pleasure to announce that the affairs of the Institution continue in the same prosperous state as was reported at the last Annual meeting, and that the state of the funds, and the general harmony existing among the Members, have enabled the Board successfully to carry out the benevolent intention which led to the formation of the Society—the relief of deserving persons of our

origin.

In accordance with the usual practice adopted by their predecessors in office, the Board took immediate measures for the publication, in pamphlet form, of the last Annual Report, which was in a short time placed in the hands of the Members.—This publication, in addition to the report, contained much valuable information in regard to the Society,—a complete list of its members both life and ordinary—obituary notices of deceased members—list of Officers since its commencement, and other matters of an interesting nature.

Referring to the report which has just been alluded to, the Board, on entering upon the duties of their office, found that there were some matters remaining over to be acted upon during the current The first of these, viz., the Incorporation of the Society, was at once taken into consideration, and a resolution was adopted, requesting the Honble. T. C. Aylwin, M.P.P., to advocate the passing of an Act of Incorporation for the Society, in the then Session of the Legislature.—The very short period, however, for which the Parliament was assembled, rendered it impossible to proceed with this much wished-for Act; but the Board confidently anticipate that this measure will be accomplished in the ensuing Session, and the requisite notice that the Society will apply for such Act, has been duly published in the Canada Gazette.

The Board regret that in consequence of the delay thus occasioned, they have been unable to proceed with the other requirements which remained over from last year—the Diploma, Seal and Badge—towards which nothing can be done until the Act

before referred to be obtained.

The Festival of the Society, an event of much importance to its well-being, and one which has on all occasions of a similar nature created much interest in the community generally, was celebrated with all due observance on the 24th April, Faster-Monday. Prayers were read in the Cathedral of this City by the Revd. A. W. Mountain, B. A., Domestic Chaplain to the Lord Bishop, and Secretary to the Church Society, and one of our Chaplains. The Rt Revd. Bishop of Montreal also took a part in the service upon the occasion, and the Sermon was preached by the Revd. Official Mackie, D. D, Senior Chaplain;—an admirable musical service was performed by Mr. Codman, Organist of the Cathedral, assisted by the Ladies and Gentlemen of the

Voluntary Choir, and the collection in aid of the Charitable fund amounted to £26 9. 4.

The Dinner was sumptuously provided by Mr. Russell, at the Albion Hotel, and a striking novelty distinguished the festival, adding much interest to the proceedings of the evening. During its progress a telegraphic message was, at the suggestion of a Member present, despatched to a similar party then dining at Montreal, conveying the congratulations of our Society, to which an Answer was received, in a very short space of time, from our brethren of that City. It will perhaps be considered by some as unnecessary to have mentioned this circumstance, but in future years it may be the means of bringing to the memory of many who were then present, the first year of the establishment and operation, in Canada, of this most wonderful and useful invention.

The Board would here mention that the recurrence of the Anniversaries of our sister-societies of St. Patrick—St. Jean Baptiste, and St. Andrew, at their respective times, afforded opportunities to the Members of the St. George's Society for assembling in considerable number, at the usual place of meeting, with Banners and Insignia, to testify the respect which they have ever entertained for their coadjutors in the work of Charity, and to reciprocate the good feeling evinced towards them in a similar manner at their anniversary.

In the course of the year the Board have to report the following changes in the Articles of the Constitution. The Committee of Management having found that the charitable fund, composed of the interest on the permanent fund and two-thirds of the annual subscriptions, was insufficient for the demands legitimately made upon it, directed their attention thereto, and recommended to the members that the 10th Article of the Constitution be so altered as to

subscriptions to be applied to the Charitable fund, and a resolution has since been adopted at a General meeting, that the payments made by Life-members and donations only, shall be applied to the permanent fund, and that the whole of the other sources of revenue shall be applied to the charitable fund, with a proviso, that should there be any sum exceeding Ten Pounds at the credit of the latter, at the close of the year, it shall be transferred to the former or permanent fund—this change will have the beneficial effect of extending the benevolent operations of the Society, and may probably yet increase the large sum which has accumulated, and which now amounts to £1125—thus forming a sure basis for the future prosperity and stability of the Society.

A resolution has also been duly agreed to, by which the 6th Article of the Constitution has been so amended, as to provide for the election of an

Assistant Secretary.

The Board would here take the opportunity of expressing their regret at the absence from this city of the late Secretary of the Society, J. C. Fisher, LL. D., in consequence of ill-health, and that he has been under the necessity of resigning his office;—the great assistance which Dr. Fisher has afforded to the Society since its commencement, both as an ordinary member, and when occupying several of its highest offices, causes his absence to be a severe and much-felt loss. Since Dr. Fisher's resignation, Mr. W. Bennett, one of the Committee ef Management, has performed the duties of Secretary

It becomes now the pleasing duty of the Board to draw your attention to the assistance which has been rendered to distressed natives of England and Wales, during the past year, under the able superintendence of the Sub-Committee of Charity. number, and the nature of the relief in money, clothes, provisions and passages is much the same as in former years—full details thereof will be found in the books and report of the Charitable Committee now before the meeting, and which will be published for the information of the members generally. The total sum distributed in Charity for the year is £79 1. 0., in addition to which medical aid has been granted by the Physicians of the Society, in all cases where such assistance was needed.

The Board also beg to refer to the Treasurer's report, in which will be found a full and succinct account of the financial affairs of the Society, and much matter of interest connected with his department, prepared by Rob. Symes, Esq.—whose active and long continued services for a series of many years have conferred much benefit on the Society.

The Board would in this place express their regret that from the unprecedented depression in the value of monetary securities, the Society should be temporarily deprived of part of its income arising from the interest on the permanent fund—but they consider that this circumstance should act upon the minds of the members in general, and those who may be in arrears in particular, as a strong reason for paying their subscriptions with promptitude and punctuality.

The following is a statement of the number of members at the present date:

During this period we have to lament the decease

of four members — Messrs. C. M. Brocklesby—Thomas Payne—Henry Muchemore, and Lionel G. Palmer,—forming hardly a proportion of 2 per Cent. on the number of members.

Having thus furnished this short sketch of the proceedings of the Society for the period during which they have held office, the Board now resign the duties with which they have been entrusted into the hands of the Members, trusting that they will use the privilege of electing such successors to them. as will ensure the future well-being of the Society and the carrying into effect such measures as may require attention; and, in conclusion, they would reiterate the appeal which has, on former occasions, been made to our countrymen resident in this City and District, to support an Institution which has arrived at a point of maturity and prosperity, which bids fair to continue and flourish, under God's blessing, for ages, like the Institutions, both political and charitable, of our native land, and which more particularly during the last twelve months, have, in the words lately spoken by our beloved Queen, "been weighed in the balance, and have" not "been found wanting."

The whole nevertheless respectfully submitted.

CONSTITUTION.

ARTICLE III.

RESOLVED, on 5th January, 1847:-

That no candilate for membership shall be ballotted for, more than once between the annual meetings on the 5th January in each year.

ARTICLE X.

RESOLVED, on 26th December, 1848:-

That the 10th Article of the Constitution be amended so that it

shall be as follows:-

The payments made by Life members, and all donations, (unless their application be otherwise specified) shall be invested in a permanent and accumulating fund; the interest arising from which shall be applied, together with the admission fees, and annual subscriptions, to the expenses and charitable purposes of the Society: provided always, that any balance, over and above the sum of Ten pounds, which may remain at the credit of the Charitable fund at the close of each year, shall be transferred to the permanent and accumulating fund, before the accounts of the year are made up.

ARTICLE VI.

RESOLVED, on 26th December, 1848:-

That the sixth Article of the Constitution be so amended as to provide for the election of an Assistant Secretary.
