Wall Street Betting on End of War; Plenty Of Money To Back September 1 as the Date

New York, March 24—Following the publication of cable despatches in which Sir John French predicted an early ending of the war, Wall street has begun to bet on the date when peace would be restored.

Even money was offered that hostilities would cease within four months from date, and odds of eight to five were asked that negotiations would be on by June 30. Plenty of even money was in evidence that the fighting would be ended by September 1.

Betters based their wagers on the belief that Germany's supply of ammunition would fail in the next few months, because of the government's inability to import nitrates and copper. The latter principally owing to the blockade established by the allies.

Geneva, March 24.—The Austrian government now considers war with Italy more than probable. According to despatches from Vienna, a large number of troops have arrived in the Tyrol and Trieste, where defensive works are being constructed.

The Geneva Tribune professes to have received advices from Austria to the effect that the dual monarchy might consider the signing of a separate peace with Russia without consulting Germany, offering to cede to Russia large portions of Galicia.

Amsterdam, March 24.—Germany will launch her great aerial attack against England within two weeks, according to travelers from Berlin. They said that a great fleet of Zeppelins and aeroplanes had been concentrated at Brussels and Cologne, and that these airships probably would set out on Easter Sunday if weather conditions were favorable. A new Zeppelin, the ninth constructed since the war began, has arrived at Cologne, and another will be completed within a few days.

The Zeppelin raids on Paris and Calais, the travelers assert, were only tests to determine whether all were in good condition for the flight to England.

Paris, March 24—Following a terrific artillery duel, during which squadrons of hostile aeroplanes engaged each other high above the roaring guns, another infantry engagement has developed in West Flanders. It is reported from Vomera, east of Nieuport, that French artillery disloged German guns from strong positions. Further south German and French guns were engaged in a severe conflict in the swampy lowlande near Dixmude. Reports from the north indicate that hard fighting is in progress along the Yser river.

Another artillery duel developed on the Aisne river. The French batteries near Soissons having been reinforced during the last few days, were able to silence the German guns in sort order.

There is perhaps no more effective answer to criticisms of the commission There is perhaps no more effective answer to criticisms of the commission plan of government than is found in the leading editorial in this morning's Standard. Dealing with the matter of the civic grants the Standard says:

"While there may be much disappointment that the commissioners yesterday did not decide to restore the grants to worthy organizations which, in the past, have been receiving public support, it must not be forgotten that the reduction in the civic assessment, which gave the commissioners the excuse to eliminate the grants, was made at the request

the commisioners the excuse to eliminate the grants, was made at the request of the citizens themselves and followed considerable agitation in the newspapers. Whether other means could have been found to bring the estimates down to the point where they met the approval of the citizens is a matter for the commissioners. It cannot, in fairness, be forgotten that the people asked for the reduction and the method of bringing it about appeared to be satisfactory at the time. If the desire now is that the grants should be restored to societies and organizations in need of them it should not be more difficult to impress that upon the commissioners than was the case when the lower estimates were asked for. After all, the people are in control and can have what they desire. The Standard effectually disposes of statements made by irresponsible persons to the effect that under the commission plan of government the people are not in control and cannot have what they desire.

LUMBER HAS COMPETITORS We have heard so much in recent years about the rapid depletion of the forests of the United States, and of the

great need of forest conservation, that it seems rather odd to read of an organisation formed to promote the use of wood, and to be told that this is of wood, and to be told that this is necessary in the interests of the lumber industry of the republic. Such an organization has just been formed in Chicago. The chief reason for its formation is the large extent to which other materials are taking the place of lumber for building purposes. The American Lumberman, discussing the subject, says that the industry is suffering because neither the manufacturers nor distributors have carried on a campaign of education to teach the consumers how, when and where wood may best be used, nor have they aggressively met competition; but "have allowed out on its own ground." Their competitors are not only aggressive, but are constantly improving their materials to serve the consumers' need more fully. The plan of the new organization, which will be representative of all branches of the lumber industry and trade, embraces the creation of a central bureau with strong financial backing, to compile of the lumber industry and trade, em-braces the creation of a central bureau with strong financial backing, to compile full and reliable information and dis-seminate the same, and to fight the battle of the lumbermen in keeping wood in the foremost place as a building material. It is proposed to have a manager, a statistician, a construction manager, a statistician, a construction engineer, a publicity expert, and perhaps also two or three consulting engineers. It is proposed to raise \$200,000 per year for five years to finance the scheme, under the direction of the Na-tional Lumber Manufacturers' Associa-
