BIGGEST BIRD IN THE WORLD.

The Ostrich, Whose Feathers Have  
Been Sought For Centuries.

The ostrich is a bird long of leg  
and short of brain. If it ran in a  
straight line, a man would require a  
horse-power automobile to catch it.  
It runs in long curves and men  
on horseback catch it by cutting  
corners. The high cost of living does  
not affect ostriches much. They like rich  
grasses and almost any vegetation,  
but in very hard times eat masts, tin  
cans, parasols and other useless  
things. A full grown ostrich reaches  
the height of six to eight feet, and it  
is the largest bird now extant. The  
ostrich has wings but they are of no  
use in flying. In fact, the ostrich  
is not a flying bird anyway; it belongs  
to the class of running birds. What  
wings it has are used chiefly in vol-  
planing over the Arabian deserts  
when the bird is pursued. Running  
and extending its wings, an ostrich  
is estimated, can cross the sands at  
the rate of 60 miles an hour.
