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STILL FIGHTING LAST NIGHT WITH MILITANT SWABORG GARRISON

Surrender Reported, Though--Story of Mutiny in Fleet

Revolutionists Enact Scenes of Horror--Colonel Bayoneted, Stoned and Drowned--Four Baltic Fleet Ships Reported in Mutiny--Authorities Seem to Have Nipped Trouble at Cronstadt in the Bud.

Viborg, Aug. 1--It is reported here that the Russian flotilla stationed at Hango, Finland, has mutinied, imprisoned the officers and has called to the assistance of the mutineers at Sveaborg.

Helsingfors, Aug. 2--12.50 a. m.--The latest news from the fortress tends to confirm the previous reports that the mutineers have surrendered.
