UNITED STATES.

Stephen Young of Somerset Co., Me., who enlisted in the army in 1861, and was mortally wounded, has just made his appearance among his family.

John Harper, another member of the firm of Harper Brothers, publishers, died in New York, Thursday evening, after a protracted illness, in the seventy-ninth year of his age.

The Collector of Gloucester, Mass., writes a letter to the Bureau of Statistics stating that of seven thousand men employed in that port in fishing, three thousand are from the British Provinces.

Mrs. Louisa Ferguson, with a twenty-month-old child, was arrested in Portland, Me., last week. She had eloped with Edwin Rowe, also a wealthy New York merchant, who is married and the father of six children.

A Government detective has been arrested in Chicago at the instance of a medical man, whose daughter he is charged with having cut off from her home. The young lady was found in a house of ill fame in Chicago.

The magnificent steam-ship *Palmer*, sunk at a wharf in the New York last week. The ship was damaged by her being listed too much for repairs, by which the water ran in where some planks had been stripped off. The damage will be very heavy.

Last week a man of St. Catharines, Ont., was engaged in hauling lime to some builders, when the horses became unmanageable, and driver, vehicle and horses were toppled over a precipice, a distance of 120 feet. The horses were instantly killed, and the man so badly injured that it is impossible he can survive.

An action for breach of promise was commenced in Montreal last week in the name of Miss Minnie Wheeler, of Edinburgh, Scotland, against Mr. Frank O. Wood, advocate, of that city. Damages are asked at \$20,000. The plaintiff alleges that attention was paid her from 1867 to 1871. She claims to be a Montrealese.

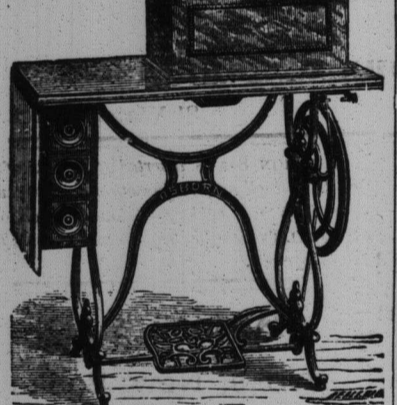
