

Under terms of the agreement referred to in the last Annual Report, this Society, on the first of January 1889, assumed the membership, assets and liabilities of the late Northern and North Western Railways' Sick Benefit Society, the result of which was an immediate addition of 1000 members to the Society. Since that date a still further increase has taken place through extensions in the Company's system and additions to the retired members' list.

The number of policies issued during the year was 4341, and those cancelled 2364, leaving at the 31st of December a total membership of 12,462 as against 10,485 of last year and insured in the several classes as under:—

The result of the Society's operations for the year past as shewn by the statement of the accounts will be found most satisfactory. Allowing for the increase of membership, a reduction has taken place in every item of expenditure; the working expenses being actually less, and are now at the rate of 38 cts. per member as compared with 46 cts. the previous year or 3½ per cent of the Society's income. Whilst the expenditure has been reduced the income from each source has been increased, the net result being a reduction of the debt of the Society from \$10,808.25 to \$616.15.

In consideration of the addition of the Northern and North Western Railways' Sick Benefit Society and the increased membership above referred to, the Grand Trunk Railway Company has added the sum of \$2,500 per annum to its contribution.

A marked improvement has taken place in the Life Insurance business of the Society. Including the Insurances commuted, the number of claims levied for was a little over one per cent of the membership, the premium paid being in the same ratio.

The policy which has been so steadily pursued of weeding out and paying off as rapidly as possible all the aged and decrepit members is already shewing beneficial results in the working of both the Insurance and Provident schemes of the Society.

During the past year 69 members were certified by the Chief Medical Officer unfit for further work; of these 30 were allowed to commute their Insurance, being unable to earn a livelihood in any capacity and 33 were paid off the Sick Fund only, the remaining claims being in course of settlement at the close of the year.

Of the total number of Insurance claims levied for 35 were the result of accidents, 1 suicide and the remaining 98 of natural causes.

The names of the deceased and incurable members and of those paid off the Sick Fund will be found as usual in the appendices as also the tabular form shewing the averages and statistics for the year.

The total number of cases reported on the fund during the

year were 4578 and the number of members who received sick allowance 3615. The average cost of the Society per member for sick allowance and medical attendance has been \$4.98 as compared with \$5.44 of the previous year.

Appended to the report is a complete list of the Society's duly appointed Medical Officers with the Districts or Towns within which their attendance is authorized.

Members are reminded that the Rules of the Society are now being strictly enforced regarding payment of sick allowance only where the District Surgeon is notified at the time the member goes on the fund; also that except for consultations (which must be authorised by the member's superior officer on the spot), and in cases of accident or sudden and dangerous illness (and then only till the District Surgeon can arrive) will the Society be liable for any other accounts for medical attendance.

The Society at the close of this its fifth year is now established on a sound financial basis. There is every reason to hope that not only a continuance of, but even an improvement in, the present condition of affairs may be looked for, and that at no distant date either the original low rate of fees may again be adopted or the Society be enabled to deal in a more generous manner with its aged and decrepit members.

It must be obvious to all that this desirable result will be the more quickly attained if members will personally interest themselves in the welfare of the Society; each one should bear in mind that in his connection therewith he is the guardian of his own interests and not only avoid taxing unnecessarily the funds of the Society himself but also firmly oppose any attempt to do so on the part of others.

This Society is at present undergoing a crucial test through demands made upon it on account of the prevailing epidemic. Probably before its disappearance not less than 25 per cent of the members or say 3000 will have claimed sick allowance for this

disease alone, whilst as many more who have not been on the fund will have received medical attendance and medicines for the same cause.

The experience of the current half year may therefore evidence the wisdom of allowing a fund to accumulate to meet any such extraordinary contingencies in the future.
