LONDON ASTONISHED.

AT THE CANADIAN PACIFIC MAIL RECORD—FAVORABLE COMMENTS ON THE CANADIAN ROUTE. LONDON, September 9.—Londoners this morning have an unusual thing for conversation; it is the wonderful Canadian Pacific mail route and every one is talking about this great event. The "City of New York," with the mails from the far east on board, arrived at Queenstown yesterday and this morning the mails were delivered at the London post office, thus completing the journey between Yokohama and London in under twenty-one days. This record beats all previous efforts and leaves the post office guide badly in the lurch. The official time table gives the China and Japan mails thirty-one days via Vancouver and fifty-three days via the Suez Canal. The fact that the C. P. R. has done the distance in less than half the time required for the Suez Canal route is much commented on, and it is needless to say that the comparison is calculated to raise the Canadian route very much in favor among business men, not to speak of the post office and literary authorities. It is probable that the next step will be to despatch a fast mail from England to the east for the purpose of seeing if the record will hold good both ways. Commenting on the quick transit of the mails, the Times this morning says that this record is pregnant with untold issues for the future of the Empire. At the same time, the paper points out that Canada must not rest until the service from one end of the route to the other is completely under British control.

A DRUNKEN BEAR ON A SPOON KILLS FOUR PERSONS.

The St. Petersburg correspondent of the Daily Chronicle stated that a strange and terrible accident has occurred in the neighborhood of Vilna. A large tame bear, which had been trained by the servants of a country gentleman to drink volky (whisky), entered the village tavern and killed the tavern keeper and three members of his family in a fit of intoxication. The tragedy was brought about by the owner of the tavern, Isaac Rabinovitch, attempted to snatch from the bear a keg of volky, which it had commenced to drink after slaving it with its paws. In the conflict that ensued the infuriated animal hugged to death the tavern keeper, his two sons and daughter. When some persons arrived on the scene with guns they found the intoxicated animal asleep on the floor in a pool of blood and volky surrounded by its four victims. The bear was immediately shot.

EUROPE'S WAR TREMOR.

THE CZAR WATCHED WITH SUSPICION—ITALY HASTENING HER ARMAMENTS. LONDON, Sept. 9. A Berlin despatch says the news that the Czar would avoid meeting the Kaiser on the return of the former from Denmark to St. Petersburg is quoted in confirmation of the views of those who anticipate war. When it was merely rumored that the Czar had assumed

an infinitely attitude not made a difference was placed in the statement, and the official announcement has caused great surprise.

The news that Italy is hastening to supply herself with a vast quantity of rifles does not tend to allay the war feeling, as in the enormous financial condition of that country no expenditure, even for military purposes, would be made except under a conviction of immediate necessity. The Italian fleet also has received instructions to be ready for service upon a call, and many, both officers and men, have been recalled from leave of absence. This action, however, like the notice to the German reserves, may it is suggested, be simply precautionary.

It is rumored that the British fleet now in the Mediterranean will shortly be ordered to Constantinople, as a hint to the Sultan of possible fate of his city should he become too aggressive toward England. It is also stated, in a despatch from Stranabul, that the British fleet, when it arrives, will pass the Dardanelles into the Black Sea and will give notice thereby to Russia that the Black Sea is not a Russian lake.

NEWS FROM EVERYWHERE.

It is estimated that 50,000 people slept on roofs and as many more on the sidewalks and gutters of New York one night last week owing to the insufferably close atmosphere indoors.

MADRID, Sept. 14.—Avalanches from the province of Toledo say two thousand people perished in the terrible floods now devastating that section and an immense amount of property was destroyed. At present it is impossible to send assistance to the survivors, as all road and railway communication with the scene of devastation has been cut off.

NASHVILLE, TENN., Sept. 10.—The three-year-old filly Blentonia, owned by McCurdy E. Hambletonian, owned by Muse and McDaniels of Lewisburg, Tenn., trotted at the Murfreesboro half-mile track yesterday in 2:22. This is the fastest mile ever trotted by a three-year-old.

WILD PRODIGES, which have been altogether unknown in York during the past eight years, are beginning to appear once more. They are also reported at Salisbury and Chelmsford. His name is said to be Albert Heinich, a barber lately arrived at the Falls from New York. The bodies have not yet been found.

NIAGARA FALLS, Ont., Sept. 11.—Shortly after 2 o'clock this afternoon an unknown woman, well dressed and about twenty-five years old, threw herself into the rapids a short distance above Prospect park. A man named Calheim of Philadelphia, sprang into the water and made a brave attempt to save the woman, but she resisted his effort and the struggle only ended when they were near the brink of the falls and Calheim was only able to save himself by grasping some hanging branches.

ATHENS, Sept. 11.—A collision has taken place off Cape Colonna, the most southern point of Attica, between the Italian steamship Taormina, of the Italian Messageries Co., and the Greek steamship Thessalia. The Taormina sank a few minutes after being struck. Most of the passengers were in berths at the time and the latest estimate says a

hundred persons were drowned. The Thessalia is badly damaged forward. By keeping the pumps going the steamer just succeeded in reaching Phaleron.

A large dike has been constructed in California 52 miles long, for carrying timber from the place of felling on the mountains to the plains below. It is made of timber, and is shaped like a Sierra Nevada mountain gives a supply of water to the timber, with fenders down the hill sides. The big dike is carried on trestles, some times 120 ft. high, where they are placed in the gulches in the rocks. It is said by Engineers that 9,000,000 ft. of lumber were used on the construction of the dike.
