This is the man who, without remorse, sealed the fatal edict against the Protestants, which afterwards in 1685, revoked the Edict of Nantes. It was in that year he died. THE AMERICAN PORTION of the above volume comprises 14 MOST INTERESTING OLD MAPS and 112 pages of letterpress to the same.
