
MAKE PLANS TO SALVAGE LUSITANIA SALVAGE LUSITANIA London—Secret plans are be-ing made both in England and the United States to recover the treasure which went down in the Lusitania. It is believed that the money, jewellery and other valuable are worth at least £1,-000,000 and apparently all this vast treasure is free to anyone who can raise it. Even the pos-sibility of saving the Lusitania herself is being considered, but no definite plans for the bold enterprise can be made until divers have examined her con-dition, probably next spring. Even as scrap her value would be very large. The position of the ship, 8 miles off the Old Head of Kinsale, has been char-ted with great exactitude, and she lies 270 feet down. The United States submarine F-4, which sank outside Hono-hulu Harbor on March 25, 1915, was refloated and towed linto harbor on August 29 the same year. She lay on the slope of the ocean bed, her bow 288 feet, be-low the surface and her stern 306 feet. Yet the divers worked in fair comfort at these depths, and thereby established a world's record.
