FIRES CAUSED BY  
SETTLERS' NEGLIGENCE

One Man Gets Hundred and  
Costs For Breach

MUCH DAMAGE BY  
THE FOREST FIRES

Two in the South Are Out—  
One Reported Near

At least two of the three forest fires  
which have been burning in the province  
were caused by negligent settlers  
who set a fire and neglected to  
extinguish it.

Three fires attacked different parts  
of the province. The most serious fire  
is burning near Cochrane, where 30  
square miles were destroyed. There was  
another fire to the southwest of Pin-  
cher, where 15 square miles were  
burned over.

Both of these fires are now out. Not  
much mature timber was destroyed, but  
some considerable growth and  
wonderful loss.

Smith, Table Mountain, pleaded  
guilty to having allowed a fire "under  
his own hand" to burn on land not  
his own property, contrary to section  
(c) of the ordinance for the  
prevention of prairie and forest  
fires.

MR. MINTY STILL  
REFUSES TO TELL

Declines to Say Anything  
About the Canada West  
Construction Company

THE COMMISSION  
DOES NOT INSIST

Mr. Faulkner Gives Evi-  
dence Before the Com-  
mission

Winnipeg, May 2.—At the close of G.  
D. Minty's evidence before the Alberta  
and Great Westways commission yester-  
day afternoon, Mr. Walsh, counsel  
for the Waterways, referring to Mr.  
Minty's refusal to answer certain ques-  
tions, said that he would not give any  
ruling that I can't enforce.

"It seems to me," said Mr. Walsh,  
"this inquiry cannot be as full and  
thorough as it should be without the  
disclosure of everything in connection  
with the Canada West Construction  
company. Mr. Minty is apparently the  
only person in Canada who is in a  
position to give this information."

Mr. Walsh thought there should be  
a ruling given by the commission, and  
then application should be made to the  
proper court to ascertain whether Mr.  
Minty would be upheld in his claim of  
privilege.

"Judge Beck said his personal view  
of the matter was different from that  
of his colleagues. He thought the  
matter should be referred to the  
commission so that the commission  
might make a ruling upon it.

"As was part of your determina-  
tion to leave Edmonton on the night  
of April 13 due to the fact that you  
could claim greater immunity in Win-

structure were allowed to spoulder in  
order that the balance of the grain  
might not be flooded with water.

The company had two men on last  
night, who were apparently sitting  
down watching the blaze, and did not  
even send an alarm in the phone mes-  
sage coming from an outside source.  
Chief Smart stated that he intended  
to seek every portion of the ruins, and  
not take further chances on the bridge  
being called out.

Regina, Sask., May 2.—Between 500  
and 600 union men went out on strike  
this morning. All are connected with  
the building trades; the unions of car-  
penters, plumbers and electricians be-  
ing affected. All plumbing and wiring  
contracts are tied up but the buildings  
are still in progress. There is a large  
supply of non-union carpenters here  
and many of the positions vacated  
by the union men are now filled. The  
contractors refuse to admit the closed  
shop feature, but agree to the union  
scale of wages. This morning the  
plumbers met their employers, and it  
is believed that the men will go back  
to work tomorrow.

CITY WILL VOTE  
TO GIVE \$150,000

Calgary Will Subscribe  
That Amount for Uni-  
versity

RECOMMENDATIONS  
BY BOARD OF TRADE

Province to Be Asked For  
\$150,000 and Dominion  
Also

At a meeting of the council of the  
board of trade held yesterday after-  
noon a resolution was put through  
which will come before the board at  
its regular monthly meeting, asking  
the city of Calgary for a grant of \$150,-  
000, the province of Alberta for \$150,-  
000, and the Dominion government for  
a grant of land, for the Calgary uni-  
versity.

Dr. Blow, who is the father of the  
Calgary university movement, address-  
ed the meeting and urged the work  
that had already been done in inaugu-  
rating the building of such an in-  
stitution.

He was complimented on the able  
manner in which he had organized the  
scheme. The tone of the whole meet-  
ing was not as to whether it would  
endorse the university, but as to how  
much the city should be asked to give  
towards it. The first sum mentioned  
was \$150,000, but one member thought  
this too small and mentioned \$150,-  
000. Another member went one bet-  
ter and stated that he thought as the  
city would derive the greatest benefit from  
such an institution it should be asked  
to contribute \$200,000. However, it was  
thought that perhaps \$150,000 would  
be better for the present.

The meeting then decided that the  
province should be asked to assist and  
included in the resolution a provincial  
grant for \$150,000.

In connection with the request that  
the Dominion government give a grant  
of land, several sections were mention-  
ed, among them being the Sarcee re-  
serve. If the government should throw  
this land open to the city, the right was  
specified in the last mentioned request.

### DEACON WON GAME BUT HE'S NOT SO MANY

The Esquimos Do Not Look to Be As Good as William Carney's Huskies — Poor Game Last Night.

Deacon White's ball team defeated Chan's semi-pros by 9 to 2 last evening in an exhibition game played at Victoria park. Without doubt Chan's bunch put up a poor exhibition of springer lot ball, their errors, home base plays and wild throws being enough to shame even the scorers.

On the other hand, comparing the team as a whole with Calgary, it looks as if Carney's bunch had the drop on the Edmonton team by a good margin, and his new men would have to be major league players to put them on a level with the Calgary players.

Of course, this opinion is based on what was seen last evening, showing which was poor dope to make comparisons. In Samuel, Grady, Dell, McClair and Burstead, Deacon's game in pitcher showing, Samuel, Dell and Barry did the box work, and they show up very strong. Dell has a very fast ball, he can hit something, and more, has good control. When these pitchers get in real shape, they will be the strong part of Deacon's team. 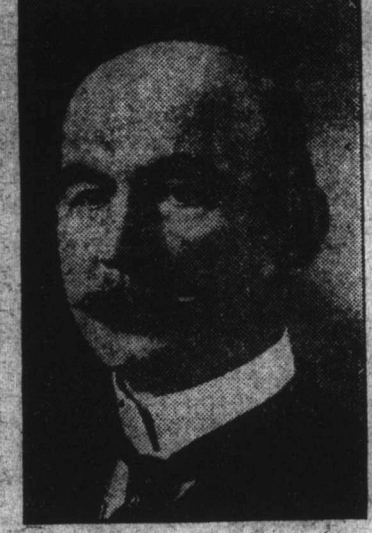

### FRENCH ACTORS TO START TRADE UNION

Threaten to Go On Strike if Demand for Minimum Wage Be Refused

Paris, May 2.—The dramatic and lyric theatre artists—that is to say, actors and singers of the legitimate stage—formed a trade union a few weeks ago, and are agitating. The list of their grievances and the statement of their claims show that the members belong to the somewhat humbler ranks of the profession. As their chief desideratum is a minimum wage of \$40 a month, they can hardly be exactly of the class of Gulliver, for instance, who is said to be receiving \$3000 a week for "Chantecler."

The secretary of the new union explains pathetically that even a minimum wage of \$40 a month could not be counted upon all the year round. Allowance being made for the off-season, it would work out at about 50 cents a day throughout the year.

"I don't think," he adds, "that anyone will consider that to be an exorbitant claim. The public does not know what hard times we have whose duty is to amuse it."

The union is agitating also for the suppression of fines, which are "both humiliating to our self-respect and a cruel drain on our slim purses." The union not only agitates, but threatens. In a statement it says:

"If we do not obtain satisfaction we shall not hesitate to go on strike, and should we do so we would be backed by the Union of Lyric Artists, the Union of Musicians-Artists and the Federation of Musicians-Artists of France, which includes thirty-six branch unions all over the country; the Union of Stage Hands and Carpenters, the Union of Choreographic Artists, the Union of Small Employees of Theatres and Music Halls, and the Union of Theatre Electricians, which would all stand solid for us."

"We are well aware that the granting of our claims would increase managerial expenses. But why not make up the difference out of the authors' rights and the poor law tax on theatres? The former is at present 12 per cent, and the latter 10 per cent, on the gross takings. Both figures are exceedingly high. Authors and managers alike could afford to give up a little to ensure us our minimum of \$40 a month."

### NEW BRUNSWICK MAY PUT UP THE BARRIER

Will Likely Follow the Example of  
Quebec on its Pulpwood Policy

Washington, April 30.—It seems altogether probable that the province of New Brunswick will follow the lead of Quebec in prohibiting the exportation of pulpwood. A telegram has been received at the state department from United States Consul Moorehead at St. John, N. B., stating that the provincial parliament had passed a resolution prohibiting the manufacture of pulpwood within the province and has appointed a committee to investigate and report at the meeting of the parliament in February next.

This action is assumed to mean that New Brunswick desires to manufacture her own wood pulp rather than to permit the exportation of the wood for manufacture in the United States. If such a law is passed it will further complicate the wood pulp situation and is likely to have a tendency to increase the price of print paper in the United States.

### Manitoba Election in July

Winnipeg, May 1.—The Manitoba general elections will be held in July at an early date as possible following the period required for revising the lists.

### Victory for Liberals

Madrid, May 2.—The general elections will be held on May 8. One hundred and fourteen deputies whose candidates are uncontested are officially declared elected, and will not figure in the voting. They comprise 49 Liberals, 34 Conservatives, 3 Republicans, 3 Carlists and five of other parties.

### ONTARIO APPLES BROUGHT HERE IN COLD STORAGE

A Very Successful Experiment Made  
by the Department of Agriculture

The first experiment in shipping Ontario apples in cold storage from Ontario to Western Canada was made last week and was so successful that it will be continued. A car load of

apples were despatched from cold storage in London, by J. S. Riddock, cold storage commissioner, to M. P. McNish of Calgary, fruit inspector of this city. The apples were in cold storage until they reached Calgary, and arrived in practically perfect condition. The car load was quickly sold to a local grocery, and are being retailed rapidly throughout the city. The apples are high grade and are quite as good as though just picked from the trees. The experiment was

so satisfactory that succeeding cars will be brought in.

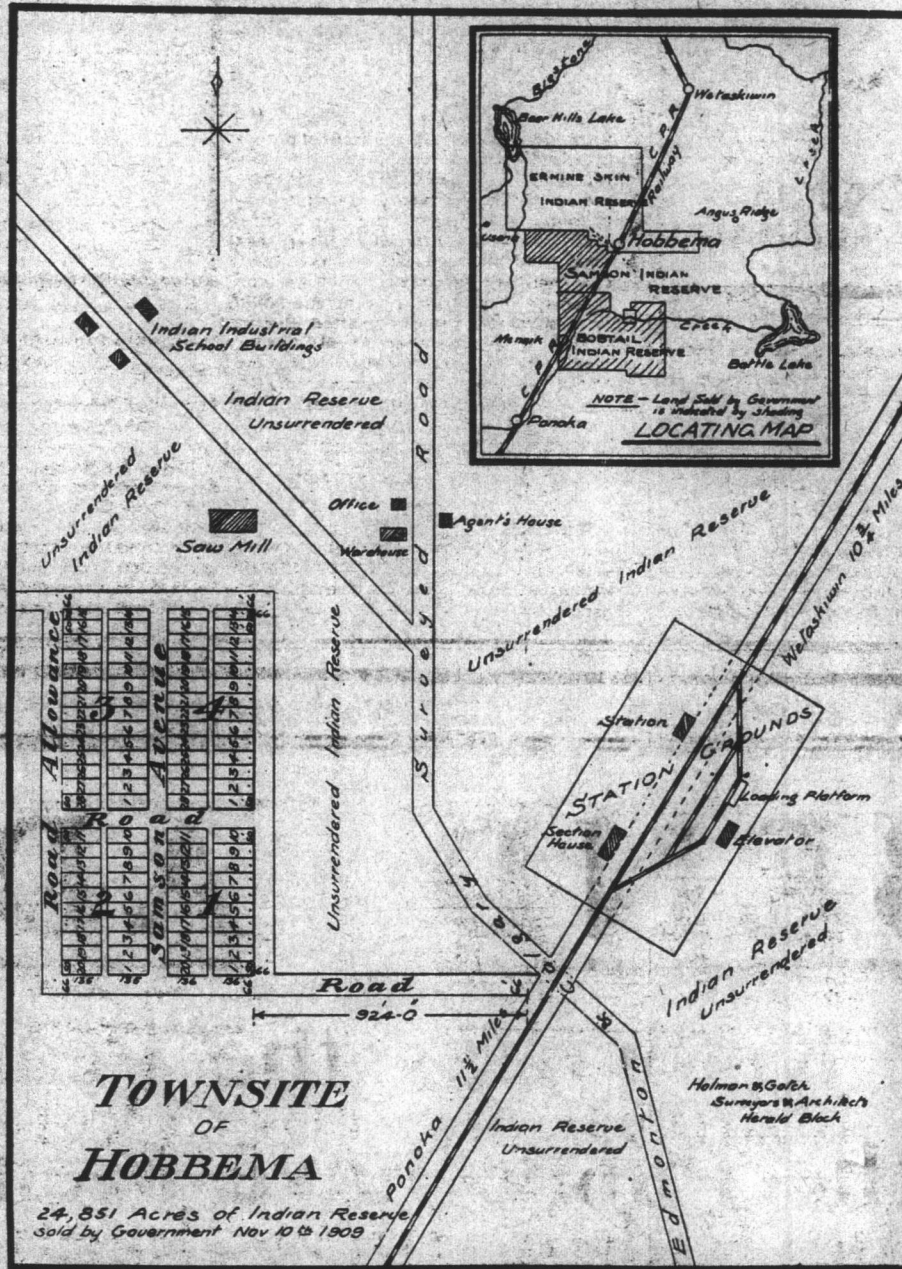
