EIGHTH YEAR. AMENDING THE LAND BILL.

THE QUESTION OF DEALING WITH THE STATE OF ONTARIO. The Proposal of the Parliament that the Courts have Power to Dismiss Actions does not meet with the Government's approval.

LONDON, Aug. 5.—In the House of Commons this evening Mr. Balour announced that he did not expect to be required to make any communication to Parliament regarding the proposed amendment of the Land Bill.

UPON motion of Mr. Balour a resolution was passed that the Government should first explain the alterations they intended to make in dealing with arrears. The bill as it stood afforded no protection to tenants who had not been notified of their arrears.

Mr. Balour said that the Government was willing to accept any workable proposal for dealing with arrears, provided that landlords were not to be allowed to take advantage of the law.

ED. ROGERS' SCHEME ENDORSED BY THREE ENGINEERS.

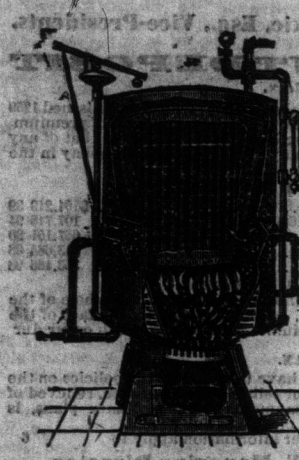
