In the early years of the American Republic, when the spirit of the revolution still walked the earth and engaged in political struggles, two great parties divided the people...

But as we said before the State Rights men have been beaten, and to-day every sensible American admits that there must be a strong central government. State politics have become of small account.

In many matters we are similarly misled to our neighbors and our history on many questions is but a repetition of theirs. We have adopted the federal system as they have adopted it only we have federal powers much more pronounced than did they.

On the province side are all the apologists of the Northwest rebellion, the men who prove or wish to be proved, and who have opposed National Policy whether it be the building of a Transcontinental Railway or the creation of a Canadian Senate.

The men and the heroes of the Quebec Resolutions, now being elected to the Legislature, are at this party. Mr. Mevius is the champion of it. The Globe is the organ of it. The Reform party, now nothing but a rump, is the refuge of all this mass of provincial and clerical opposition.

And our advice to the Young Men of Canada is to keep clear of the poisonous teachings of these men. They have been defeated in the United States. They made their last great stand in the law for the right of each state to allow slavery to exist within its own limits.

Two things also led the young men remember: (1) that a triumph of Mr. Mevius in his House counts for little, and (2) Mr. Mevius, supported as he is, is not a match for the provincialists arrayed against him.

Where the Combine Twyneth. Canadian editors and politicians fancy that Canada's only refuge from such a fate is to be sought by those comparatively little combines and trusts against which they justly inveigh.
