EMMA GETS \$1200

Conclusion of the West End Scandal Trial.

MR. LOUNT'S TOUCHING ADDRESS.

I took the jury 1-1/2 hours to arrive at a verdict. A category of questions submitted to the jury was answered in the affirmative. The jury returned a verdict for \$1200. The defendant, Emma Taylor, was found guilty of the charge of seduction. The trial was held at the Court House, Toronto, Ontario, Canada.

The Taylor-Johnson seduction case was concluded on Saturday night, the jury bringing in a verdict for the plaintiff for \$1200. The witness examined was George Irving, an employee of the Mass Manufacturing Company, and a witness for the defence. The jury was told to show that Emma Taylor was not a virtuous woman outside of the alleged intimacy with the defendant. He testified that one night in June, 1908, he saw a young man and a woman he recognized as Emma Taylor in a compromising position in Bellwood Park. In cross-examination, he admitted that he watched them in order that he could himself take advantage of the woman.

Miss Anna Morrison in her evidence denied the statements made by Emma Taylor with regard to the occurrence said to have taken place the night defendant returned from Whittier.
