LARGE EXPENDITURES THIS YEAR IN BUILDING UP TORONTO.

THE PRISON COMMISSION.

Juvenile Vice and Crime—Importation of Pauper Children is an Undertaking. The report of the commissioners appointed to collect information regarding prisons, houses of correction, reformatories, industrial schools, etc., with a view of ascertaining any practical improvements which may be made in the methods of dealing with criminal classes so far as the subject is within the jurisdiction of the Ontario Government, has been presented to the House. It is a volume of 215 pages, exclusive of the reports by the individual members of the commission and the evidence taken. The recommendations are framed in an endeavor to avoid all unwarrantable theories, or being confined to the most advanced and at the same time the most practical methods.

THE PRISON COMMISSION.

With regard to juvenile vice and crime, the report recommends that the compulsory school laws be rigorously but judiciously enforced, that further measures be passed to secure a proper education for children employed in factories, etc., and that the appointment of transit officers to enforce the law be made compulsory. It recommends that the establishment of one or more industrial schools in every city and large town be made compulsory, and that the same be used for the control and instruction during the day of disorderly or neglected children and for carrying out the provisions of a simple kind for the industrial training of these classes. Cities, towns and villages should be empowered to pass by-laws forbidding the running at large of boys and girls in the streets after dark as is now done in the County of Waterloo, and in order to furnish amusement and exercise chiefly for such children, suitable play grounds, with gymnasium attached, be provided. Recreational grounds should be rigorously inspected. The importation of children from the reformatory, refuge, etc., of the Old West into the reformatory, should be regarded with much danger and calculated to swell the ranks of criminals, they therefore, recommended that precautions be taken to prevent the importation of children of parents who are criminals, or of children who have spent their whole lives in an atmosphere of vice and crime.

THE PRISON COMMISSION.

With regard to the drainage of the Government out of the funds derived from fees for provincial licenses should increase in the reformatories for inmates. Such reformatories should be near a city and have attached a sufficient area for farming and market gardening, and should be furnished with means for suitable industrial occupations. The first term of the inmates should not be longer than six months, the second for not less than one year and the third for two years. If the families of any inmates be wholly dependent on them for support, a portion of the cost of their maintenance should be paid them. If after a third commitment to an industrial reformatory for an inmate a demand be again made, he should then be sentenced to the Central Prison for the full term authorized by law.

THE PRISON COMMISSION.

Receipts from the Horse Show. The recent horse show given by W. D. Grand in aid of the Children's Fresh Air Fund netted that worthy charity \$300. The total receipts amounted to \$438.37 and all that Mr. Grand expended in expenses was \$138.37, although the arrangements cost in the neighborhood of \$1300. The cost of the show was \$1172 and in the evening \$164. In connection with the success both of the show and the subsequent sale, he promises to repeat the show next April on a larger scale, and it is safe to say that the only trouble will be in securing a building large enough to hold the crowd that will attend.

Worship in the Pavilion.


