He was born in Portage du Fort, Province of Que-bec, about 45 years ago, but his business career really began in the West, where he early became identified with the Dominic Building and Loan Association of To-ronto, of which he was manager. In 1882. he went to Winnipeg, and there organized the Western Loan and Trust Company, and he has been connected with that con-cern ever since. 


