

#### REPORT

OF THE

FOR THE YEAR 1882-83.

In looking back along the way the Lord hath led them through another year, the Committee of the Ladies' Bible Association find ample cause for thanksgiving, in that the good hand of their God has been upon them, and has continued to them means to carry on their work.

While great results are not visible, yet from time to time it has been found that a little seed sown in faith has borne fruit in an unexpected manner. The day of small things which God does not despise is often the forerunner of events more glorious than our feeble faith had ventured to anticipate. Your Committee are therefore encouraged not to relax in their efforts to disseminate the Word of God, but to be ever ready to enter into every open door.

The Association still employs Miss Latimer as their Bible Woman. She is a tried and faithful worker, whose reports, rendered every month, tell of much patient labor and zeal in carrying God's Word from house to house. She obtains a willing hearing for the gracious message the Word reveals, and considering that the field has been so often gone over, sells a good many Bibles and Testaments.

But it has been well said that "it is not by arithmetical progression that we can calculate the benefit resulting from such an instrumentality as this The mind soars on the wings of faith and love into a more spiritual atmosphere, and grasping the many promises which God's Word unfolds, rejoices in the assurance that the bread thus cast upon the waters shall be found after many days."

The Association continues to aid in carrying on the Mothers' Meetings, which are held every Friday afternoon, and this year gave a grant of thirty dollars towards its funds. The average attendance at those meetings is thirty, the largest about forty.

The good accomplished through these means animates the Committee with the hope that their labor has not been in vain, and they trust that the seed sown here may be blessed by the great Head of the Church, and bring forth fruit an hundred fold.

Experience proves that abundant sowing is followed by abundant reaping. Your Committee would therefore appeal to those who have aided them hitherto that they continue and extend their support and sympathy, that increased opportunity may be given to scatter wide the Book which warns the careless, enlightens the ignorant, quickens the dead in trespasses and sins, and imparts comfort and strength to all believers.
