PENSION INCREASE MAY BE 25 PER CENT. Ottawa, Sept. 20.—The increase in pensions of Canadian soldiers and ther dependents will be at least 25 per cent, according to authorative information. A new pension bill had been prepared this session, but so much time was taken up with the military service and other mea-sures that it was not proceeded with. Instead, a general increase on a per-centage basis is intended. The exact amount is not determined, but, as stat-ed, it will be at least 25 per cent, if not more. The conditions and qualifications as they now exist, will continue until there is a new act.

tor, in Flanders, continues most intense, but there has been no infantry movement in force. An attack on a larger scale than the usual daily raids probably is imminent.

Berlin apparently is much exercised over the ever-increasing volume of shell from the British big guns. From the Houtholst Wood northeast of Ypres, to the River Lys, on the Belgo-French border, Berlin reports, the British fire has been destructive. Field Marshal Haig's artillery increased its volume of fire to drumfire several times.

As on the front in Flanders and Artols, there has been no major operation on the French portion of the western front. At several points from the Aisne Valley to Lorraine, the French have carried out raids into the German de fenses. Here, too, the expenditure of ammunition is great, especially on the Aisne front and northeast of Verdun.

The Italians have been more active on the Trentino front, harrassing the enemy with raids and strong artillery fire. In a forward movement near Carzano, in the Sugana Valley , east of Trent, the Italians captured 200 prisoners. Austro-Hungarian attacks on the Bainsizza Plateau continue, but General Cadorna's men have held them for no gains.

Attacking the Austro-German defenses south of Grozechti, near Ocna, the Roumanians captured a height. Berlin reports that the Roumanians, at first successful, were driven from the positions, suffering casualties and losing prisoners.
