## The Thirteenth Annual Report.

With the close of the Thirteenth year of the Toronto Public Library devolves upon me the duty of reporting its progress during the year 1896. I am pleased to be able to state that the growing interest of the citizens of Toronto in the Library, and their appreciation of its usefulness are marked by an increase of the book circulation; the total circulation during the year 1896 having reached 535,959, a figure greater than in any previous year, and exceeding that of 1895 by 30,365. This increase has been contributed to by all departments of the Library. The efforts of the Board to bring to the notice of the citizens the opportunities the Library affords of obtaining the very best class of reading matter and books of reference, has no doubt contributed to this increase in circulation.

The constant additions to the books of the Circulating Library having interfered with the practical working of the indicator, formerly in use, it was found necessary to remove it and fill the space it occupied with shelves on which new books, as received, are so arranged as to be readily seen and their titles read from the Public Delivery Room. The change has given general satisfaction.

The question of improving the lighting of the Central Library building came before the Board during the year. After a careful and thorough consideration, Manhattan Arc lamps:

were substituted for the system of lighting previously in use in the Reading Room of the Reference Department, the Chief Librarian's office, the Delivery and Receiving Room of the Circulating Department, the Reading Room, the entrance to the Circulating Department and the stairway and lobby leading to the Reading Room, at an estimated saving of some hundreds of of dollars in the annual cost of lighting. So far the change has been fully justified by the marked improvement in the quality of the lighting, as well as by the saving of expense.

With a view to encouraging the use of the Reference Library, which now contains so many useful and valuable works, the teachers of some of the City Schools were, some months ago, invited to bring their classes in the evenings to the Library building, so that both teachers and pupils might avail themselves of the opportunities for study and research afforded by this Department. This move has been only experimental, but should the experiment prove successful, the Reference Department will gradually be brought into more general use by the public.

In September the Chief Librarian attended the annual meeting of The American Library Association held in Cleveland, Ohio, and on his return made an interesting report of the work done at the meeting. One of the chief advantages to be derived from attendance at these meetings is, that the Library profits by the experiments made by other Libraries in the direction of perfecting or improving Public Library methods.

The Reading Room for the unemployed was again opened during the winter months, and a large number of working men availed themselves of its privileges.

The books purchased during the year included many

valuable additions both to the Circulating and Reference Departments.

The accounts of the Board have been audited, and statements of the moneys received and expended during the year are appended.

It is a matter of regret that the providing of books necessary for maintaining in a state of efficiency a Library of the character and importance of this, has been much interfered with by the want of funds for that purpose. I regret, too, to have to refer to the causes which have brought about this state of affairs, a state of affairs, which, if permitted to continue, may result in very seriously impeding the work the Library is intended to do, and detract from its usefulness. annual report of the Board, reference was made to the action of the City Council of 1895 in regard to providing funds for the Library. It becomes necessary again to refer to this. Early in . 1896 this Board prepared and forwarded to the City Council their estimates of the moneys required for Library purposes. In the preparation of these estimates, the Board had in view the need of economizing in every way consistent with the proper maintenance of the Library and its four branches. "The Public Libraries Act, 1895," provides that the Municipal Council, in addition to all other rates and assessments levied and assessed for Municipal purposes, "shall levy and assess" a special annual rate sufficient to furnish the amount estimated by the Board to be necessary for Library purposes, but not exceeding one-quarter of one mill in the dollar upon the assessed value of all ratable real and personal property in the Municipality. The amount of the Board's estimates for 1896 was less than one-quarter of one mill in the dollar upon such assessed value. The City Board of Control reduced the Board's estimates by striking off \$2,500

notwithstanding that, before the reduction was made, a deputation from this Board appeared before the Board of Control and protested against the proposed reduction, at the same time drawing attention to the provisions of "The Public Libraries Act, 1895." The City Council afterwards confirmed this action of the Board of Control.

This Board found itself in the position of being unable to maintain properly the Central Library and its four branches on this reduced appropriation, and it became necessary to economize in the only manner in which economy was possible, without impairing the efficiency of the Central Library. Accordingly, at a meeting held on July 7th, the Board passed the following resolution: "That the Northern Branch Library in St. "Paul's Hall be closed on and after the 30th September, 1896, "and that the Western Branch Library in St. Andrew's Market "be closed on and after the 31st December, 1896, and that "the books in the said Northern and Western Branches be "transferred to the Dundas Street and Eastern Branches "after the said Northern and Western Branches shall have "been closed."

The City Council did not favor this action, and an intimation was received that the Council would further consider the matter. Pending this consideration, a resolution was passed postponing the time for the closing of the Northern Branch to December 31st, 1896, and a deputation from this Board again appeared before the Board of Control in October, and again went into a discussion of the grant, but that Board refused to restore any part of the amount which had been previously struck off the estimates. On December 14th, however, the City Council again had the matter under consideration, and, a short time afterwards, a communication was received from the City Clerk stating that

the City Council had adopted the following resolution: "That "in view of the fact that the Council deducted the sum of \$2,500 "from the estimates of the Public Library Board, and said Board "having decided that this will necessitate the closing of two of "their Branch Libraries; be it resolved, that the sum of \$1,500 "be reinstated of the \$2,500 deducted, so that the Branch "Libraries in St. Andrew's Market and St. Paul's Hall may "be retained for the benefit of the ratepayers, who, from "returns sent in, have taken the fullest advantage of said "Branches."

The Board soon after made application to the City Treasurer for this sum, but payment of one-half the amount, being rent of the halls for 1895, was refused, on the ground that no funds had been provided out of which to make the payment.

So far as can be learned, the desire of the citizens, especially those living in the districts convenient to the Branch Libraries, is that the branches be kept open and continued, and it would appear that the members of the City Council entertain the same view.

The Library Board has been prepared and willing to meet the wishes of the people in this respect, and the proposed closing of two of the Branch Libraries is the result solely of the want of necessary funds, caused by the City Council's reduction of the estimates.

It is not my desire or intention to comment further on this matter, or to speculate upon the probable results of the occurrences above reported, beyond remarking, that, if the Central Library and all its branches are to be continued on the reduced appropriation, the amount of money necessary for the purchase of books will be greatly encroached upon. It is to be hoped,

however, that the Board of Management of the coming year will take some decisive action to maintain its rights, and so avert the danger which threatens the Library through this enforced curtailment of its book supply.

I am glad to be able to report that the Librarian and Secretary and assistants have continued to perform their duties with care and to the satisfaction of the Board.
