SAFETY APPLIANCES GREATLY NEEDED

Facts About the Death Rate on Railroads Which Could be Reduced but for Cupidity.

About 1800 tons effort to secure a national law which would require the general use of automatic couplers and power brakes on the railroads of the United States came into prominence. The air brake had been proven a success, and was in common use on some of the western railroads.

The general or universal adoption of these devices in a comparatively short time would, of course, require the expenditure of large sums of money and necessitate throwing away the work of the old type. As a rule new cars were being equipped with the new devices, and it was argued by some that, in time, all rolling stock would be so equipped.

The problem resolved itself into the question of whether or not the standard conditions justified forcing the railway companies to expend the sums necessary to a uniform adoption of safety appliances. The cost could be determined with approximate accuracy, and the question was, what will be gained that will justify this expenditure?

During the year ending June 30, 1893, the year in which the law was passed, 433 men were killed and 11,277 men were injured while coupling or uncoupling cars. The effect of the law is made apparent when we compare with that fearful record the figures for the first year following the introduction of the automatic coupler, and in which 143 men were killed and 2,113 were injured while coupling or uncoupling cars.

The question of just what constitutes interstate commerce on a railroad has been a matter of long and bitter controversy. It is a matter which has been argued in the courts, and all cars with which they might be associated or brought in contact shall be equipped with automatic couplers. Such a requirement was enacted by the last session of Congress, and became effective September 1st, 1903.

The humanitarian and good results which have been, and are to be, secured from this law are monuments to the effectiveness of organized effort, properly applied. If there had not been an organization among the men there would have been no law. If there had not been no brotherhood whose membership were united in these efforts, neither the Hon. S. C. Tamm, who did great and philanthropic work in this connection, nor any others whose voices were heard in demand for legislative action which would stop the awful slaughter among the railway employees, would have found the ready response which they did find.
