FOR FREE COINAGE.

The Conference of the American Bi-metallic League at Washington.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 17.—The policy to be pursued in advancing the principles of bi-metalism was outlined at today's session of the American Bi-metallic League conference.

Speakers were made by several congressmen and by delegates from various states. The following declaration was adopted: A year has passed since congress was called together in extra session to repeal the silver purchase law and complete the establishment of the gold standard.

The conference further recommends that the mining and agricultural states combine to make the silver question the supreme issue in all elections, agree to stand together and to send no representatives to the house or to the senate who cannot be relied upon to subordinate every party consideration to the cause of bi-metalism.

It was decided to appoint a committee of five to arrange for the continuation and extension of the present campaign.

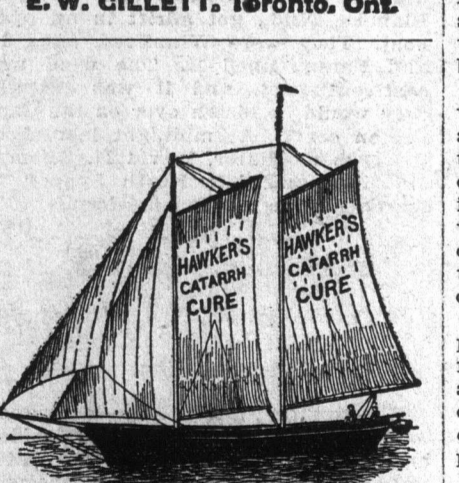

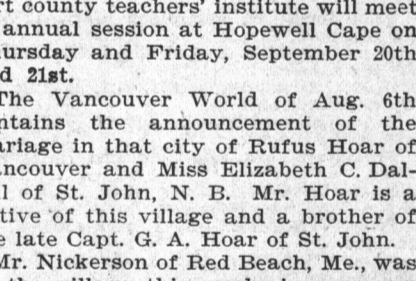
Sussex, Aug. 19.—Last night the residence of David A. Wright of Havelock, Kings Co., was broken into and a quantity of clothing and household effects carried away.
