One of the saddest occurrences that has happened for years was made known here Monday afternoon, when a despatch was received announcing the death of Capt. Gregory, who was a brother of George F. and Albert J. Gregory of this city, had followed the sea for 25 years and was washed overboard within a few hours completion of his last voyage. His death took place on the 18th, and the ship reached New York on the following day.

The American Board of Foreign Missions having received tidings of a terrible famine in Asia Minor, bordering on the Mediterranean, and embracing the ancient cities of Tarsus and Adana. The state of affairs is so deplorable as to render an appeal to the benevolent public an immediate necessity. The harvest time has just passed, but a few fields of grain will be cut in all the plains, ordinarily so fertile, save in a few fields artificially watered. Eighty thousand inhabitants are destitute and starve unless help is brought from without.

During a game of base ball at Office, Marlborough, one day last week, Smith Billing of Fredericton and Joseph Thompson of St. John, started to catch a fly. Both ran at full speed, and as they were watching the ball, neither saw the other. They came together with such force, that both were hurled into the air. Billing's front bone was crushed and he had a terrible gash on the side of his head. Thompson's face was washed and his nose and jaw-bone were broken. Billing was taken to the Salem hospital and Thompson was carried home. It is feared that they will die.

After spending a very pleasant time with their parents and friends they dispersed on Monday morning, 13th, to their respective homes, leaving pleasant memories that will not soon be forgotten.

One of the brightest old ladies in Great Village, Londonderry, Colchester Co., N. S., is Mrs. Matthew Peppard, who was 95 years old on Saturday, June 4th. She is hale, hearty and remarkably well preserved for her years, and is still a fine looking woman, but her mind is clear and is as bright as many who are two score years younger. On her 94th birthday she was busy continually with her knitting, and when eight o'clock she had knit one pair of stockings. She has been blessed with ten children two by her first husband, and eight by her second husband, all of whom are still alive, along with numerous grandchildren and four great-grandchildren. One of her daughters living with her is 72 years old. Mrs. Peppard has been a widow 32 years.
