C A P. CIII.

An Act for allowing, until the First Day of August One thousand eight hundred and seven, the Importation of certain Fish from Newfoundland, and the Coast of Labrador, and for granting a Bounty [16th Fuly 1806.] thereon.

HEREAS it is expedient to permit the Importation of Salted and Pickled Salmon and Salted Dry Cod Fifh from the Island of Newfoundland and the Coaft of Labrador into the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and to allow on fuch Importation a Bounty on every Quintal or Hundred Weight of fuch Fish to imported; be it therefore enacted, by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Confent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this prefent Parliament affembled, and by the Authority of Pickled Salthe fame, That from and after the paffing of this AQ, it shall be lawful Cod Fish may to import from the Island of Newfoundland, or the Coast of Labrador, be imported into the faid United Kingdom, any Salted or Pickled Salmon, or Salted from New-foundland, or Dry Cod Fish, having been taken and cured at the faid Places, or either the Coaft of of them, by British Subjects, any Law, Custom, or Ulage, to the con-intotheUnited trary notwithstanding.

Bounty to be under the Management of the Com-miffioners of Cultoms, &c.

II. And be it further enacted, That upon the Importation of fuch Fills into the faid United Kingdom, there shall be paid and allowed to the Importer or Proprietor thereof, a Bounty of Three Shillings for every Quintal or Hundred Weight of fuch Fish, and so in Proportion for any greater or lefs Quantity; which Bounty thall be paid and allowed upon the following Conditions, that is to fay, upon the Master and Mate of ditions herein every Ship or Veffel in which fuch Fish shall be imported, making Oath the Port of Importation before the Collector or other principal Officer of the Customs in Great Britain, or of the Revenue in Ireland, that all the faid Fish imported in the faid Ship or Vessel was taken and cured by His Majeity's Subjects carrying on the Fifhery at the Island of Newfoundiand, or on the Coalt of Labrador, as the Cafe may be, and upon fuch Fifth being duly entered and regularly landed in the Prefence of the proper Officer or Officers appointed for that Purpole.

> III. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That Salted Cod Fish and Salmon which shall have been imported under the Authority of this Act, and on which the Bounty above mentioned shall have been paid as aforefaid, may neverthelefs be exported without being fubject to the Re-payment of the faid Bounty, any Thing in this Act, or any other Law or Statute to the contrary thereof in anywife notwithstanding.

IV. And be it further enacted, That fuch Bounty shall be under the Management of the respective Commissioners of the Cultoms in England and Scotland, in Great Britain, and the Commissioners of the Revenue in Ireland refrectively, and shall be paid by the faid Collector, or other principal Officer, before whom fuch Oath is directed to be taken as aforefaid, out of any Fund under the Management of the faid Commissioners respectively: Provided always, that before any Bounty shall be paid upon any such Fish as aforesaid, the same shall be examined by Two indifferent and difinterested Perfons, experienced in the Nature of fuch Fifh, appointed for that Purpole, at the Port of Importation, with the Approbation of the faid Commissioners respectively, which Perfons fo appointed, together with the proper Officer or Officers who shall attend the Examination of the faid Fifh, shall declare upon their corporal Oaths, to be administered by the Collector or other principal Officer at . the Port of Importation, whether the faid Fifh, or any Part thereof, is or is not merchantable; and in cafe any fuch Fish, or any Part thereof, shall not be merchantable, no Bounty shall be allowed or paid on the Importation thereof.

V. Provided allo, and be it further enacted, That nothing in this Act contained shall extend, or be deemed or construed to extend, to vary, alter, or repeal, any Act or Acts of Parliament made for the Security of the Duties upon Salt, but that every Act or Acts of Parliament relating to fuch Duties shall remain in force in like Manner to all Intents and Purpoles as if this Act had not been made.

VI. Provided alfo, and be it further enacted, That no Bounty shall be paid or allowed on the Importation of any fuch Fish, for or upon any greater Quantity or Weight thereof than is of shall be contained and expressed in the Manifest required by Law, upon the Importation thereof into any Port of the United Kingdom.

VII. And whereas it is expedient that the Bounty hereby granted to A like Bounty the Importers and Proprietors of Fish landed in the United Kingdom of 3 s. for every Quintal should be extended to Fish landed in the Islands of Guernfey and Jerfsy, or Cwr. cf be it therefore enacted, That upon the importation of the like Sort of uch Fish, to be paid on the Fifh into the Islands of Guernfey and Jerfey respectively, from the Island Importation of Newfoundland and the Coaft of Labrador, there shall be paid and thereof into allowed to the Importer or Proprietor thereof the like Bounty of Three Jeriey, on the Shillings for every Quintal or Hundred Weight of fuch Fith, and fo in Proportion for any greater or lefs Quantity, which Bounty shall be paid tioned being upon the following Conditions; that is to fay, upon the Master and complied with. Mate of every Ship or Veffel in which fuch Fifh fhall be imported making Oath at the Port or Place of Importation before the proper Officer of the Cuftoms there (which Oath he is hereby authorized to administer) that all the faid Fish imported in the faid Ship or Vessel was cured by His Majesty's Subjects, carrying on the Fishery at Newfoundland and the Coaft of Labrador, as the Cafe may be, and has not fince been landed in any Port or Place in Great Britain or Ireland, for the Purpole of receiving the Bounty payable by this Act upon such Fish when imported into Great Britain or Ireland respectively, and also upon fuch Fish being examined by Two indifferent and difinterested Persons refiding in the faid Islands respectively, experienced in the Nature of such Fish, appointed for that Purpole by the Commissioners of His Majelty's Customs for the Time being in England, which Perfons fo appointed shall declare upon their corporal Oaths, to be administered by such proper Officer as afore-faid, whether the faid Fish, or any Part thereof, is or is not merchantable, and in cafe any fuch Fish, or any Part thereof, shall, upon fuch Declaration, appear for to be merchantables By By Ship shall be allowed or paid on the Importation thereof.

VIII. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That Salted Cod Such Salted Fish and Salmon, upon which the Bounty above-mentioned shall have Cod and Salbeen paid as aforefaid, may neverthelefs be exported without being exported fubject to the Repayment of the faid Bounty, any Thing in this or in without Reany other Act to the contrary in anywile notwithstanding.

X. And be it further enacted, That in cafe any Perfons shall, in any Penalty on Manner whatever, fraudulently obtain any Bounty upon the Importation Perfons frau-

taining the Bounty to forfeit 100%. of fuch Fifh, or fhall enter any fuch Fifh for the Purpole of obtaining any Bounty thereon, contrary to the true Intent and Meaning of this Act, then and in every fuch Cale the Perfon or Perfons to offending, fhall, for each and every fuch Offence, forfeit the Sum of One hundred Pounds.

Bounty to be paid as other Bounties on British Fifterics: XI. And be it further enacted, That the faid Bounty upon the Importation of fuch Fifh fhall be paid and allowed in fuch and the like Manner, and under fuch and the like Conditions, Rules, Regulations, Reftrictions, Penalties, and Forfeitures, as any Bounties on the Importation of the Produce of the Britill Fifheries may, by any Act or Acts of Parliament now in force, be paid and allowed, to far as the fame are applicable thereto, and the feveral Claufes, Powers, and Directions, therein contained, fhall, and are hereby directed and declared to extend to, and fhall be reflectively applied, practifed, and put in Execution, for or in refpect of the Bounty hereby allowed, as far as the fame are applicable thereto, in as full and ample a Manner, to all Intents and Purpofes whatever, as if all and every the faid Claufes, Provisions, Powers, Directions, Penalties, and Forfeitures, were particularly repeated and reenacted in the Body of this prefent Act.

Act to continue in force till Aug. 1, 1807. XII. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall continue in force until the First Day of August One thousand eight hundred and seven.
