The Rev. Canon Macnab has taken up his residence in the see House for the remainder of the summer months.

A lady member of the congregation has offered to pay the cost of a stall in the Cathedral to be a memorial of her late father and his family: This is an excellent example and might well be followed by others.

We think that it was with a general feeling of regret on the part of the congregation that the term of the Rev. Harold McCausland's charge came to an end on Sunday, 3 oth June Coming to us as locum tencus for only a short period, it was hardly to be expected that he would have identified himself very closely with the congregation and its interests, and it therefore give us great pleasure to record that he gave his arvices with as great care and assiduity as if his appointment had been a permanent one

This prize was given for the express purpose of encouraging the old style of elegant penmanship. which has for some years past had very little attention in our schools. It was won by Charles Flint, whose specimen of writing was exceptionally good, followed closely by Bryan Chadwick, and the work of Allan Dixon, Murray Sinclair, Ronald Hilton, and Harry Sewell being highly commended.

Before separating, Mr. Mockridge was called upon to receive a little parting gift, suitably inseribed as a memento of the school, from the boys of the senior French class, who have been under his tuition. Mr. Mockridge is leaving to take up work in Japan.
