THE FIRST AUTHOR was an ANCIENT GREEK ECCLESIASTIC who became METROPOLITAN of BULGARIA, as stated on the title, and who died about 1112. The second author was one of the most ILLUSTRIOUS GREEK FATHERS and PILLARS of the EARLY CHURCH who attended the Council of Nice, A.D., 325, and who was persecuted and exiled by Julian.
