

Mysterious Occurrence at Sea. There is a little vessel in Gibraltar whose resent history is most mysterious. The Mary Celeste, an American brigan-tine, was tallen in with by a British ves-sel 400 miles east of the Azores, and brought by her to Gibraltar on Deer. 13. When discovered she was under foremast, staysait and gib, and under this light canvass she had been pursuing her way for ten days, without a scoll on board, the last entry on the ship's log being on November 24th. No other papers were found on board; manifest, bills of lading, every document which could have thrown any light 'upon the his-tory of the dereliet, had been remov-ed. The cargo, consisting of barrels of spirits, is untouched, with the excep-tion of one eask which had started. There are no signs of the vossel having failed to detect any injury abeve water or below it. A harmonium in the cap-tain's cabin, and the music books, are all in their places untouched by salt water. A little phial of oil was still standing by a sewing machine, and a reel of cotton and thimble has not yet rolied off the table. 
