A CRUSADE AGAINST DOGS.

The Threatened Strike War.

The American railway strike has developed the fact that the United States is reeling on a volcano.

It needs very little to cause a rupture that will shake the constitution of the Republic to its foundations.

President Debs is no doubt aware of the situation when he says that the first shot fired by the national soldiers will be a signal for a war.

The working men of the United States are prepared to rebel against the constituted authority and to destroy the whole constitutional fabric.

Such is the import of President Debs' proclamation. We cannot imagine a much more serious condition of affairs than that which will ensue if the United States to-day. The rise and development of the Coxy movement is explainable and natural. The men who composed it were a shiftless lot, men who were out of work principally because they refused to work.

They were for the most part worthless tramps. We can readily understand irresponsible men of this stamp being prepared to defy the constitutional authority. But the men who are on the brink of declaring civil war to-day are of a different breed.

They form the bulk of the population of the cities. They are workmen with families, workmen who are not out of employment, and who have no particular specific grance against their employers. These men are prepared to initiate a war against the constitution - for what reason? Because the Pullman company will not agree to give their workmen what the latter demand. What makes the situation particularly serious is the fact that it is workmen in employment who are defying the law and the fact that they are defying it because a company merely persists in asserting its legal rights.

The government cannot afford to connive at such a rupture of the law as President Debs says exists among the strikers. The authorities at Washington are alive to the gravity of the situation, and they are prepared to take rigorous steps against the trouble-makers. If they do not nip the trouble in its inception they will have more serious state of affairs to face in the future.

The Men Must Give the Coercers.

It is said that Mr. Morrison, manager of the bandmen who were to give free concerts in the parks for the benefit of the unemployed, has decided to abandon the concerts unless the people patronize these seats better than they have done so far. Mr. Morrison has decided to do nothing of the kind. He entered into a specific agreement with the city and the city ought to insist on his carrying out his part of the contract. If the scheme had been successful beyond the anticipations of the men who were to give the concerts, they would have agreed to hand over a percentage of receipts to the city. On the other hand, if the project doesn't meet with success, the city should allow the men to plead the parks for the privilege of giving their concerts. It is not the concern of the city to see that we are given. We can easily dispense with them. But we think it desirable to include the idea that the city is not to be turned into a host of burden to carry the misdeeds of the men who choose to unload on it. Moreover, the men who entered into the arrangement with the city cannot honorably withdraw from it. For the reason that the enforcement of the agreement will tend to make the citizen respect himself and his word the better we think it should be enforced.

Foot Laws Are Killing Toronto.

Inspector Archibald was under the impression that the running of buses on Sunday was illegal, how comes it that he has delayed nearly a year before taking respect himself and his word the better we think it should be enforced.

In regard to Sunday buses the inspector is powerless to interfere. The magistrate as much as decided this the other day when the case was up. If we can run buses we can run cars, and before long we will have them, too. Toronto has suffered long enough from clerical interference in the affairs of everyday life. Citizens are asking why Toronto doesn't get ahead. One reason is because of the fool laws that handicap the city. On Saturday our own citizens leave their cars in droves to escape the dull monotony that hampers the place on Sunday, while people from other places avoid us on the same day because of the operation of blue laws which they are unaccustomed to.

Municipal Insurance.

The reason why The World favors the city in the one hand and objects to the municipality going into the insurance business on the other hand is this: In regard to the former we have precedent to guide us, and we are undertaking a work that is analogous to other branches of city business. The insurance proposal is something new. The promoters do not cite places where the scheme has been in operation. Aid Lamb asks us to take a lot for granted, and we do not see our way clear to doing so. The tendency of the times is towards municipal ownership of various services, but the proposition is one of gradual development. We should first assume those services that we know we are capable of conducting, and then we will be prepared to branch out into more intricate kind, such as Aid Lamb's insurance project.

Giving Away Valuable Island Lots.

We notice application is being made for lease of a water lot just south of the one granted the Toronto Ferry Company, and for which merely a nominal rent was asked. The Property Commission is being asked to look into the value of these so-called water lots before they grant any more. By using a sand pump these lots can be filled in very cheaply.

The city will lose many acres of the most valuable property on the coast if these water lots are given away from the lagoon at Hanlan's Point. Why should the city part with the property anyway? It will get substantially nothing in return for its concession.

Many Topics Discussed by the Property Commission - Decided Public Bathing - Licensed Barkeepers and Centre Island Improvement.

Ald. Crawford presided at the meeting of the Property Commission yesterday.

Permission was granted Superintendent McKim of the Newboys' Home to locate a camp on the eastern portion of the island for the use of the inmates for six weeks.

The application of Mrs. Maggie Hanlan and John Hanlan for lease of a water lot at the island, immediately south of the lot leased to the Toronto Ferry Company, was deferred till next meeting.

Resolved on Public Baths.

There was a long discussion on complaints that boys and young men bathe in a state of nudity at all hours on almost all points of the water-front, especially on the strip of sandbar from Hanlan's Point, which is near passing steamships. The Chief of Police is awaiting instructions from the committee.

Commissioner Coatsworth suggested a fence be erected at this spot, which would obviate all complaints. He had in mind a fence of iron pipes and chain-link fencing to be erected at the old pumping station at Parkdale. He found between 50 and 60 young men bathing there, every day, from 10 o'clock to 10 o'clock in the afternoon.

The commissioner and the chairman thought that considerable latitude should be allowed; but the latter said that the limits of decency were not overstepped. They each had been fond of getting into the water when they had a chance, when young Chief Grout will be notified of this effect.

The Permitted Area Enclosed.

It was also decided to erect the suggested fence on the island sandbar and to permit bathing on the lake front from Waverley road to the city limits in the east, and 700 yards west of Bathurst and 600 yards east of Dufferin street.
