Hon. Mr. Turner is of the opinion that steps should be taken at once by the Dominion Government to ascertain the proper boundary between Columbia and Alaska, for if something is not done in the near future this country. runs a great risk of losing a heavy block of territory, that was stipulated as being part of British North America at the time of the treaty between Great Britain and Russia in 1825. As it now stands, the British Columbia Premier declares, the Americans have issued maps in which this territory, which in reality belongs to Canada, is repre-sented as forming a part of the dissented as forming a part of the district of Alaska. and even some of our own maps have taken it for granted that the American claim is a valid one, and the disputed territory is placed in Alaska. The Premier adds that there are a great many people now living in British Columbia who could give most valuable information on the boundary question, and there would be very little difficulty in making clear the weakness of the American claim.






