

### STANDING RULES

FOR THE

### CONSTITUTION AND GOVERNMENT

OF THE

# Newfoundland Church Society.

#### NAME.

1.—The name of this Society shall be "THE NEW-FOUNDLAND CHURCH SOCIETY."

#### OBJECTS.

2.—The objects of this Society shall be, (1) to contribute towards the maintenance of the Clergy and Licensed Lay-Readers, (2) to assist in the erection, enlargement, or repairs of Churches, Parsonages, or School Rooms, and in the purchase of Land for Glebe or other Church purposes, (3) to provide for sale a supply of Bibles. Prayer-Books, School-Books, and other Religious Books and Tracts, (4) to assist in creating and sustaining a Special Fund for the Endowment and Support of the Theological College in St. John's, and (5) to create and maintain a separate Fund for assisting the Widows and Children of deceased Clergymen of this Diocese.

#### MEMBERS.

3.—The Members of this Society shall be, (1) all persons who shall have paid to their Clergyman or the Treasurer the two preceding years the annual

sum of ten shillings for the objects of the Society; and (2) all Clergymen who shall have officiated in Newfoundland or Labrador the two preceding years with the Bishop's license.

4.—All Members shall have power to vote at the

annual and other general meetings.

#### OFFICERS.

5.—The Officers of this Society shall be (1) the Lord Bishop of the Diocese, President; (2) the Venerable the Archdeacon and the Rural Denns, Vice-Presidents; (3) a Treasurer; and (4) a Secretary; the last two to be chosen by the members of the Society at the annual general meeting; but in case of resignation of office, or removal, of either Secretary or Treasurer, during the interval between two Annual Meetings, the Committee shall appoint a person to act in either case, until the next Annual Meeting.

MANAGERS.

6.—The Committee of Management shall consist of the officers of the Society, and certain Lay-Members, elected as Representatives in each of the Deaneries; viz., four elected by Members of the Society resident in the Deanery of Avalon; three by Members resident in the Deanery of Conception Bay; two by Members resident in the Deanery of Trinity Bay; two by Members resident in the Deanery of Bonavista Bay; three by Members resident in the Deanery of Notre-Dame Bay; two by Members resident in the Deanery of Placentia Bay; and two by Members resident in the Deanery of Fortune Bay.

7.—The election of Representatives shall be as follows:—On some day in Easter Week, in the year 1859, and in every succeeding fourth year, a Meeting of the Members resident in each mission, shall be convened by the Clergyman in charge at some convaient hour and place, of which notice shall be given (with the Bishop's consent) in each Church in the

Mission, on some Sunday in the previous month; at which Meeting the Clergymau or in his absence, some other person then to be chosen by the Members shall preside, and the Members present shall vote seriatim for the prescribed number of Representatives.

8.—When the voting (which may be continued, if necessary six hours, but not longer) is completed, the presiding Officer in each Mission shall report the result to the Rural Dean, and the persons who have obtained a majority of votes in the Deanery, shall be elected Representatives; provided that every person to be a member of the Committee must be a Communicant of the Church of England.

9.—The Rural Dean shall report the result of the election in his Deanery to the Secretary in St. John's, the first convenient opportunity.

10.—The new Representatives shall be convened by the Secretary at the Michaelmas Quarterly Meeting; until which time the former Representatives shall continue in office.

11.—As often as it shall become necessary, from the death, absence from the Colony, resignation, disqualification, or refusal to serve, of any of the Representatives, to appoint another or others in their place, a special meeting of the Members, in the Deanery where the vacancy has arisen, shall (as soon as the Rural Dean, or, in his absence, the Clergyman next senior in standing in the Diocese may in his discretion appoint) be convened in like manner as the Easter meeting, when the required Representative or Representatives shall in like manner be elected.

12.—The President, or a Vice President, and six other Members of the Committee shall be competent to manage the business at every meeting duly convened.

13.—All Clergymen of the Diocese holding the Bishop's license, shall be ex officio honorary Members of the Committee with the right of speaking, but not, with the exception of the Officers, of voting at its Meetings.

#### TRUSTEE.

14.—The Lord Bishop of the Diocese shall be the Trustee of this Society, and shall have power to let or to take houses or lands, and to receive all rents and interest of monies as the same shall fall due, and shall pay the same to the Treasurer for the time being, taking his receipt, and handing it over to the Committee.

#### GENERAL MEETINGS.

- 15.—An Annual General Meeting of the members and triends of the Society shall be holden in St. John's on the second Thursday after Trinity Sunday, or as soon after as the Bishop may appoint. The Secretary shall give notice to each of the Clergymen in St. John's who shall publish it (with the Bishop's consent) in his Church on the previous Sunday.
- 16.—At the annual general meeting a report on the state of the Society, with the Treasurer's accounts duly audited, shall be submitted by the Committee, to be printed, or otherwise, as shall be then and there determined by the members.
- 17.—A special general meeting may be convened at any time, (1) by the President; (2) by a Vice-President and six members of the Committee; or (3) by any twelve members of the Society whose payments are not in arrear; provided notice of such meeting be duly given as in the case of annual general meetings.
- 18.—The Chairman shall not vote at any general meeting, except in the case of an equality of votes.

#### COLLECTIONS.

19.—It is expected that a Collection for the various objects of the Society will be made every year by every Clergyman in the Diocese, from every head of a family and every adult member of the Church in his Mission, assisted if need be by his Church-wardens and other respectable Members of his congregation.

20.—Every Clergyman shall transmit to the Secretary a list of the Contributors to the objects of the Society in his Mission, with the amount of their several payments, and to the Treasurer one-fourth at least of his whole collections on or before the last day in

every year, or as soon after as practicable.

N.B.—This Rule does not apply to the Clergy of St. John's, who shall send in the whole of their Col-

lections to the Treasurer.

17

21.—All Clergymen who have collected as far as possible from every head of a family, and from every adult Member of the Church in their Missions, towards the objects of the Society, for the two years immediately preceding, and who have remitted to the Treasurer one-fourth of the whole Collections, shall be entitled to assistance from the funds of the Society towards any of its objects in their own Mission; provided that no Clergyman shall make a collection for his own maintenance separate from, or independent of the general collections; and that pew-rents and assessments be not considered as part of the said collection or collections.

#### GRANTS.

22.—It shall be the duty of the Committee to determine from time to time on the appropriation of the Funds, by making grants towards the objects of the Society under the recommendation and sanction of the President.

23.—No Olergyman declining or neglecting to collect for the Society, or to transmit a list of the con-

tributors, and their payments, and a fourth-part of his collection (as directed in Rule 20) shall be entitled to receive any grants from the Society, for himself, or for any of the objects of the Society, in his Mission; provided that where a Collection has been duly made, and the list with the fourth-part of the collections transmitted for the two previous years by his predecessor, any Clergyman newly in charge may, before sending his annual collections, ask and receive for any of the objects of the Society, excepting only his own maintenance.

24.—It shall be competent to the Committee to make grants in the usual manner to any Mission, in connection with the Society, which supports its own Clergyman; and any such Mission shall be held to be in connection with the Society whose Clergyman subscribes ten shillings, and makes a collection in his Mission, annually towards the general funds of the Society.

25.—If a Clergyman leave his Mission before the time for sending in his annual collection, the Committee shall have power, on the recommendation of the President, to grant him a sum which shall appear equitable.

#### DUTIES OF OFFICERS.

26.—In the absence of the President, the Archdeacon, or, in his absence, the Senior Vice-President shall take the Chair at all meetings of the Committee or Members, and shall have a casting vote.

27.—The Treasurer shall receive all monies forwarded to him for the objects of the Society, and shall pay or disburse the same as determined by the Committee, and shall furnish to the President and Committee a statement of accounts up to the day appointed for auditing the same.

28. No money shall be paid or disbursed by the Treasurer except on a written order specifying the

amount to be paid, and its object; which order must be signed by the Chairman of the Committee at which the grant was made, or in his absence, by the Senior Officer of the Society in St. John's.

29.—The Committee shall meet for the despatch of business in St. John's, on the first Thursday after every quarter day, at 2 o'clock, P.M.

30.—A special meeting of the Committee may be convened at any time, either (1) by the President, or (2) by two Vice-Presidents, or (3) by any five Members of the Committee; provided due notice of such meeting with its objects be given the day before to all the other Members of the Committee in St. John's.

31.—At a special meeting to be holden seven days before the annual meeting, the Committee shall appoint two of their number to examine the Treasurer's Accounts up to that season, which accounts examined, approved, and signed by the Auditors as correct, shall be submitted to the Committee to be by them incorporated in or appended to the next yearly Report and so presented to the members at the next annual general meeting.

32.—The Committee shall fix the salary of the Secvetary, and shall provide for all the contingent expenses of the Committee and the Society.

#### DUTIES OF THE SECRETARY.

33.—The Secretary shall summon and attend all meetings of the Committee and Members, and shall arrange the business, and record minutes of the same to be signed by the Chairman. He shall prepare the Annual Report, and superintend the printing of the same; shall sconduct the correspondence with the Clergy and others on behalf of the Committee; and shall be responsible for the safe custody of all books, receipts and papers belonging to the Society.

#### PRAYERS.

34.—All meetings of the Society, or of the Committee, shall be opened and closed with the prayers used at the meetings of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, or others provided for the purpose by the Bishop of the Diocese.

#### ALTERATION OF RULES.

35.—These Rules may be altered, repealed or added to by the Members assembled at any general meeting; provided the proposed alteration has been stated in writing by any person intending to propose it to the Secretary at least a month before for the information of the President and Committee, and that assent has been given to it by the President and a majority of the whole Committee convened for its consideration; and provided also, that it shall be competent to the President to propose any alteration to a general meeting, notwithstanding such alteration may not have received the assent of the Committee.

#### NEW DEANERIES.

36.—New Deaneries created by the Lord Bishop of the Diocese shall be allowed to elect Representatives; provided that in every Deanery there shall be at least two resident Clergymen, and ten Churches and Congregations.

#### SECURITIES.

37.—At each annual meeting there shall be appointed three members of this Society who shall be requested to examine all securities belonging to the general funds of this Society, or belonging, or appertaining to the Clergy Widows' and Orphans' Fund, or to any other fund over which the Society has, or shall have, control, and to report in writing to the President, or, in his absence, to the Senior Vice-President in St. John's, their opinion upon the sufficiency or insufficiency of the same, and if necessary a special

meeting of the Committee shall be convened to consider such report, and to take such action upon it as shall be deemed requisite.

38.—All Title Deeds, Mortgages and other Securities belonging to the Society, or over which it has control, shall be deposited and preserved in a suitable muniment box to be provided by the President for the time being, at the expense of the Society, and to be always kept in his charge for the use of the Society.

Note.—While it is expected that every Clergyman in the Colony will make a yearly collection for the promotion of the objects of the Church Society, and impress upon every individual under his Pastoral charge, the obligations by which he is bound to contribute thereto, year by year,—the system of the Church Society does not require any Clergymaa to withhold the ordinances of the Church in any case of refusal or neglect to pay towards his support.

### PROCEEDINGS

At the Twenty-seventh Anniversary of the Newfoundland Church Society holden at St. John's in the Cathedral Sunday School Building on Monday, July 13, 1868. The chair was taken at half-past seven o'clock, P. M., by His Excellency the Governor, supported and assisted by the Right Reverend the Lord Bishop, President, who requested the Rev. G. M. Johnson to open the meeting with the usual prayers.

After prayer, the business of the evening commenced with the reading of the Report and of the Treasurer's Accounts, after which the following Resolutions were proposed, seconded, and carried unanimously:

1st-Moved by the Rev. T. M. Wood, seconded by Hop. Dr. Winter;—

That the Report now read, be adopted and printed, with the Treasurer's Accounts.

2nd-Moved by Rev. R. Caswell, seconded by Hon. Attorney General;

That this Meeting desires to acknowledge with humble thankfulness, the great goodness of ALMIGHTY GOD in prospering the efforts made in furtherance of the designs of this Society during the past year.

3rd—Moved by Hon. Judge Robinson, seconded by W. H. Mare, Esq., and supported by the Rev. G. Hutchinson;—

That this Meeting records its sense of the great advantage likely to accrue to the Church in this Colony from the appointment of a Co-adjutor Bishop; and, while recognising with feelings of especial gratification and thankfulness, the Consecration of the Ven.


Archdedon Kelly to that important office, desires to mark its appreciation of the self-denying sacrifice made by the Lord Bishop of the Diocese to obtain this great benefit.

4th-Moved by J. Bowring, Esq., seconded by A. W. Harvey, Esq.;-

That the thanks of this Meeting be given to the Officers and Committee for their management of the business of this Society since the last annual meeting, and that W. H. MARE, Esq., be Treasurer, and the Rev. G. M. JOHNSON, Sceretary for the ensuing year; also, that the Hon. Judge Hobinson, W. H. MARE, Esq., and H. K. Dickinson, Esq., be appointed as Members of this Sciety, to examine the Securities belonging to all funds under its control, and to perform the other duties indicated by the 37th Standing Rule.

5th-Moved by J. Tunbridge, Esq., seconded by Rev. E. Botwood;

That the best thanks of this meeting be respectfully tendered to His Excellency the Governor, for his kindness in presiding over the business of the evening.



### REPORT FOR 1867-8.

In approaching the duty of making a report to the Members of the Church Society assembled on the present occasion, your Committee rejoice at being enabled to announce that in the course of a year of many difficulties the Newfoundland Church Society has not only maintained its position as to the amount of funds actually raised, but that it has also been strengthened by the return of three Missions to co-operation, and the addition of two new Missions.

It is true that among the Missions referred to are those of White Bay and Bay of Islands, and that from these places the amount forwarded must be expected for many years to be very small, while probably, on the other hand, assistance may be asked towards erecting such buildings in those places, as from time to time may be needed for various purposes in connection with the establishment and settlement of the Church. But here we ought surely to remember whose words they are which tell us "It is more blessed to give than to receive," and with this feeling your Committee mention it as matter for congratulation that thus new fields are from time to time opened for doing good through the instrumentality of this Society, founded as it has been, for the purpose of enabling those who are richer in this worlds wealth, and have been longer in possession and enjoyment of the various means of grace, to show their sense of God's merciful goodness by assisting to extend the same great blessings to others, as He shall give them opportunity.

The number of Clergy who have sent forward returns in the last year has been 29. During the previous year 24 only were in connection with the Church Society. The Missions which have this year returned to co-operation, are Topsail, Belleoram, and Exploits Burnt Island, formerly known as the Moreton's Harbor Mission. All the Missions mentioned in the last report as belonging to the Church Society continue to do so this year, and it is hoped others will be added before another Annual Meeting. It is evident, therefore, that the Church Society is advancing towards the so much to be desired end of drawing all the Missions and Clergy of the Dioceso into co-operation. It may be long before all are thus brought together in unity, but your Committee do not cease to desire the fulfilment of this object, or to work towards its accomplishment.

The income of the Church Society since the General Meeting last year, has been £909 11s. 1d., and the expenditure under various votes of the Committee has been £796 17s. 5d. The amount received appears therefore, to have been £30 8s. 9d. more, and the expenditure £187 18s. 0d. less than that of the previous year. The balance to the credit of the Church Society in the Treasurer's hands has consequently increased from £235 3s. 7d. as shewn last year to the sum of £347 17s. 3d. now accounted for. The following sums have been collected by the Clergy in St. John's, and in the various Out-harbours during the years 1866 and 1867:—

It will thus be seen that the St. John's Clergy have all increased their collections. The Out-harbours on the

whole, have also increased the amounts returned by them. The increase on these last collections is, it is true, but small as belonging to the Church Society, but it must always be remembered that as the returns made by the Out-harbor Clergy are but one-fourth of their collections, the apparent gain is but one-fourth also of that secured

upon the whole.

The Cathedral Clergy report with much satisfaction that while subscriptions to the amount of £50 have been unavoidably lost in large sums from their list, they have yet by the aid of the crews of the sealing steamers, been able to make up the amount raised by them to rather more than the sum returned last year. Out of the 167 subscribers whose names are printed in the last report there are 25 who have this year not paid their contributions to the Cathedral Clergy. Notwithstanding this, the Cathedral list this year contains 195 names, exclusive of the sealers lists, shewing that while 25 former subscribers have been this year lost, 53 additional subscribers have been enrolled. This circumstance will, it is believed, convince that no proper efforts have been spared to secure the contributions of the members of that congre-The exertions of the Rev. Mr. Wood, whose zeal and energy in support of this Society have been long tried, and are well proved and known, have also been very successful as the statement of amounts just read very satisfactorily shews. The collection made by the Rev. Mr. Botwood also exceeds that returned from his congregation last year.

The report has already spoken of the union of new Missions with this Society, and referred to new responsibilities in connection with this fact. Reference to the collections of the St. John's and Out-harbour Clergy, amounting in all, with the Cathedral Offertory collections to £909 11s. 1d., leads your Committee to observe that there are yearly standing votes for the four St. John's Clergy, dependent it is true on their first separately raising the sums thus set apart for them, and to the Mission-

ary Clergy at Pinchard's Island and Salvage, amounting Besides these, there are also other amounts which may be considered standing votes amounting to fully £100. The sum thus already appropriated without any special action of the Committee may be estimated at the large sum of £670. The sum remaining does not consequently much exceed £200 currency. In other words it is hence apparent that after the payment of sums due to the St. John's Clergy and the Clergy at Pinchard's with certain other regularly Island and Salvage, recurring votes, the balance represents the amount of the fourth of their collections remitted by the Clergy of the various Out harbors. Should therefore the St. John's collections be permitted to fall off, or those from the Out-harbors come short of their present amount, it is evident that either some portion of the Society's Missionary votes must be withdrawn, or the usual appropriations to the erection of Churches, Parsonages, and such other objects in the Out-harbors be curtailed. Committee are far, from anticipating such a necessity, rather do they confidently hope increase in the number of members and the amount of funds whenever it shall please GoD to restore its former prosperity to this ancient colony, but they have thought it not otherwise than useful, both to Clergy and Laity, to shew how much depends on their combined exertionsthose of the Clergy in shewing the Laity their duty and securing their response to the claims of this Society, and those of the Laity in answering the calls of the Clergy for their own and their brethrens benefit.

#### CLERGY WIDOWS AND ORPHANS FUND.

There are at present two Widows receiving pensions from this fund—Mrs. Moreton, whose husband died during the first year of its existence, who has ever since had the advantage of an allowance of £40 per annum, and Mrs. Meek, to whom was voted a pension of the same amount at the first Meeting of the Committee after her husband's death last year.

#### BOOK DEPOSITORY.

This useful establishment is conducted as heretofore, under the direction of the Depôt Sub-committee, at Mr. Burton's, 221 Water Street, a very central and convenient situation, easily accessible to all members of the Church coming from the various Out-harbors at the different seasons. The sales of various Books—Bibles. Prayer Books, Hymn Books, and other Books-have amounted during the past year to £338 Os. 5d., nearly £13 more than in the previous year. Though the increase is not large, it is yet satisfactory to note that it is an Members of our Church are assured that at increase. no other place in St. John's can they get books of the same character so cheaply as at this Depository. A large stock of School Books and Maps of all kinds is also always kept.

#### THEOLOGICAL COLLEGE.

At the last Annual Meeting, it will be remembered, that the Bishop gave an interesting account of his then recent visit to England, and of the success which had attended his efforts to procure money for the endowment of this College. It was stated in the Report that his

Lordship's endeavours had secured near £2000 stg. in England in addition to almost £1500 cy. contributed in this Colony. At a meeting of the contributors to this fund held in St. John's, last year, the Bishop communicated the willingness of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel to receive and hold the money raised, as Trustees for the College, and to pay interest thereon. This offer was immediately agreed to, and the balance then lying in the Commercial Bank was accordingly remitted to the Treasurer's of the S. P. G. In the last Annual Report of that Society, there appears to the credit of the College a sum of £3446 stg., and the Bishop has informed the Committee that he has been enabled to add nearly £400 stg. to this amount.

The Committee have peculiar satisfaction in stating that a sum exceeding £100 stg. has been already subscribed in Bermuda. The subscriptions paid in this Colony have increased from something less than £1500 cy. mentioned in the last Report, to nearly £1900 cy. at the present time.

The Consecration of Archdeacon Kelly as Coadjutor Bishop of the Diocese, took place at the hands of His Grace the Archbishop of Canterbury, in August last. His Lordship returned to this Diocese in December, having remained in England to attend the conference of Bishops, held at Lambeth in September. Your Committee congratulate Bishop KELLY on his advancement to the highest order in the sacred Ministry, and much more, the Church at large throughout the Diocese on the advantage which has thus been secured through the sacrifice of income, which has been made by the Bishop of the Diocese to procure this benefit. This is no doubt, tho most important event your Committee have had to place on record since the consecration of the Cathedral Church, and will more and more be realized as such, as time enables the advantage of the presence and continual ministration of two Bishops in the Diocese to be known and felt. Already has this benefit been perceived in St. John's itself, where the help of the Coadjutor Bishop has been enjoyed throughout the winter, and now that the Bishop of the Diocese has again been permitted to return to his Cathedral, the Coadjutor has gone forth in turn to visit some of the remote Missions on the West Coast and Labrador, which else would probably have remained unvisited by their Bishop for the usual four years interval. One other benefit your Committee mention as resulting from an Ordination held by the Coadjutor Bishop on Trinity Sunday, which could not else have taken place, at which the Rev. Messrs. PILOT and WILSON were advanced to the Priesthood.

Special mention having been made of the Missions of White Bay and Bay of Islands in the earlier part of this Report, your Committee here introduce extracts from letters from their Missionaries, which the Bishop has kindly furnished for the information of the Society through this Report.

The Rev. Mr. TEMPLE writes to the Bishop of the Diocese, April 7, 1868:—

"We are just hoping for the conclusion of a winter which has been the most severe I ever spent; constant cold, without intermission; and, until now, the most dismal prospects before us day by day.— After the last wretched summer fishery we were dreading the winter, and yet hoping for better things, but all the winter there was literally nothing to be caught: the poor people were reduced, except one or two families to a very low ebb, some getting a trifle of credit, others none; some eating their seed potatoes, and all of us living very hardly. Most of my collections were behindhand, from the mere fact that there was nothing. But we may thank the GoD who hears and answers prayer, that He sent us help at last. On the 27th March young seals were hauled and continued to be hauled until April 2nd. Not in any great plenty in our parts, yet enough to give great help to all. Some crews hauled a hundred, some less according to their industry, or the time they heard the news, or their power of enduring the ice; for most soon became blind. I have now better hopes of collecting some of the dues which are behindhand than I had before and I do hope that the twelvemonths end will not shew a great reduction in my income on the whole. However such uncertainty makes great inconvenience for the time, as well as causing anxiety.

"I am now busy building a decent and convenient Parsonage, and by the time this letter arrives in St. John's it will be covered in. The 7:

whole frame was cut and put up this winter, and all the board necessary sawn in the Bay, so there only remain shingles and fittings to be obtained from town. I earnestly hope to occupy it next winter. I felt it necessary for many reasons to have a home: first, that people never seemed to be satisfied that I intended to remain in White Bay; secondly, that my books and other properties were sadly "knocked about" by having no resting place; and lastly that I needed some periodical "spell" myself when I could feel that one journey was over, before beginning another. I really used to weary of the unceasing round of ten months, before Christmas came. So after much consideration I fixed upon Western Cove, as the most convenient place in the bay for a settled Mission Station; and here I hope to form what I shall call "St. Peter's Mission Station," Western Head, White Bay.

This station will I hope in course of time have its Church, Schoolhouse, and Parsonage; as also its Glebe land, cruising boat and fishing craft, which I am trying to work together little by little, but this takes time. At present I live, in the short space of time when I am home, in a half finished frame house in the Cove, which is lent me till my own is built, and serves as dwelling House, School and Church all in one, yet is more comfortable than my ancient tilt at Hauling Point. 1 am turning carpenter myself, and have done the chief part of the rough work of building the Parsonage, as far as it has gone, with my own hands, assisted by the Cove people now and then, and I do not expect to be at any great expense for workmen throughout.

"I trust my work is prospering spiritually as well as ontwardly; but of this it is difficult to speak. Perhaps as one proceeds oneself, one expects more from others, and so becomes disappointed; yet I think, could your Lordship see us, and hear us, both in conducting our daily and Sunday services, with the help of my new Harmonium, or see the affection expressed, and (I believe) felt on all sides for me, and last and chietest, could know as I do the pure faith and childlike religion that have grown up in some few little ones you would rejoice with me and for me that I was so honoured in having this corner of the Field committed to my sowing, and pray for me that I may neither be lifted up too much by premature success, nor cast down too much by light afflictions, which endure but a moment. Yet as it is I beg your Lordships prayers and blessing. I am weak and forgetful, but my heart yearns to do some good, if it be but to gather one or two into the Eternal Kingdom, safe from sin, through Christ.

To the Coadjutor Bishop the Rev. Mr. Rule writes as follows, February 14, 1868:—

An opportunity offering of sending letters to Channel, I cannot but write to tell you how we are doing here.

The Church is just covered in. The covering is dressed on the under side, and the roof is open, so there will be no coiling above the wallplate. There is of course a good deal to be done yet, but we have got on very well considering the difficulties we have laboured under. Trouble in getting the material and a very rough and coldifall and winter with a great deal of snow.

It looks very well indeed. And what is better I think it will be filled when we use it. Our congregations this winter are nearly double what they were last winter. Indeed the last few Sundays our log-house has been packed. Thave had to get new benches and make the vestry smaller. This winter we have a Sanday School of about a dezen scholars. I myself keep School in Birchy Cove on every afternoon in alternate weeks. I have 11 beys and 3 girls. The attendance is good. I give religious instruction and teach them to read, write, eigher and sing.

I intended to go to Bonne Dey again this winter, but have given it up—first, because I was not equal to the journey, which is very severe; accordly because there is so much to be done here. Winter is my harvest time, when people can waik on the Bay; but if I were to go away now I should not have above four or five Sundays more in the Bay of Islands before the ice will be unsefe to waik on. But I intenders soon as ever I have seen the Clurch accured from danger of fire in the apring to go and stay in Bonne Bay perhaps for six weeks. At the last celebration of the Holy Communion in Birchy Cove there were 13 Lay Communicants—our largest number yet.—Three of them received for the first time. One of the three, my bost at Meadows, had buried a little child two days before—the first death that has come home to me.

The winter has been and still is very severe. We are all well.—There is great searcity of flour in the hay. Several families are out aheady, and there are three months before any vessel can get in. I have enough but I expect every one will be out by the spring.—Those who have ever so little to spare will have to let it go to others.

Such are the different subjects of information and of interest which your Committee have on the present occasion the satisfaction of communicating to the meeting and through the meeting to the members of the Church at large, subjects which are felt by them to be matter of hearty congratulation, whether as regards the financial position of the Church, or its vitality and progress as demonstrated by the labors of the Bishop and Clorgy, and the support of the Laity. It is true that this Society deals with the material rather than the spiritual tokens of life and energy, but your Committee hope and believe that what has been said of the efforts of the Bishop and Clergy, and of the responsive action of the Laity show that the true principle of inner life exists, and is bearing fruit in all portions of this Diocese. Your Committee thankfully recognize the present period as an epoch of great activity and zeal in the Church, and believe this to be a just subject for mutual thankfulness among all her members. That mischief should be also busily at work amid all the good that is being attempted and done, and that where there is overflowing zeal, prudence and discretion should sometimes be forgotten is only what is to be expected. Your Committee trust that the Church in Newfoundland is doing her work faithfully and well, if quietly and without excitement, and take comfort from this thought, recollecting the assurance given that in quietness and confidence shall be our strength. Peace and quietness are among God's best gitts, and have been long enjoyed among us, and it is hoped may long continue to be enjoyed. For every blessing temporal and spiritual which has been bestowed upon our Church, especially that portion of it existing in this land, let the goodness of Almighty God be acknowledged, particularly would your Committee recognize His good and gracious Providence as having prospered their labors in years past, and pray for the continuance of His blessing in all years to come.

#### STANDING RULES

#### OF THE

# Clergy Widows' and Orphans' Fund.

- 1.—THE NEWFOUNDLAND CHURCH SOCIETY'S Special Fund, for assisting the Widows and Orphans of deceased Clergymen of the Diocese of Newfoundland, shall consist of all monies paid to the Treasurer of the Society for that object.
- 2.—The Committee of the Church Society shall have the management of the Fund.
- 3.—Every Hundred Pounds of available surplus shall be invested by the Committee as opportunities occur. Smaller sums shall be deposited every quarter in the Savings' Bank.
- 4.—All Clergymen in the Diocese holding the Bishop's license may secure the benefit of this Fund by contributing within six months from the time of obtaining their License from the Bishop as follows:—
  (1) Unmarried Clergymen and Widowers without a child, one pound (£1) per annum: (2) Married Clergymen (and such as shall afterwards become married,) and Widowers with a child, two pounds (£2) per annum.
- 5.—Annual subscriptions shall be payable in advance on the 1st day of January in each year:—provided that Clergymen on entry shall for that year pay only a rateable proportion of the annual subscription up to first day of January following. Thirty days grace

shall be allowed, but every Clergyman, neglecting to make payment within that time, shall forfeit his claim upon the Fund, to be recovered only upon payment of arrears, with ten per cent. thereon, before the following first day of January.

6.—Any Clergyman neglecting to subscribe according to Rule 4, or to pay his annual subscription within the time limited by Rule 5, may, if the Committee see fit to admit or re-admit him, secure the benefit of the Fund by the payment of two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) if married or a widower with a child; and one pound ten shillings (£1 10a.) if unmarried or a widower without a child, from the day on which the last annual subscription he paid was due, or from the date of his being licensed by the Bishop, and from the date of such admission, or re-admission, he shall come under the operation of Rule 4.

7.—Every Clergyman securing the benefit of this Fund will be required to make a yearly collection for the same in his Mission, and to forward the amount with his own annual subscription to the Treasurer.

8.—The Widow of every Clergyman who shall have paid his annual subscription, and forwarded an annual collection, till his death, or till incapacitated by mental or bodily infirmity, shall be entitled to receive a yearly Pension of thirty pounds (£30) currency, during widowhood.

9.—If the Fund should at any time spermit, the Committee may increase the amount of Rension to any sum not exceeding £50; such an addition; however, being subject to be withdrawn wholly or in part, should the state of the Fund not warrant its continuance.

- 10.—If the Widow die or marry again, the Pension shall be paid to Trustees for the benefit of such Children of the deceased husband, as may be, if boys, under sixteen, if girls, under eighteen years of age.
- 11.—The Trustees named by a deceased Clergyman, in the event of the death or marriage of his Widow, shall be recognized by the Committee in paying the Pension for the benefit of the child or children; but if the Trustees so named are unwilling or unable to act, the Bishop of the Diocese shall act as Trustee in the application of the Pension.
- 12.—If the wife die before her husband, his child or children shall receive the Pension, so long as there is a claimant under Rule ten.
- 13.—The Pensions shall be paid half-yearly by the Bishop's order on the Treasurer on the first of January and first of July. The first payment to be calculated for the interval from the husband's death to the day of payment.
- 14.—If a Clergyman, having joined the Fund after the 24th June, 1863, removes from the Diocese after having served less than fourteen years, his connection with the fund shall cease, and he shall be entitled to receive back half the amount of the annual subscription he has paid. If he removes after having served fourteen years and less than twenty-one years, he shall be allowed to remain in connection with the fund by paying an annual subscription of six pounds, or nine pounds if residing within the tropics; or he may receive back half his annual subscriptions, upon which his connection with the fund shall cease. If he romoves after having served twenty-one years, he shall be allowed to remain in connection with the fund by paying an annual subscription of five pounds, or seven pounds ten shillings if residing within the tropics; or

he may receive back three-fourths of his annual subscriptions, upon which his connection with the Fund shall cease. All Clergymen in connection with the Fund previous to the 24th June, 1863, to be governed by the original Rule 14th thereof.

- 15.—A yearly statement of the Treasurer's accounts with this Fund shall be published with the Society's Report.
- 16.—None of the above Rules shall be altered, or repealed, except at a general meeting of the Church Society, and after a full years' notice to the members of the proposed change.
- "The following is the original Rule 14, governing Clergymen in connection with the Fund before June 24, 1863.
- 14.—If a Clergyman removes, with the Bishop's consent, from the Diocese, after officiating in it not less than seven years, he shall be allowed his claim upon the Fund, on the payment of an annual subscription of three pounds (£3); or, if he desires it, may receive back half the amount he has paid; which re-payment shall release the Fund from all his claims upon it."




